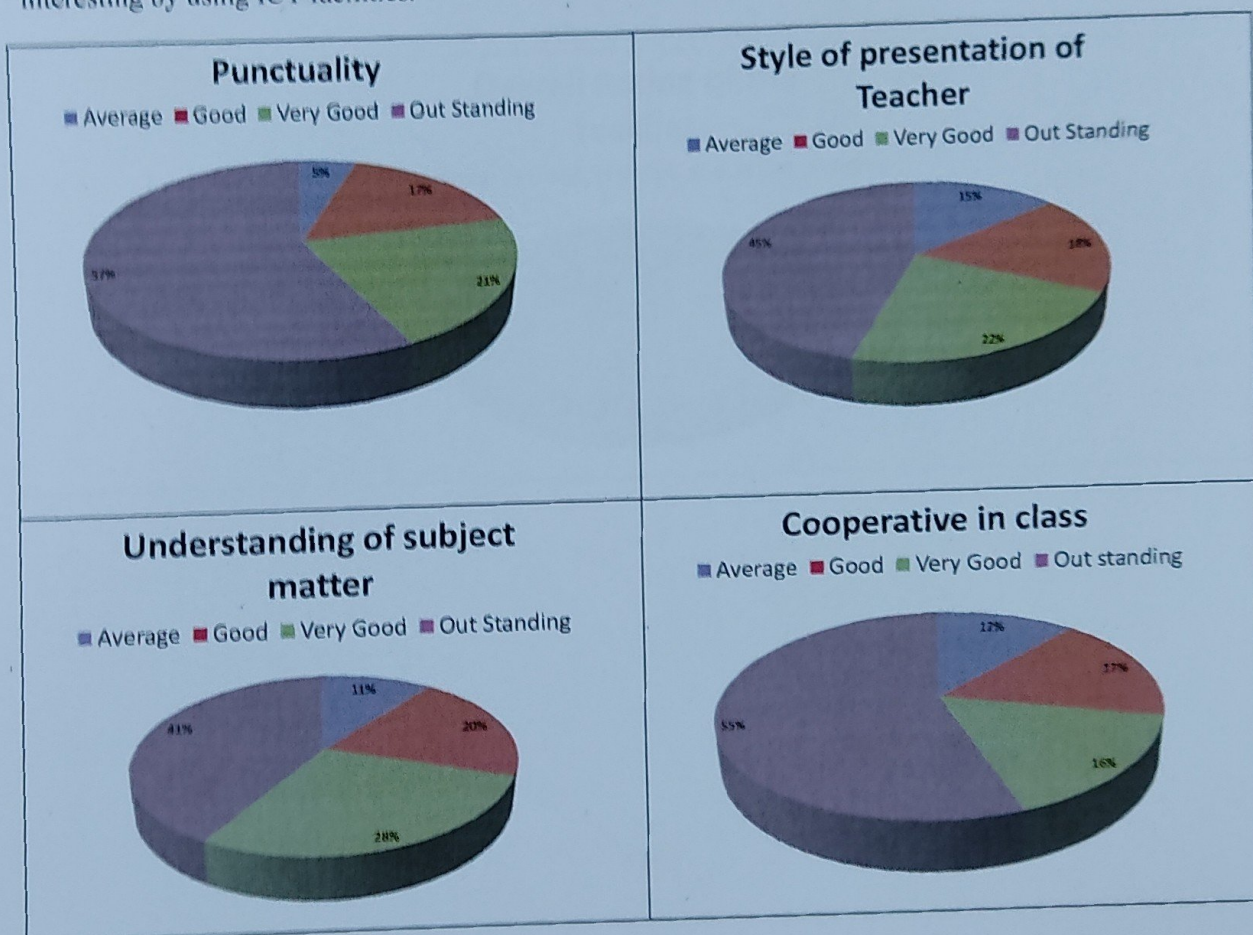


Feedback Analysis of 2018-19

Analysis of Feedback Collected from various stakeholders (Students, Teachers, Alumni, Parents And Employer) is as follows:

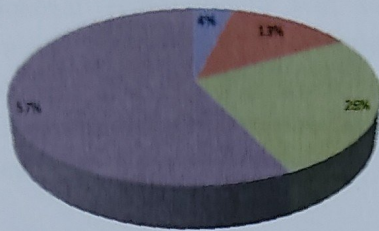
Students' Feedback Analysis

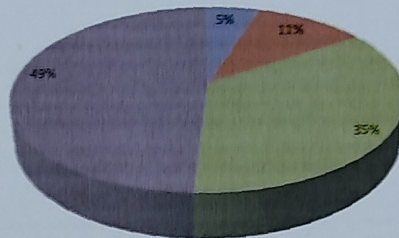
Interest generation by teachers

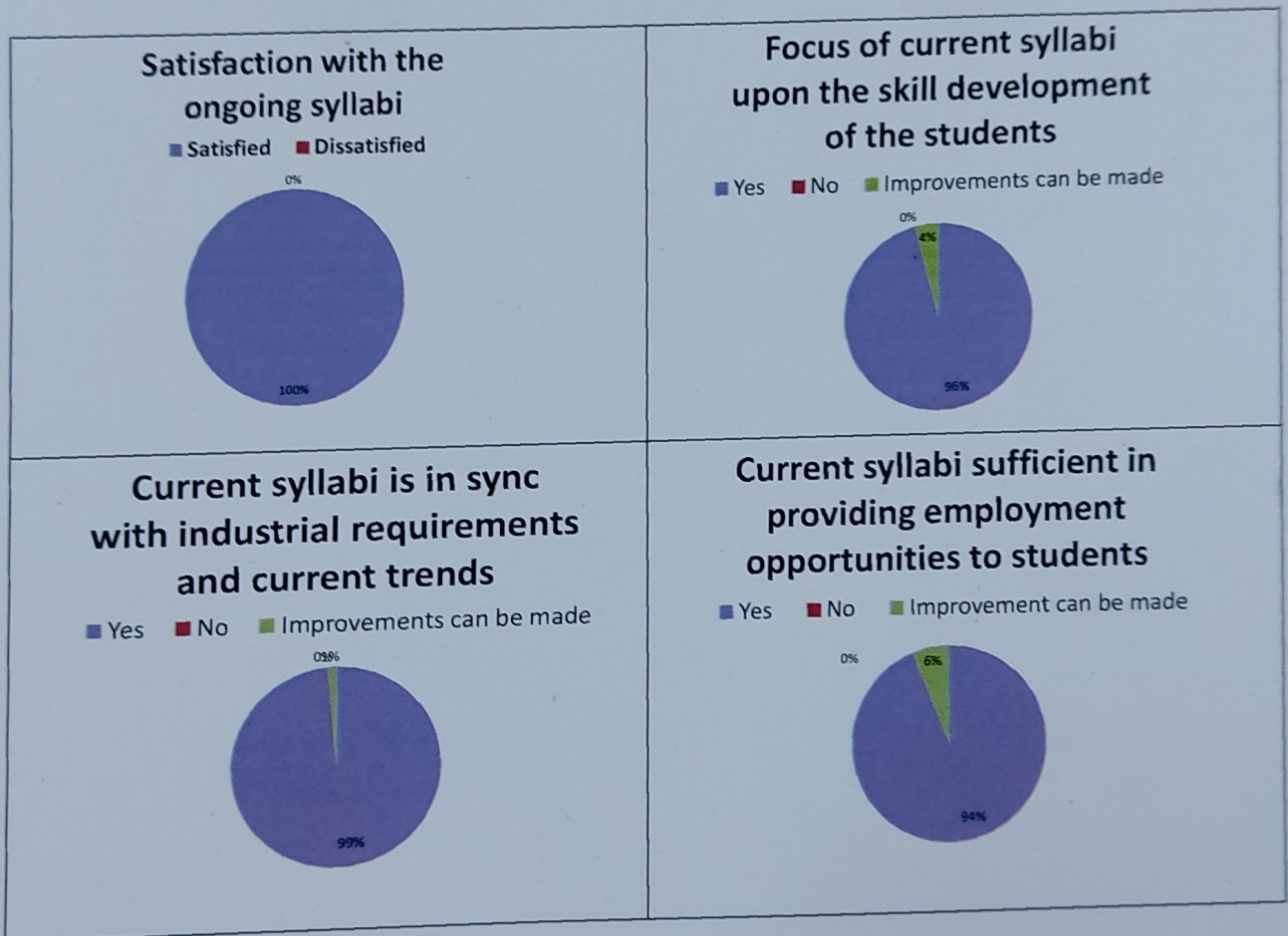
Overall Rating of the teacher

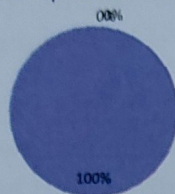
Teachers' Feedback Analysis

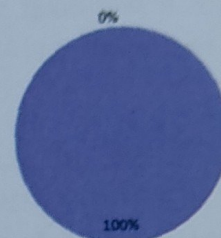
**Present infrastructure

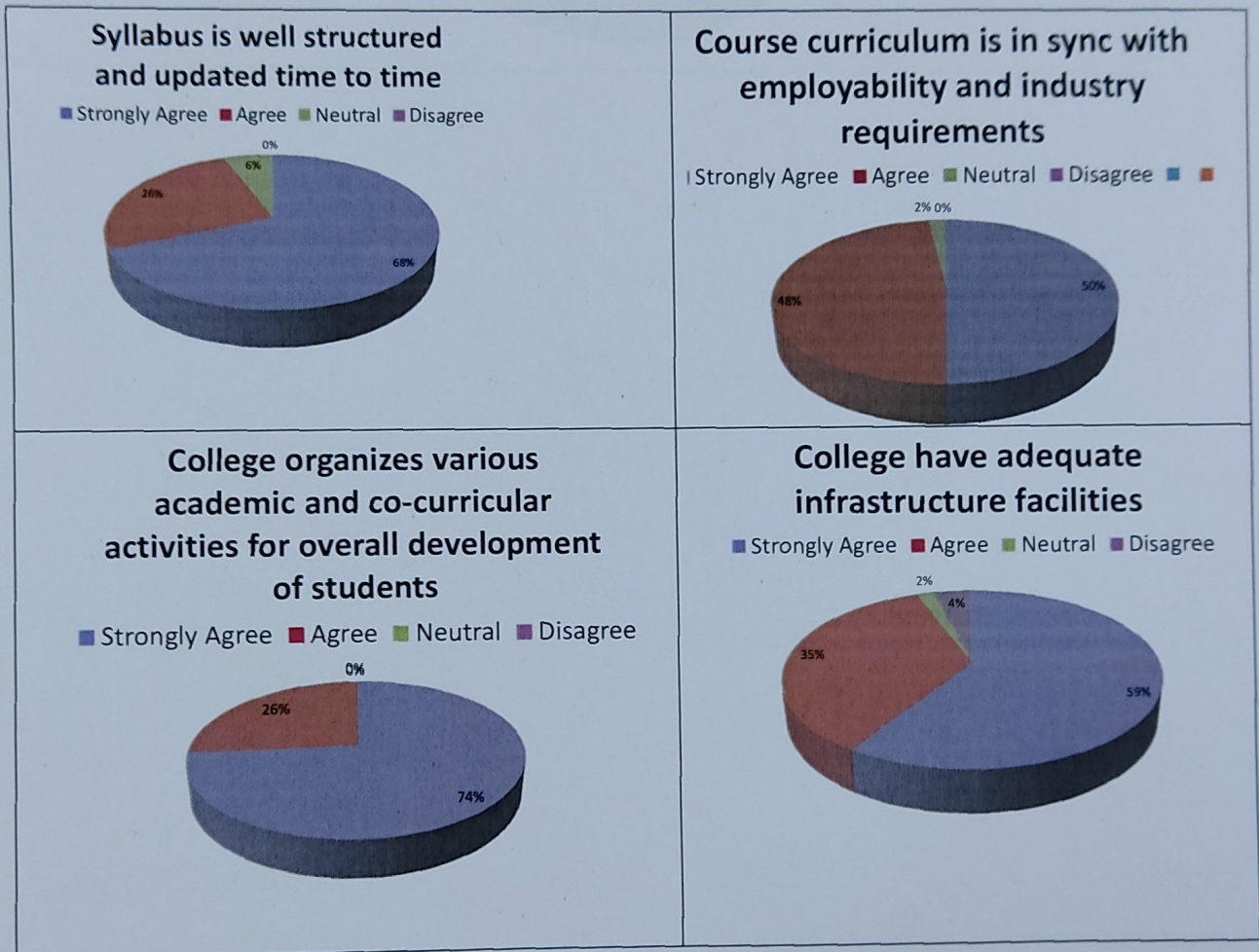
**There is enough academic

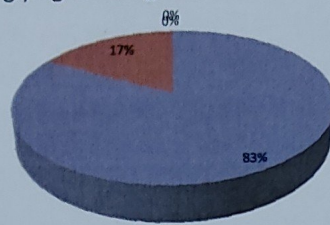
Alumni's Feedback Analysis

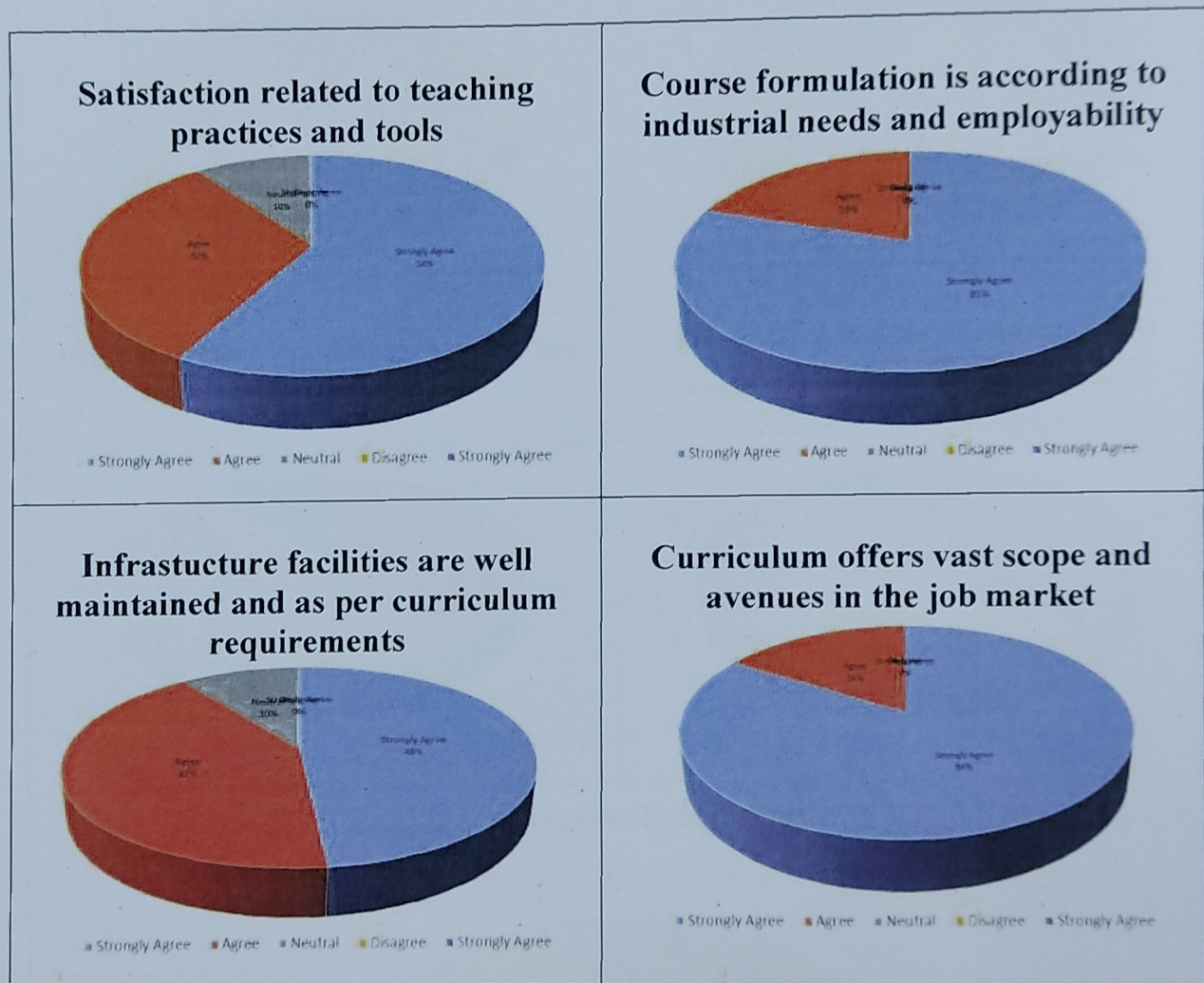
Do you feel proud to be associated with the this college as an alumni?

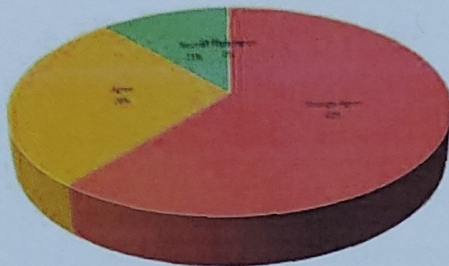


Employers' Feedback Analysis

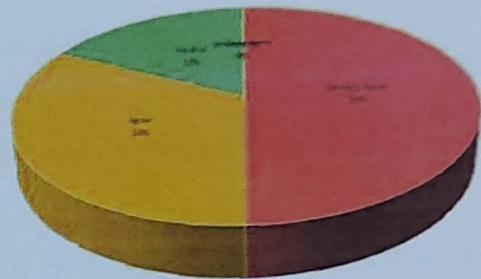
Course Curriculum is market oriented

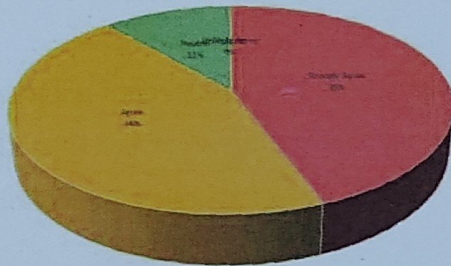
Students are skillful as per Industry Requirements

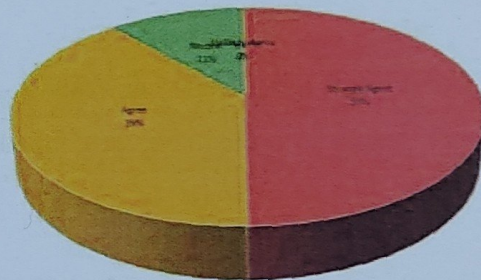
Students have good communication skills

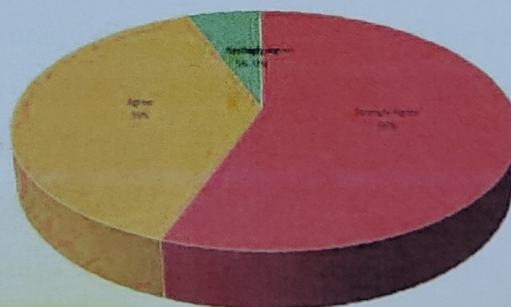
Students are able to manage job responsibilities with confidence

Action Taken Report for feedback Analysis of 2018-19

Feedback was collected from various stakeholders (Students, Teachers, Alumni, Parent and Employer). As per the suggestions given by them, following measures were taken:-

In order to give boost to GOI "Skill India" Programme, a number of workshops on skill building were organized for students and faculty:

- To Promote Healthy And Sustainable Entrepreneurship (Nov. 18, 2019)
- Grooming Techniques and Safe Use Of Social Media (Jan. 22, 2020)
- Diet Cal Software (Feb. 27, 2020)
- One day live skill building workshop 'Let's bake and decorate' in collaboration with Natasha Nanda #thepalatestory
- A Workshop Cum Demonstration on Skill Development and Sustainable Draping Techniques (Feb. 25, 2020) to enhance creativity amongst students and train them to create fashion through zero- waste approach.
- 3-Days Tech-Education Workshop On Resume Designing On Digital Platform CANVA Software (Feb.24-26, 2020) by, Chairperson, NGO 'Girls x Tech'.

Encouraging innovation, creativity, and research amongst staff and students, a National Seminar on 'Home Science: Nurturing Innovations & Skill Development' was held on February 20, 2020 with following activities:-

- Panel discussion woven around the theme 'Ek kadam Swawlamban ki aur'.
- Women Empowerment, Importance of Home Science education in innovation, skill development and motivating entrepreneurial skills among students.
- Exhibition by students of college, alumni and NGO 'Choti si Asha' to display their entrepreneurial skills by putting up stalls in the college.
- Healthy millet recipe competition in collaboration with Regional Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (RCED), and National Institute of Naturopathy, Pune, Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India on February 26, 2020 to promote 'Self- Reliance through Health and Entrepreneurship' and to observe the "Year of Millets".
