

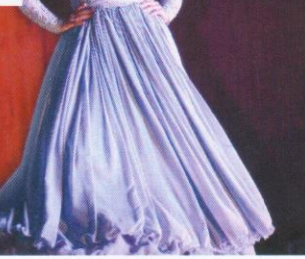
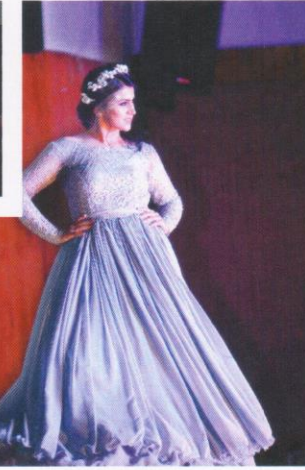

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Profile of the College

Government Home Science College is a pioneer and professional institute of Home Science in the country. Since its inception in 1961, it has grown into an excellent educational centre, satisfying the professional and specialized needs of the contemporary woman. The then dynamic Chief Minister of undivided Punjab, Late Sardar Partap Singh Kairon, was instrumental in establishing this prestigious institute which has undergone a long successful journey of expansion in the field of Home Science. Starting with a three year degree course in B.Sc. Home Science, it expanded its horizons in the true sense by offering a revamped undergraduate programme by moving it towards specialization to make it more skill and career oriented. The need based changes have been introduced in five undergraduate specializations namely Apparel and Textile Design; Dietetics; Human Development and Family Relations; Interior Design and Resource Management and B.Sc. Home Science Composite. The college also offers an undergraduate degree course in Fashion Designing and Masters degree courses in Clothing and Textiles, Foods and Nutrition and Human Development and Family Relations. The need based Postgraduate Diplomas in Fashion Designing, Nutrition and Dietetics and Child Guidance and Family Counselling are also other options after graduation. Ph.D. in Home Science is also offered with course work.

Home Science is a unique field of knowledge. Its inter disciplinary approach in synthesizing knowledge drawn from physical and biological sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities has enriched its educational programmes. It caters to the present day needs of education in order to meet the rapidly changing demands of family life and the multiple roles that woman has to play in home as well as professional life. The different areas of specialization also concentrate on providing suitable training to the students for various job opportunities. The trained graduates and postgraduates are absorbed in hospitals, industrial units, hotel industries, and health fitness clubs. They can also work as teachers, counselors, sales managers, apparel & interior designers, consultants and field workers in extension education and community development programmes. Thus, Home Science empowers woman at personal, professional, social, entrepreneurial and economic fronts.

The College runs a laboratory Nursery School, Chaitanya, with 50 students on rolls, under the department of Human Development and Family Relations, to impart practical training

to its students. The other major departments of Home Science are also having well equipped state of art laboratories.

The academic year 2017-2018 began with the accomplishment of the college becoming eligible for getting the **first installment of infrastructure grant of Rs.1.5 crore** from total grant of Rs.2 crores from **RUSA (Rashtriya Uchchar Shiksha Abhiyan)** under **MHRD, Govt. of India**. RUSA aims in transforming quality and branding in higher education. The grant has been spent on giving a facelift to the corridors and administrative block by getting fixed vitrified tactile flooring and making it disabled friendly. The college library interiors has been aesthetically enhanced with vibrant , colorful, sound absorbing PVC flooring and glass doors. It has resulted in better conducive environment for studying. The grant has also been utilized in procuring digital podiums, interactive LED screens, visulizers, printers, projectors and latest computers for E- Pathshala, Research Multimedia block Committee Room & Conference Room. Many more upgradation, construction and purchase proposals are in the pipeline out of RUSA grant.

The college has a fully air-conditioned and user-friendly library which caters to the academic and educational needs of the students and the staff.

Over the years, the college has built up great credibility and gained recognition as a premier institute for education, research and extension work. The beautiful spacious college and hostel buildings offer a peaceful, serene yet stimulating environment to the students. The campus is endowed with well manicured lawns, spacious lecture theatres , Smart class rooms and laboratories which are a delight to work in. The college has rich indoor and outdoor sports and fitness facilities which cater to students of all aptitudes and abilities. Clothing and Textiles

In order to cater to the needs of the textile and apparel industry, the department has started a specialized and focused course in Apparel and Textile Designing. The department also offers a specialized undergraduate course in B.Sc. Fashion Designing which receives an overwhelming response. The postgraduate courses being offered by the department include M.Sc. in Clothing and Textiles and PG Diploma in Fashion Designing. These courses give an in-depth knowledge of textile science, fundamentals of apparel design, construction techniques and fashion merchandising, which enable the students to take up the jobs in the related fields. Besides being equipped with starting their independent enterprise at the end of the course, the students will also find excellent carrier opportunities as academicians in the field of textile and apparel designing, fashion designing, garment manufacturing retailing and merchandising in various schools, colleges and fashion designing institutes. They are placed as merchandiser in fashion stores and export houses. Many alumni have been successfully running their own boutiques and fashion studios.

The department has the Panache Club which undertakes various activities like Tex-Style week - interclass competitions, Aakriti-the annual fashion show, seminars, workshops, talks and educational trips. There are well equipped labs for Garment construction, Fabric construction, Dyeing and Printing and Textile Testing. To keep up with the latest technology in the field of Clothing and Textiles, the department has a computer lab equipped with latest softwares like Tuka-Cad, Tuka-Studio and Richpiece for apparel and textile designing. The department also undertakes community outreach activities to teach various textile designing techniques to rural women for capacity building.

Foods and Nutrition

Foods and Nutrition Department offers a two years Masters degree in Foods and Nutrition and Post Graduate Diploma in Nutrition and Dietetics. Both these courses offer excellent placement opportunities and cater to the demand for specialized expertise at National and International levels in various institutions and organizations like hospitals, health clinics, schools, vocational programmes, projects and non-government organizations.

Placement opportunities also exist for our students in various projects run by AIIMS,PGIMER,NIPPCD,WHO,UNICEF and,ICMR.The students are also absorbed as teaching faculty and nutrition counselors in various schools,colleges and other educational institutes. Many students in the previous years have been appointed in various on-going national programmes like ICDS,Mid-Day Meal programme and School Health Programme.Students have further placement avenues in non govt. organizations and organisations of Higher Education.

In the light of the changing time trends, vocationalization and increased awareness about health and disease, the department lays emphasis on specialized undergraduate courses in Dietetics to equip the students with the latest skill set. The department also encompasses the societal needs by running a diet clinic wherein dietary counselling is carried out for different age groups and diseases.The curriculum is innovative and has a strong practical base to keep pace with the dynamics and changing educational and professional needs in the field of nutrition and health care. The students gets hands on experience in running of a cafeteria/small scale food service outlet, to hone their Entrepreneurial Skills.

This equips the students to translate theory into practice and develop their skills for placement opportunities in various hospitals and health care facilities. They are trained to be absorbed as nutrition and health experts in various health clubs, schools, NGOs. Cookery competitions, seminars, workshops and lectures are organized by the Ginger Club of the department round the year which entails active participation by the students and society at large. The club boasts of more than 100 members. To ensure effective facilitation of the curriculum and extension activities, the department has 4 well equipped laboratories besides smart class rooms for teaching theory through the ICT technique.

Family Resource Management

FRM is one of the integral field of Home Science. It is a dream of one and all to have a functional, aesthetically furnished, economical and technically strong house. This dream can come true by doing specialization in 3rd Year of B.Sc. Home Science in Interior Design and Resource Management. Management of a home involves use and creation of resources to achieve individual and family goals. The syllabi emphasises adopting sustainability, conservation and efficient use of resources in families and homes.

The profession of Interior Design has gained enormous popularity with increasing awareness in improving the functionality and aesthetics of interiors. The students study courses related to Interior Design and Resource Management, Housing, Interior Furnishing, Design and Display Analysis, Sustainable Buildings, Furniture Designing, Building Materials and Construction Techniques, Work Place Design, Auto CAD, Ergonomics and Household Equipments and Consumer Education. Students gain practical experience by preparing drawings of residential and commercial sectors both with free hand and on AutoCAD, thereby helping the students in developing professional skills.

This course has numerous job opportunities in private (Corporate and Commercial) and public sector. It prepares the students to start their own enterprise or design studio in addition to working as free lancers or co- workers with architects, contractors, interior decorators and real estate companies. Teaching in schools, colleges, polytechnic institutes can be another attraction after completing this course. Hence it is not only a creative, innovative and interesting field to study but has enormous job opportunities as well.

The department is well equipped with fully furnished laboratories: Family Resource Management Lab, Furnishing Lab, Design Studio, and AutoCAD Lab along with smart class rooms. The department has "Creatrix" club which holds various activities, competitions, workshops, exhibitions, group discussions, seminars, extension lectures, educational visits and theme decorations etc. throughout the session to upgrade the knowledge of the students and to make teaching- learning more effective and stimulating.

Human Development and Family Relations

Human development and family relations prepares students for careers in public and private human service agencies. It lays emphasis on learning to help individuals and family to understand needs, different developments, challenges, issues of concern and possible remedior steps for different stages of related to human development and family realtions. Given the changing trends and the ever increasing requirement of experts in the field of Human Development and Family Relations, the department has introduced new courses that have wide employment opportunities and national and international applicability.

The postgraduate courses offered by the department include M.Sc. in Human Development and Family Relations and P.G. Diploma in Child Guidance and Family Counselling.

These courses provide an in-depth knowledge base and skill training to students to be effectively absorbed in various agencies working with young children, adolescents, women and elderly social welfare, education and human development.

In addition to that, students can take on a central role as counselors, special education experts, academicians, and researchers in the field of child development family studies early childhood care and education. Avenues for students also exist in various projects being run for welfare of women, children, and children with special needs by National and International organizations such as WHO, UNICEF, NIPCCD, ICCW and ICMR. Many students in the past have been working effectively as Child Development Project Officers in Integrated Child Development Services Scheme. Students also find placements in various Non-Government Organizations as counselors in Schools, Hospital setups, and Institutes of higher education.

The Department is sufficiently equipped with smart class rooms, conference room, computers, psychological tests and instruments. A laboratory Nursery School, Chaitanya, with 50 students aging 3-5 years on rolls, provide the students an excellent platform to get firsthand experience

about observing this age group. It also offers opportunities to the students to plan and conduct stimulating activities for the holistic development of young children. It has dedicated and highly qualified staff which is a good amalgamation of young, energetic, enthusiastic, experienced and visionary faculty members.

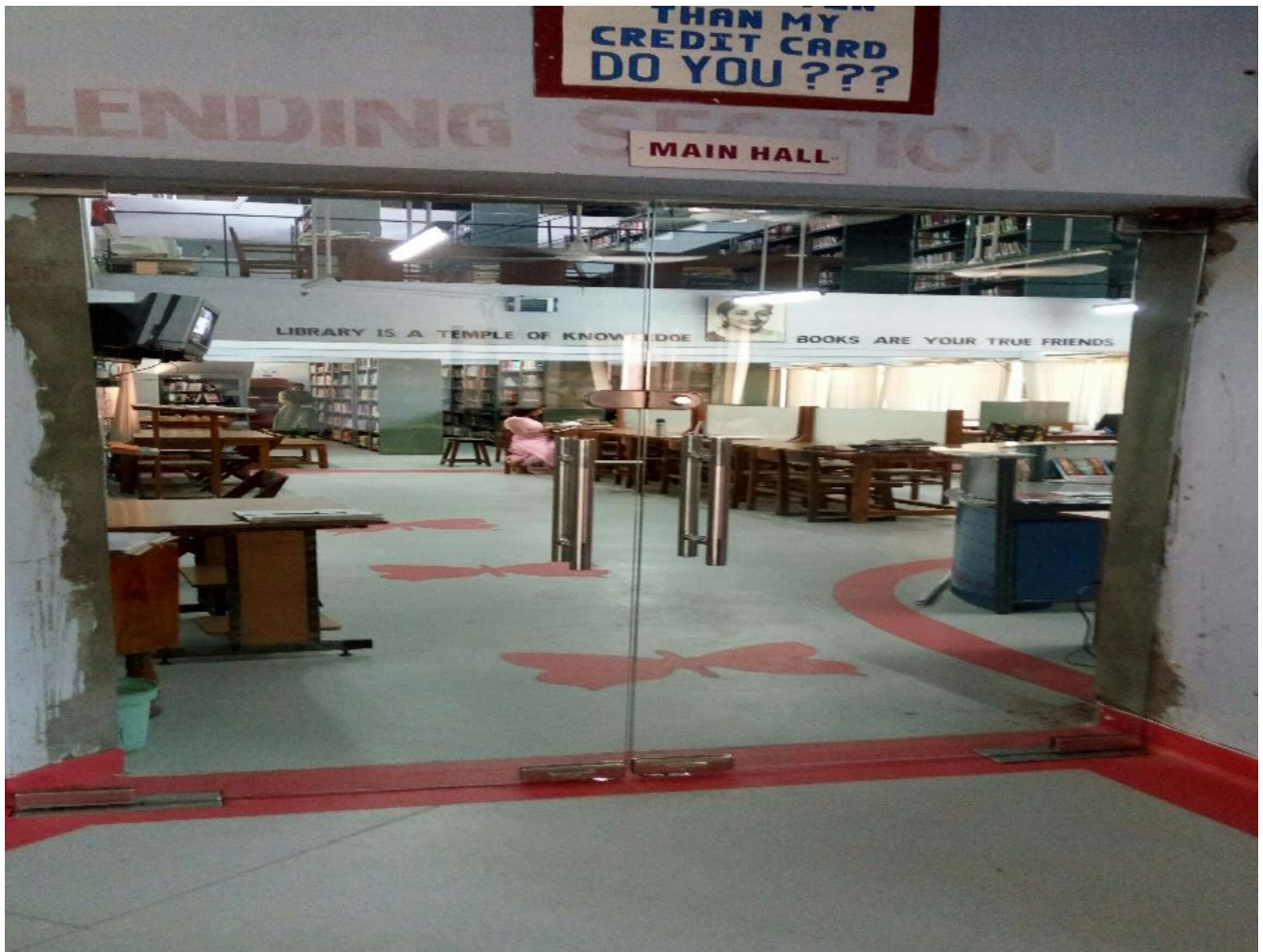

COURSES OFFERED AND TOTAL NUMBER OF SEATS

B.Sc. Home Science is a professional course offering specializations in Apparel and Textile Design (20 seats), Composite (30 seats), Dietetics (30 seats), Human Development and Family Relations (20 seats), Interior Design and Resource Management (20 seats). All candidates will be admitted in B.Sc. (H.Sc.) at the time of admission to Semester I and Semester I to IV will be common to all. Specializations will be allotted during Semester IV and implemented in Semester V on the basis of merit drawn up with the following formula -

50% of aggregate marks of (10+2) + 50% of cumulative aggregate marks of University exam of B.Sc. (H.Sc.) Semester I and Semester II.

Reservation of Seats for B.Sc. (Home Science) / B.Sc. (Fashion Designing) - Semester I

60% seats are reserved for the candidates passing the qualifying examination from U.T., Chandigarh (Chandigarh quota).

40% seats are reserved for candidates passing the qualifying examination from Institutes outside Chandigarh (Outstation quota).

Reservation of Seats for M.Sc. (Home Science) / Post Graduate Diploma Courses - Semester I

60% seats are reserved for the candidates passing the lower qualifying examination from colleges affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh (Chandigarh quota).

40% seats are reserved for the candidates from other universities (Outstation quota).

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- **B.Sc. Home Science - Semester I**

Candidates who have passed the +2 examination of 10+2 system of education from CBSE, Board of School Education Punjab/Haryana/Himachal Pradesh or equivalent thereof, with English as a compulsory subject.

- **B.Sc. Fashion Designing - Semester I (Self Financing Course)**

Admission to Semester I of B.Sc. Fashion Designing shall be open to candidates with atleast 50% marks (45% marks for SC and ST category candidates) in 10+2 examination from CBSE, Board of School Education Punjab/Haryana/Himachal Pradesh or equivalent thereof, with English as a compulsory subject.

- **M.Sc. Home Science (Clothing and Textiles)- Semester I**

B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Science, B.Sc. Home Science/ B.Sc. Fashion Designing/ B.Sc. Fashion and Lifestyle Technology from Panjab University with at least 50% aggregate marks/any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to above mentioned courses of Panjab University.

- **M.Sc. Home Science (Foods and Nutrition) - Semester I**

B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Science, B.Sc. Home Science from Panjab University with at least 50% aggregate marks/any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to B.Sc. Home Science of Panjab University/B. Tech. (Food Technology)/ B.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics/B.Sc. Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics/ B.Sc. (Microbial and Food Technology).

- **M.Sc. Home Science Human Development and Family Relations- Semester I**
B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Science, B.Sc. Home Science from Panjab University with at least 50% aggregate marks/any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to B.Sc. Home Science of Panjab University.
- **P.G. Diploma in Child Guidance and Family Counselling - Semester I**
Any graduation from Panjab University /any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to graduation, with atleast 50% aggregate marks.
- **P.G. Diploma in Fashion Designing - Semester I**
Any graduation from Panjab University /any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to graduation, with atleast 50% aggregate marks.
- **P.G. Diploma in Nutrition and Dietetics - Semester I**
B.Sc. Home Science from Panjab University /any other examination equivalent to B.Sc. Home Science, recognized by Panjab University: B.Sc. Home Science/B.Sc. Biotechnology/ B.A. with Home Science/B.Sc. Microbial and Food Technology/ B.Sc. Food Science/ B.Sc. Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics/B.Sc. Homeopathy/B.Sc. Physiotherapy/ B.Tech. (Food Technology)/B.Sc. Nursing/BAMS/MBBS/Bachelor of Dental Science(BDS)/BA/B.Sc. Sports Nutrition /Allied field, with atleast 50% aggregate marks.
- **Calculation Of Merit For Undergraduate Courses**
B.Sc. Home Science (Semester I) and B.Sc. Fashion Designing (Semester I)
The merit will be calculated on the aggregate marks/percentage of all the subjects, obtained in the qualifying exam (10+2).
- **Calculation Of Merit For Postgraduate Courses**
M.Sc. and PG Diplomas
The merit will be calculated on the aggregate marks/percentage in the qualifying examination.

Foreign Students

All foreign students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from Deputy Registrar (General) Panjab University, Chandigarh. The admission of the foreign students to the College would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students. The eligibility application form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to the College.

3. An eligibility certificate from Panjab University indicating the particular class, to which student can be admitted

The Institution can not be held responsible in case the University does not approve the admission of a student on account of giving incomplete information, concealing necessary facts or attaching incomplete testimonials or delayed submission of certificates etc. The fine/penalty imposed for the same will be the personal responsibility of the student.**
3. Students are advised to keep a hard copy/soft copy of the submitted (filled) Admission Form for future reference.
4. Any instruction or rule received from the Director Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration/Panjab University will be binding on the students.
5. Candidates with gap year will not be admitted to the college until the gap is explained to the satisfaction of the Principal of the college by submitting an affidavit.

Reservation Policy

Reservation of seats in different categories viz, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Dependents of Defence and Paramilitary Personnel, Freedom Fighters, Physically Challenged and Sports will be made in accordance with the rules and instructions framed by the Chandigarh Administration, whereas in case of Single Girl Child, One out of Two Girl Children, Kashmiri Migrants, Kargil

Martyrs, Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia, Students from Jammu & Kashmir, Border Area Rural Area will be made as per instructions issued by Panjab University from time to time.

Any student who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which she applies for admission, maintaining her internal seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in that category. In such a case, the student will get the benefit in one category of her choice.

I. Reservation of Seats

The reservation is out of 60% seats of Chandigarh Pool and 40% seats of outstation Pool.

C. Reservation for Physically Challenged

The physically challenged student will be required to furnish a medical certificate issued by the Principal Medical Officer of her concerned district/Civil Surgeon of Chandigarh, indicating percentage of disability, whether she is otherwise able to pursue her studies, name of the disease/handicap, whether the handicap is temporary or permanent; and whether the handicap is progressively degenerative.

Students with a temporary handicap will not be considered against the reserved seats for the physically challenged. Where the certificate is issued by any authority other than the Principal Medical Officer of Chandigarh, the concerned Head of the institution shall refer the candidate to the Principal Medical Officer, Chandigarh and shall admit the candidate only after confirmation from the PMO, Chandigarh.

All candidates seeking admission, will furnish an undertaking, as under, along with their application form:

I certify that I have no such physical handicap/disability which would hinder the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission. If at a later stage it is found that I have a physical handicap/disability which hinders the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission, then my admission will be liable to be cancelled.

In case of any doubt in interpretation of any clause of these instructions, the matter shall be referred to the Chandigarh Administration whose decision shall be final.

D. Reservation for Wards of Freedom Fighters

2% seats in each pool will be filled from the category of children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters. A certificate issued by the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district will have to be attached with the admission form.

II. Additional Seats including NRI (Non-Convertible)

(a) Wards of Kashmiri Displaced Persons

(DR Colleges letter No. Misc./A-6/84247-84447 dt. 10.5.17)

As per letter No. Misc./A-6/84247-84447 dated 10.05.2017 from the Deputy Registrar, Panjab University: As conveyed vide letter no. D.O No. F 1-13/2010 CPP-II dated 19th March 2015 from University Grants Commission and letter No. F. No. 3-1/2012-NER dated 12th March 2015 from Govt. of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi with regard to the concession to the Kashmiri migrant for admission in Higher Education which are read as under

- i. Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- ii. Increase in intake capacity up to 5% course wise
- iii. Reservation of at least **1 seat** merit quota in technical/professional institutions
- iv. Waiving off domicile requirements.

(b) Wards of Permanently Disabled and Martyrs of Kargil War

letter no. 6576-6875/R & S, dated 27-05-2014, Panjab University.

Concession be given for admission to various courses in Educational Institutions up to academic year 2020-21 only to those wards of martyrs/permanently disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of Kargil war who have a valid certificate from the Ministry Of Defence to this effect:

- a) **1% seats with minimum of 1 seat** in the Departments except in partially financed/ self-financing courses.
- b) Exemption of Fee.
- c) Exemption of Hostel Fee. (vide Syndicate Para 30 (XI) dated 29-7-08. for the direct descendants of the Kargil Martyrs/permanently disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation)

(C) Single Girl Child/One Girl Child out of the only Two Girl Children

(DR Colleges letter No Misc./A-6/83745-83945dated:03/05/2017)

- **Two additional seats per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four (4)** out of the two girl children from the session 2015-16 are created for admission to a given course in Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centers and its affiliated Colleges, provided they are otherwise eligible. **The Additional seats will be only for those girl children who are either a single girl child or one amongst the only two girl children with no male child.** The additional seat will be available to only one of the two girl children of a couple.
- An affidavit on a stamp paper worth Rs. 20/- duly attested by Class I Magistrate to be obtained from the parents of the girl children declaring therein that the benefit of this

scheme is being claimed for only one girl child out of the two girl children and the parents shall not claim the same for the 2nd girl child elsewhere in future.

(The Specimen of the affidavit is given at the end of the Prospectus)

(d) Cancer / AIDS / Thalassemia Patients

1. **One additional seat** each for the student suffering from Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia has been allowed for admission in each course in Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centres and its affiliated colleges, subject to the condition that the candidate seeking admission under each of these categories is otherwise eligible.
2. The claimant candidate will have to submit a certificate as a proof from the National Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS etc. in support of his/her claims.

(e) Border Area Students

(DR Colleges letter No. Misc./A-6/83946-84246 dated 03.05.2017)

One additional seat over and above the sanctioned seats has been reserved for border area students. The Border Area students shall mean those candidates who have passed their matriculation and 10+2 examination from the Border Area Schools situated within 20 kms from the International Border. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the Tehsildar or the Principal/Headmaster/Head of the School certifying that the Schools from where the candidate has passed the matriculation or 10+2 examination, falls within the aforesaid Border Area.

(f) Two additional seats for Rural Area Students

(DR Colleges letter No. Misc./A-6/83946-84246 dated 03.05.2017)

Only those candidates will be considered in this category, who have passed their Matriculation and 10+2 Examination from those rural schools that do not fall in the area of Municipal Corporation/Municipal Committee/Small Town/Notified Area. Further, the candidates should have been studying in such school for at least 5 years before passing the last examination. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the D.E.O./Principal of the concerned institute of the area certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed the Matriculation and 10+2 examinations falls within the aforesaid Rural Area.

(g) One Additional Seat for youth festival

(letter no PU/DYW/1010-1200 Dated 27.05.2016)

- 1 **In all the teaching courses, one additional seat per unit will be reserved for those candidates who have excelled and outperformed in the Youth Festivals.**
2. The candidates availing the aforesaid weightage must fulfill the eligibility condition for admission to the particular course

3. For recommending admission on the basis of youth festival participation, admission criterion will be fixed on the basis of merit as mentioned below and upon the verification of the original certificates of those candidates, who:

- a. have presented an item in an international cultural festival approved by Punjab Govt. /Govt. of India /Panjab University.
 - b. have got distinction in All India National Inter University Youth Festival organized by AIU/Govt. of India.
 - c. have got distinction in North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organized by AIU.
 - d. have secured First/Second/Third position in Inter University Youth Festival organized by Govt. of Punjab / any State or Central University.
 - e. have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Inter Zonal Festival.
 - f. have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Zonal Festival.
 - g. have secured First/Second/Third position in state level competition of State School Education Board of Punjab/Haryana/HP/or CBSE/ICSE or any other recognized board.
- ✓ Category A is considered as higher category followed by B, C onwards.
 - ✓ Preference will be given to the candidate/s who have represented Panjab University, Chandigarh in A, B, C or D category.
 - ✓ In case of two or more candidate having equal position at equal level:
 - a) Position secured in an individual item shall be rated higher than position secured as a team member.
 - b) The eligibility of the candidate for participation in University Youth Festivals, in future, may also be considered.
 - c) Academic record will be considered in case of tie between two or more candidates.

4. In case of any ambiguity, the related certificates shall be verified from the Department of Youth Welfare, Panjab University through the concerned Chairperson/Principal/Head etc.

5. The candidate/s admitted on the basis of Youth Festival additional quota seats shall have to give an assurance to the university authorities that during the duration of the course, the candidate will participate in the activities associated with his/her item and will not create any kind of indiscipline. The admission committee will assess the participation of the candidate and in case the candidate does not fulfill the requirements, her admission may be cancelled. However, exemption may be given because of special reasons like sickness or any other unavoidable reason.

As per decision of the Syndicate Para (13) meeting dated 22.11.2014 and Syndicate Para (36) dated 25-01-2015, regarding accreditation A, B & C" certificate & weightage 1%, 2% & 3% for NSS volunteers.

i. 'A' Certificate: 1% of obtained Marks

ii. 'B' Certificate: 2% of obtained Marks

iii. 'C' Certificate: 3% of obtained Marks

Any other weightage approved by the D.U.I/Vice-Chancellor, Panjab University.

A candidate can claim weightage in one or more categories given above. However, the total weightage allowed shall not exceed **9% of the normalized marks** obtained in the qualifying examination. These weightages shall not be used for determining eligibility for admission as prescribed by the Panjab University under its regulations.

Note:

1. The student/s belonging to the above categories will also be considered in the general category according to her merit. If admitted on the basis of her merit in the general category, she will not be counted towards the seats reserved for the categories concerned.
2. Rules of Reservation policy existing at the time of admission will be applicable.

N. Reserved Categories of Sports

This will be as per rules and regulations of Sports Dept. of the Chandigarh Administration vide Home Secretary letter no. 8493, dated 5-5-2003. Implementation of the policy will be as under:

1. 2% of the total number of seats in each course shall be filled up by sportswomen. These 2% seats shall be reserved on the basis of total intake of each course. Fraction of 0.5 or above shall be rounded off to the next higher number. This category shall not be divided into Chandigarh pool/outstation pool. The inter merit of the candidates seeking admission in any course in the Reserved Category of sports shall be determined only on the basis of their merit in sports as per grading criteria mentioned. In case any of the seats in the sports category in any branch remains vacant, the same shall be thrown open to the candidates of General Category. This policy is for the players of Chandigarh only.
2. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category of students:
 - i. **Those who pass their qualifying examination from Schools/Colleges, recognized by the Chandigarh Administration in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as regular students and have applied for Gradation Certificate will be given admission subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh State/Schools etc. in the National / other recognized tournaments.**
 - ii. Where the Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other States/U.Ts. on reciprocal basis, to give benefit of reservation to admission in sports category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per the existing policy of the Chandigarh Administration.

iii. Countersigning of the Gradation Certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that countersigned certificates will be graded as per the policy of the Chandigarh Administration.

3. Students seeking admission under this category shall be considered only:

i. If her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in Intercollege/Inter-University tournaments.

ii. If her achievement in sports relates to her activity in any of the three years preceding the year of admission. (For example, for admission in the year 2011-12, the Achievements shall not be prior to April, 2008).

iii. Gradation Certificate will not be meant for employment purposes.

4. The Director Sports, Chandigarh Administration, or his nominee, not below the rank of the Joint Director, Sports will issue the certificate, and also have the authority to cancel any certificate at any time if it is found to have been issued on false/incorrect/concealed information or record.

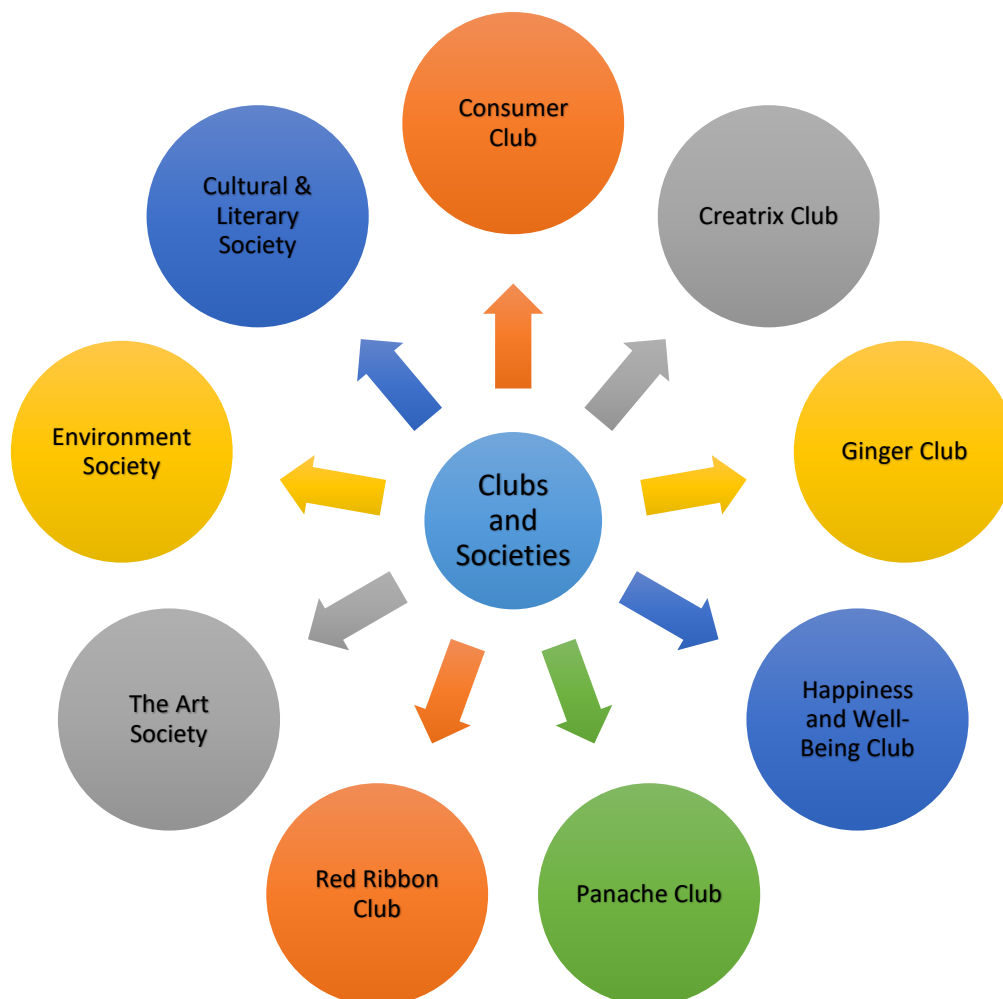

STUDENT COUNCIL

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

Under graduate students can join NCC as volunteers. Once enrolled, NCC is compulsory for three years. NCC Cadets have to attend 33 periods of regular training and participate in social service activities every year. On completion of one camp within two years, NCC Cadets are eligible for 'BEE' Certificate. For 'CEE' Certificate NCC cadets need to pass 'BEE' Certificate and attend one camp.

NCC inculcates a spirit of discipline and patriotism amongst the students. It helps to broaden their outlook and develop the quality of leadership and spirit of fraternity. The college unit offers Army and Navy Wing.

Rules

- Student enrolled under NCC shall be required to attend minimum 40 days parade in a session as per schedule.
- NCC cadet must collect their uniform from the NCC in-charge at the beginning of the session.
- Cadets should return the uniform to the NCC in-charge and NCC units before the dispersal of the classes. The university roll numbers will not be issued unless the full uniform is deposited and all dues cleared.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

Govt. Home Science College proactively imbibes and inculcates the motto of National Service Scheme. **“Not me but you”** in letter, spirit and action by active participation of NSS volunteers. The motto of NSS is also broadly in sync with the college motto, “Knowledge for Service”. House Examinations

- There will be one House Examination for B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. and PG Diploma students in each semester.
- **Attendance in house examinations is compulsory.**
- Students absenting themselves from the House Examinations without any intimation will have to abide by the decision taken by the college disciplinary committee.
- **Students absenting themselves from house examinations on medical grounds should submit the medical certificate from Government Hospital within three days. No medical certificate will be entertained afterwards.**
- Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students who resort to unfair means during examinations.
- **Class tests and assignments in all the subjects are carried out regularly throughout the year.**

Rules for University Examinations

Eligibility for the University Examinations will be as per the Panjab University Rules.

B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. Courses and Post Graduate Diploma Courses:

Roll numbers for University examinations will be issued only to those:

- Who have **75% of attendance both in theory and practical separately in each subject** for each semester for all B.Sc., M.Sc. and Post Graduate Diploma Courses.
- Who have secured a **minimum of 25% marks in theory and practical separately**, in the house examinations for all the courses.
- In addition to the Regulations/Rules for B.Sc. Home Science (3-year) Course, a candidate who having passed the Second semester examination, discontinues studies, may be permitted to join the Third semester or the subsequent semester within two years of his/her passing the examination of the semester after which the candidate has discontinued his/her studies.
- Notwithstanding the above condition, **no candidate will be allowed to spend more than maximum of five years in B.Sc classes.** The candidate must earn the stipulated number of credits for the award of the degree within this period of five years.
- In addition to the Regulations/Rules for M.Sc. (Clothing & Textiles) and M.Sc. (Human Development & Family Relations), a candidate who having passed the Second semester examination, or any other subsequent examination, discontinues studies, may be permitted to join the Third semester or the subsequent semester within one year of his/her passing the examination of the semester after which the candidate has discontinued his/her studies.

- Notwithstanding the above condition, **no candidate will be allowed to spend more than a maximum of three years in M.Sc. classes.** The candidate must earn the stipulated number of credits for the award of the degree within the period of three years
- **A Candidate who appeared under semester system for undergraduate courses should be allowed to take admission under semester system in M.Sc. if she has two re-appears in 3rd, 4th, 5th & 6th Semester. The candidate will not be allowed to take admission in M.Sc. if she has re-appear in the subject in undergraduate classes in which she wants to take admission in M.Sc. Courses.**
- The admission to M.Sc. course shall be done on the basis of merit. In case any seat is lying vacant after exhausting the merit list, up to the last date of admission only then the Principal can admit such students.
- The candidate shall not be admitted in 3rd semester of M.Sc. if she does not clear the re-appear papers of undergraduate classes.

Internal Assessment

B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. Courses and Post Graduate Diploma Courses:

- Each student is required to obtain at least 50% in Theory and Practicals separately in Internal Assessment .
- The internal assessment will be calculated on the basis of performance in House Examinations, tests, assignments , attendance and participation in various co-curricular activities.
- If the candidate fails in internal assessment, she will need to take re-examination in the respective subject.

Awards and Prizes

Following awards and prizes are given to the students who excel in academics, sports and cultural fields:

Criteria

- Final year students (from all the streams) would be eligible for this award.

- For student representing college in youth festivals and other cultural activities
- The student should fulfil the university requirement of 75% attendance.

Criteria: -

Fee Refund Policy

A student who wishes to withdraw her admission from the college must apply to the Principal in writing. The Application for withdrawal must be countersigned by the parent/guardian. A student leaving the college without any information to the Principal will forfeit the entire security deposit and the same will be adjusted towards the dues. No claim for refund of security will be entertained in such cases.

In partial modification of office order No. DPI-UT-12(6) 95 dated 30-3-07/24-4-07, the Advisor to the Administrator, Union Territory, Chandigarh is pleased to adopt the recommendations of the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh Endorsed vide No. 4721-4900/Misc/A-3 dated 28-5-07 regarding refund of entire fee collected from the students withdrawing before the starting of the course, the candidates in the waiting list should be given admission against the vacant seat. The entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than Rs.1000/- (Rupees one Thousands only) shall be refunded and returned by the Institution/University to the student/candidate withdrawing from the programme. Should a student leave after joining the course and if the seat consequently falling vacant has been filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, the institution must return the fee collected with proportionate deduction of monthly fee and proportionate hostel rent, where applicable, as conveyed by University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide their letter No. F.No. 1-3/2007(CPP-II) dated 23rd April 2007.

Note: Notwithstanding anything contained in this document to the contrary, the "Instructions for Admission to Various Courses" of Panjab University, Chandigarh or any subsequent instructions to be issued for the session 2018-19 shall apply.

Refund of Security:

The application for the refund of security must be accompanied by "No Dues" certificate from the Heads of various Departments, College Librarian, Hostel Superintendent. The applications for refund will be entertained within a year of the student leaving the college.

Loss or Breakage: Any loss or breakage of College Property has to be paid for by the defaulter.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

1. **Ragging is strictly prohibited.** Ragging in any form on the college campus will be treated as crime.
2. The students are required to attend all the lectures/tutorials/practicals.
3. The students are required to maintain discipline on the college campus.
4. The students must appear in various House Examinations.
5. **Use of mobile phones** in the classrooms and library, is strictly **prohibited**.
6. Smoking, drinking and playing cards on the college campus is strictly **prohibited**.
7. **Students must make it a point to read the Notice Board and browse college website daily. Ignorance of orders/notices duly displayed on the Notice Board/website shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.**
8. Students violating rules and resorting to indiscipline are liable to be punished in the form of heavy fine, withdrawal of concession or stipends and even expulsion from the college in extreme cases.
9. Students who are under-age and do not have a valid driving license for a two-wheeler or a four-wheeler are not allowed to drive as per the directions of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court.
10. The students must park their vehicles in the parking lot. Plying of vehicles on the college campus is not allowed.
11. It is imperative that students be well-behaved and respectful towards other students. Anyone indulging in or abetting gang fights, bullying, eve-teasing or causing damage to the college property will be dealt with very strictly and can even be expelled.
12. Parents are requested to remain in touch with the faculty members to keep a track of their ward's academic performance, attendance and conduct and are also requested to liaison with the teachers.
13. Each student must bear the cost of repairing and replacing all articles of furniture, crockery, library books etc. lost, broken and damaged by her.
14. **The college reserves the right to refuse admission to a student or to detain her on the following grounds:**
 - **Indiscipline**
 - **Shortage of Attendance**
 - **Not qualifying the eligibility conditions as laid by Panjab University**
 - **Ragging (As per the guidelines from Hon'ble Supreme Court of India)**
 - **Bullying, Teasing and Sexual Harassment.**
 - **Drugs**

RULES

Leave Rules

1. In case of sickness or emergency the leave application must be submitted within a week.
2. The application for the leave should be signed by the parent/guardian of the applicant .
3. Applications for sick leave for more than three days should be supported by a medical certificate from a Govt. Dispensary/Hospital.
4. **However, leave on medical grounds or otherwise does not entitle a student to claim benefit of lectures or for appearing in the special test.**
5. Also the leave of personal grounds does not entitle a student to claim benefit of lectures or for appearing in special tests. However the leave application duly signed by the parent/guardian should be submitted for the information.
6. The sports person's leave for sports competition/coaching camp(including journey days) recommended by Directorate of Sports including Inter-University tournaments, Inter-College tournaments, Sr. National Championships and International Championships etc. During this leave period the concerned sports person shall be treated as present for the assessment and for all other academic purposes.
7. Absence from the college on days immediately before or after autumn or winter vacation entails disciplinary action.
8. **The name of any student who absents herself from the college for ten days or more without any information will be struck off from the college rolls. The Principal has the power to strike off name of any student who is irregular in attendance or is not amenable to the college discipline.**
9. If a student after getting admission or during the session remains absent continuously for 10 days, her name will be struck off from the college rolls.
10. The college discipline committee is fully authorized to take disciplinary action if the student remains absent for more than ten days.

Library Rules

The college has a well-equipped library with books on all the subjects especially in Home Science. Great importance is attached to independent reading in the library. The library subscribes to a large number of magazines and periodicals which are placed in the library.

- As soon as a student is admitted to the college, she shall be issued an Identity card and Library card-cum-Reader`s ticket on production of the fee receipt. Following number of photographs to be submitted in the library, by the students of respective classes.

- Students must bring with them their identity-cum-library card (College Diary) when coming to the library/ reading room and produce the same on demand by the library staff or by any member of the teaching staff. Those students who fail to produce the identity card will not be allowed to enter the library. Any girl found damaging/tearing library book(s) will not be allowed to enter the library for that complete academic session.
- The number of books which students of different classes are entitled to borrow at one time is as follows:

B.Sc. Home Science/ B.Sc. Fashion Designing	2
P.G. Diploma Students	3
Master's Students - M. Sc. Home Science	4

- Books are issued for a period of fourteen days only. Books not returned in time entail a fine of Re. 1 per day.
- Any loss of library books or periodicals will have to be paid for by the defaulter within a week by replacing the book or paying the price.
- Any damage done to a book shall have to be brought to the notice of the Librarian before getting the book issued. Otherwise the person who returns it will be held responsible for the damage done.
- The librarian can ask the borrower to return a book before the due date if the same is needed in the library for reference.
- Reference books are issued only 15 minutes before the closing time of the library and are to be returned by 9:30 AM the next morning. A fine of Re. one per hour is charged for books returned late.

HOSTEL ADMISSION REGULATIONS

1. Candidates will apply on the prescribed college Admission Form incorporated in the prospectus.
2. Concealment or wrong information at the time of admission will result into cancellation of their seat.
3. **Old Students are required to report for college and hostel admission positively as per the Admission Schedule failing which they will lose their right to admission and hostel seat. Parent accompanying is must.**
4. The admission to hostel is comprising of following steps:
 - Step 1: College Admission
 - Step 2: Hostel Admission
 - Postcard size recent family photo to be attached with the form

- Passport size local guardian photo and signature on the form
- Undertaking for local guardians
- Anti-ragging form
- Health status undertaking
- Medical fitness certificate by an authorized medical practitioner
- Two self-addressed and postal stamped envelopes for correspondence.

Step 3: Payment of the fees

Step 4: Room allotment

5. Physical presence of the candidate as well as parents is mandatory on the day of admission.

6. Parents to note that admission formalities/process may take more than one day. So they are required to make their own arrangements of stay accordingly.

7. Admitted students will report to the hostel authorities in their allotted hostels one day before the commencement of the classes (Date to be notified on the college notice board/website).

8. Foreign students and students belonging to Manipur, Leh-Ladhak and Tibet etc. must have their parents accompanying them at the time of hostel admission. They also need to submit an affidavit/authority letter from their parents authorizing the local guardians to perform all responsibilities on their behalf regarding hostel rules and regulations. **They are required to bring a family photograph and also two passport size photos at the time of admission.**

NOTE: HOSTEL MESS DUES AND SECURITY WILL BE ACCEPTED THROUGH ONLINE PAYMENT MODE ONLY

Procedure for Accommodation of students from other Govt. colleges in the College Hostel

1. Only those students will get admission in the hostel of Govt. Home Science College, Sec-10 whose names will be mentioned in the recommended list from their respective colleges.
2. The parents are advised to check the date of reporting for hostel admission.
3. The recommended candidates have to follow the same above mentioned procedure to get admission in the hostel.
4. All Students will be governed by the hostel rules and hostel fee structure.

HOSTEL RULES

GENERAL

1. No student will be allowed to join hostel without fee Receipts (Both College & Hostel).
2. Students are required to bring their own bedding, bed linen and door curtains. The other basic items are also required i.e. locks, buckets, mugs, bulbs, dusters, plate, spoon, tumbler etc which are also available in the college canteen.
3. Furniture will be issued to the resident students against their signatures and the student will be held responsible for any breakage of furniture issued to her.
4. Hostel students are not allowed to use any personal electric appliances like radio, two in one, electric rods, electric press, transistors, record players etc. In case of a defaulter, strict action will be taken and the appliance will be confiscated. They are also warned not to tamper with electrical fittings. The college will not be responsible for any mishap.
5. Hostel students are allowed to keep two-wheelers only for their convenience.
6. The College is not responsible for any inappropriate behavior/action of the student which is detrimental to accepted social norms.
7. Possession and consumption of any kind of intoxicants/drugs/ alcohol will result in immediate expulsion from the hostel.
8. **The college does not take responsibility of valuables especially mobile phones and cash of resident students.** They are therefore advised not to bring jewellery and other expensive articles with them.
9. **Students are not allowed to stay in the College hostel during autumn break, winter break or summer vacations.**
10. All the students will report daily for evening Roll-Call in the hostel common room at 6:00 p.m.
11. Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time.
12. If, at any time, it is found that the information given to hostel authorities by the parents or the students is wrong, strict action will be taken immediately by the hostel and college authorities.
13. Resident students are not allowed to take part in any kind of protest or strike. This will lead to their expulsion from the hostel and college.
14. **Strict disciplinary action will be taken against defaulters, which may result in immediate expulsion from hostel.**
15. Students are expected to maintain a decent dress code in the hostel and college premises.
16. Habitual defiance of the hostel rules will render a resident student liable to disciplinary action, **a special fine** and even expulsion from the college.
17. **Ragging is strictly prohibited as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court orders. Defaulters will face punitive action.**
18. Any kind of shouting, creating rumours, knocking on doors or any other act likely to create disturbance is strictly prohibited within the Hostel premises.
19. Any matter of dispute with fellow boarders should be reported immediately to the Warden/Principal.
20. Residents must switch off fans and lights before leaving for night out, day out and during college hours.

21. Action will be taken against the erring students, who pass undesirable remarks about fellow students, indulge in physical and mental torture and show disobedience and non-co-operative behaviour.
22. A day scholar is not permitted to visit or stay in the hostel without the permission of the Principal.
23. Student must give due respect to the wardens and the hostel staff.
24. Residents should maintain cordial relations with other fellow students.
25. Any hosteller found guilty of creating indiscipline, bringing bad publicity or indulging in negative politics is liable to be expelled with immediate effect.
26. The Principal reserves the right to change any of the hostel rules and dues. The changes shall be binding on the residents.

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

It is mandatory to carry a Medical Fitness Certificate by an authorized Medical Practitioner at the time of entry to the hostel. The Medical Certificate should carry the information of the blood group of the student. If a student is suffering from any allergy or medicine, then the same should also be mentioned. Such students are advised to take all precautionary measures themselves to avoid repercussions. Non-disclosure of information related to any serious medical condition will result in the cancellation of the hostel seat. In case this fact is concealed from the authorities at the time of admission, the college will not be responsible for any emergency that may arise. Students are advised not to indulge in self-medication; if they do so, they will be responsible for the consequences. A nurse is available on the campus 24X7 for any kind of medical aid. In case of emergency the student will be taken to the nearby Govt. hospital and the local guardian will be called immediately along with the intimation to the parents.

HOSTEL LEAVE RULES

1. A resident student can avail night out /weekend leave only twice a month.
2. Wardens can grant leave only on weekends and not during college days and timings.
3. A maximum of 4 days leave will be granted for the wedding of siblings. The wedding card and a letter from parents with the proof of their identity should be attached with the leave application. In all such cases the parents must write directly to the Principal at least two days in advance.
4. Residents will be granted permission to attend family functions only if they have the requisite attendance in classes, have appeared in the Mid-semester examinations, and have adhered to the rules and regulations of the college.
5. If any student extends her leave period of night stay, the parents/guardians should inform the hostel warden well in advance and submit an extension leave application duly signed by the parents.
6. The warden can sanction leave upto 4 days. Any leave more than 4 days would require the sanction of the Principal.
7. Attendance will not be granted for medical leave or any other leave taken by the student.
8. Students who do not report for 10 days without prior permission will have to vacate the hostel.

RULES FOR OUTING

Timings for Outings:

Sundays	10:00 a.m. till Roll Call time
Wednesday	3:00 p.m. till Roll Call time
Other Holidays	12:00 p.m. till Roll Call time

1. Residents must enter their timings of departure and arrival in the outing register (Dayout/Nightout/Coaching).
2. The resident should positively return to the hostel before Roll call otherwise serious action will be taken.
3. Residents shall strictly adhere to the timings of their return i.e. before Roll call in case of Day Outs and Night Outs.
4. The warden has the right to deny outing to a resident in case of returning late from Night out/any kind of misconduct.
5. If a resident frequently overstays during her leave, her hostel seat may be cancelled and it may also entail refusal of admission to the college in the next session.
6. Students who absent themselves from the hostel without Night Out Pass will have to face strict action as per the decision of the Hostel Committee.
7. Residents should not ask for outings/favours other than the mentioned outing schedule.

Note: Day outings will be given according to the season and circumstances.

MESS RULES

1. Mess Security amounting to Rs. 1000/- will be charged from the hostel resident students at the time of admission to the hostel which is refundable.
2. Mess is run on contract basis. The Mess Charges for every session will be as per the approved contract rate of the contractor.
3. Mess Dues are deposited cumulative for every quarter. Mess Dues are to be deposited before the 10th of the month of the quarter, for which dues are being paid online.
4. If a student fails to pay the dues within 15 days, their mess account will be cancelled/they will not get food from the mess.
5. Hostellers are required to dine in the dining hall only.
6. No hosteller is permitted to take her meals to her room without the special permission of the Hostel Supdt. If found violating, disciplinary action will be taken.
7. Meals will not be served before or after the fixed hour. Residents must observe meal timings and must be punctual for that.
8. No hosteller is allowed to enter the cooking area/kitchen of the hostel.
9. Hostellers are not allowed to come in casual clothes/ night dress to the dining hall. They should be properly and decently clad.
10. Residents must behave properly with the mess staff.

Note: Students must observe all mess rules in the dining hall

FOR THE KIND ATTENTION OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. At the time of joining the hostel, the parents/local guardians are required to submit, the name

- and the address of the local guardians on the specified form.
2. It is mandatory for the parents to put down their signatures in front of the Hostel Committee.
 3. Parents are advised to check the **leave book and sign it on every visit** of their wards.
 4. Students should open an SBI bank account in their home towns and carry the ATM cards along for convenient monetary transactions.
 5. Change of address/telephone number to be informed to the warden in writing by the parents.
 6. Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time.
 7. The visitors will meet their wards in visitor's room only during visiting hours.
 8. No parents/guardians will be allowed to go to the resident's room.,

APPOINTING OF LOCAL GUARDIANS

1. Appointing of a local guardian is a must for the hostel record of each resident student. In case of an emergency, local guardians will be informed and called.
2. Unmarried Men (blood relation and cousins) will not be accepted as local guardians and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
3. Only a married couple should preferably be the local guardian. (Real brother/sister, married or unmarried is also eligible to be local guardian)
4. Only parents and guardians will be allowed to meet their wards from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday and 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Sundays.
