

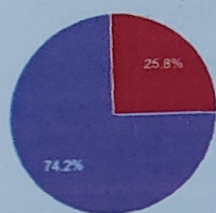
Feedback Analysis of 2019-20

Teachers' Feedback Analysis

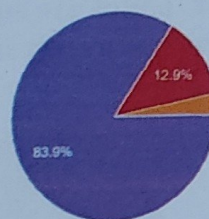

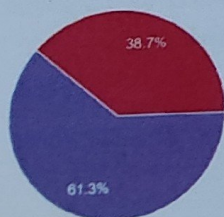

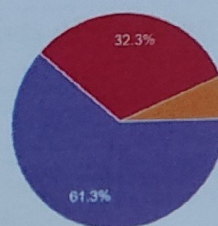

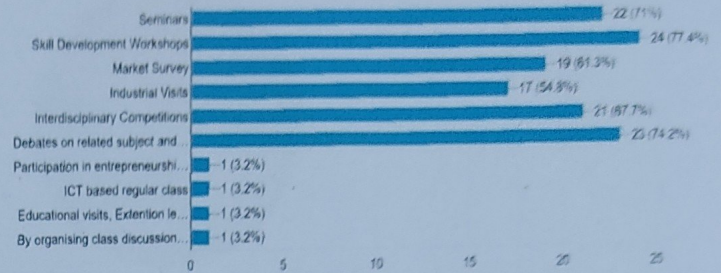

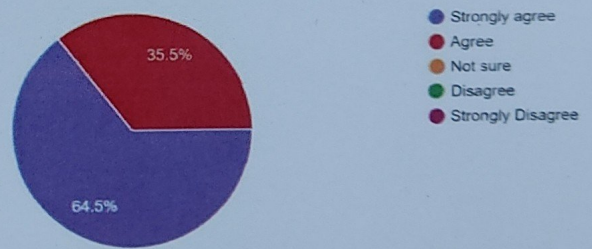

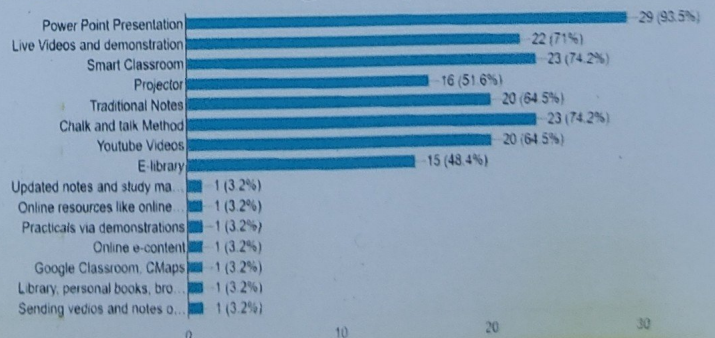

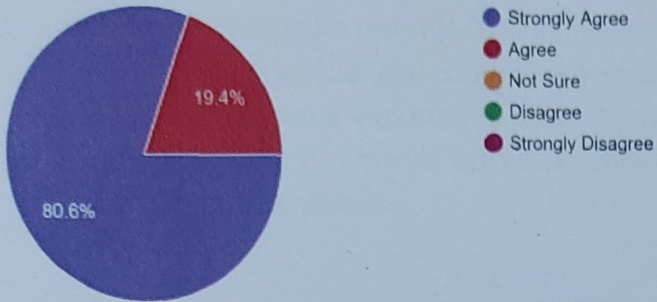

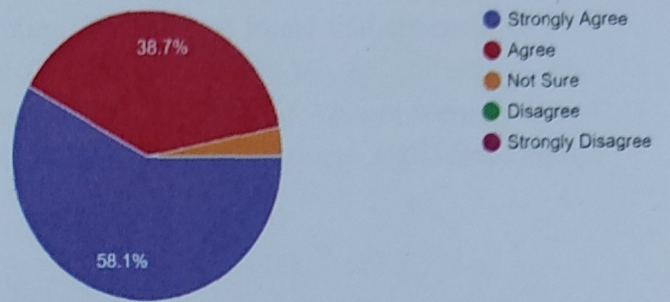

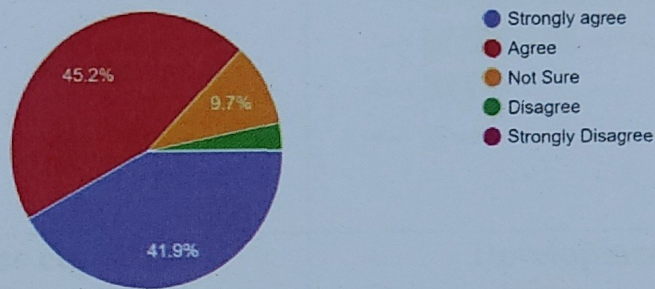

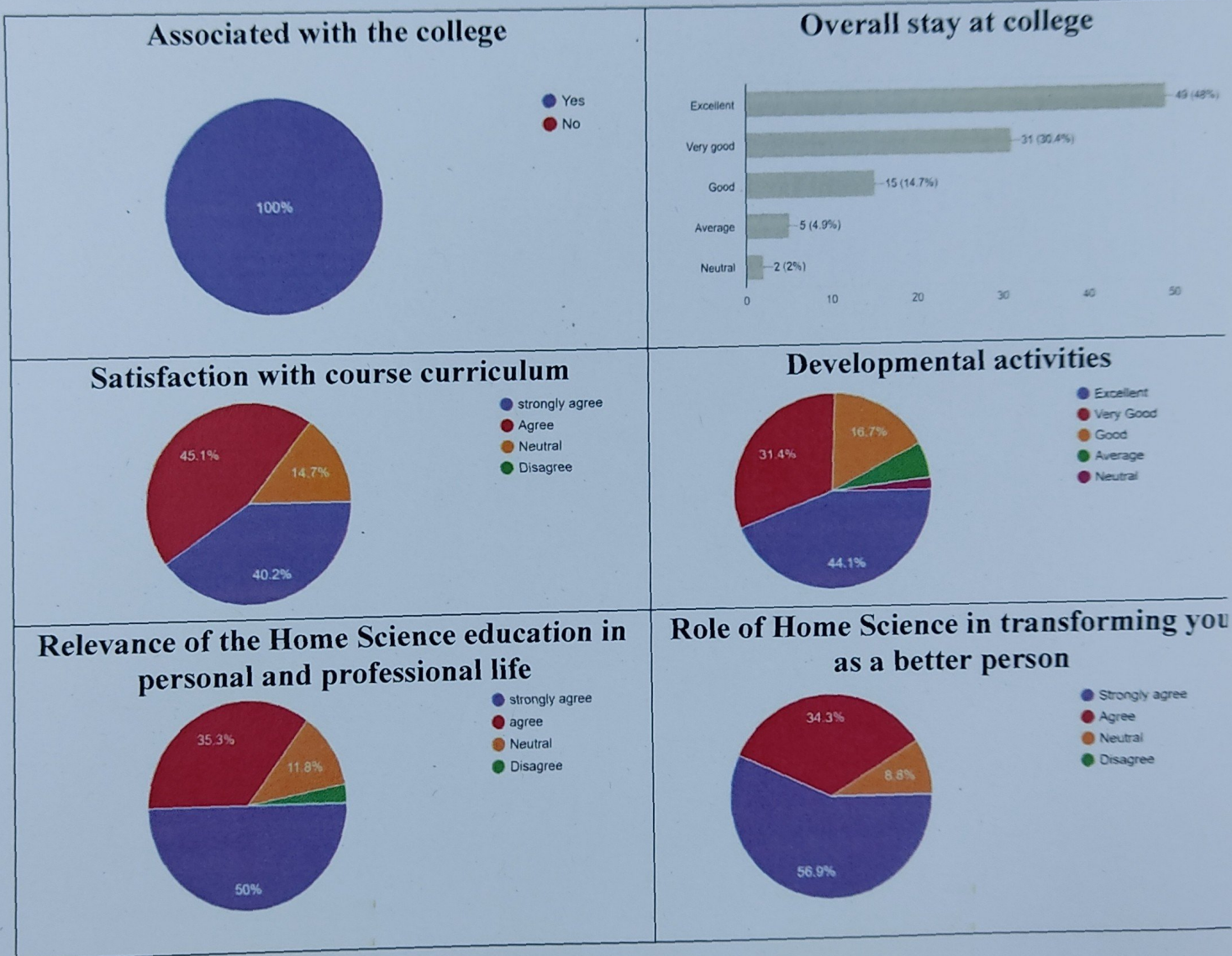


Academic flexibility for changes in Curriculum

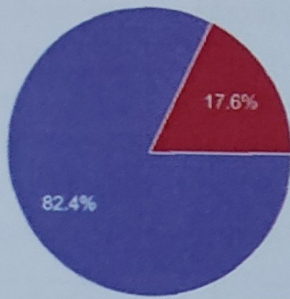


Alumni Feedback Analysis

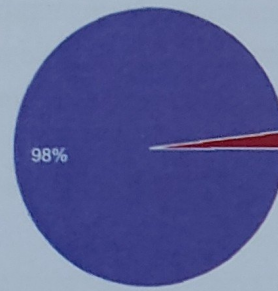


Opportunities provided for startups

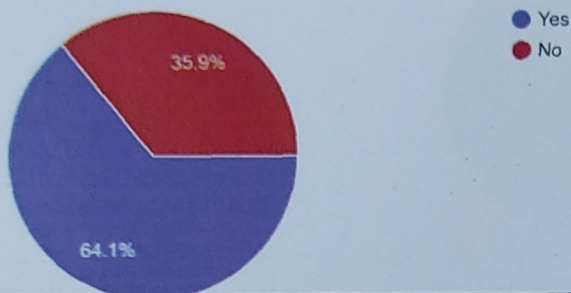

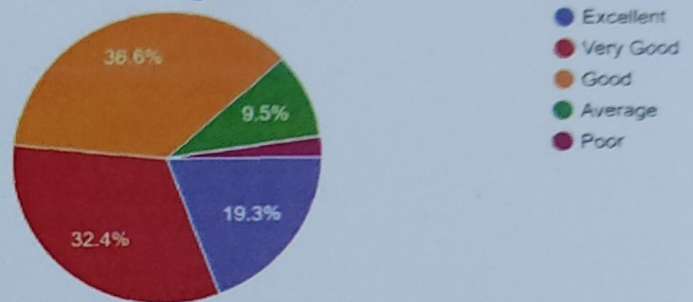
Parents' feedback Analysis

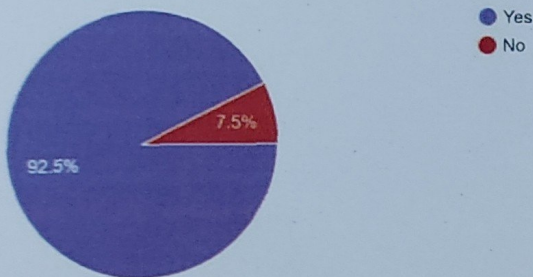

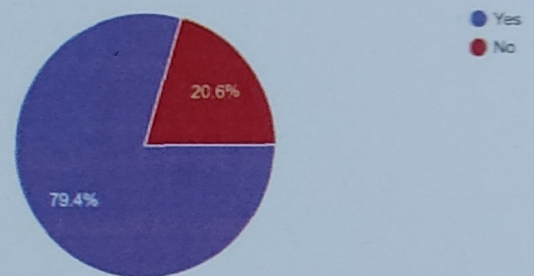
Curricular and Co curricular activities organized by the college



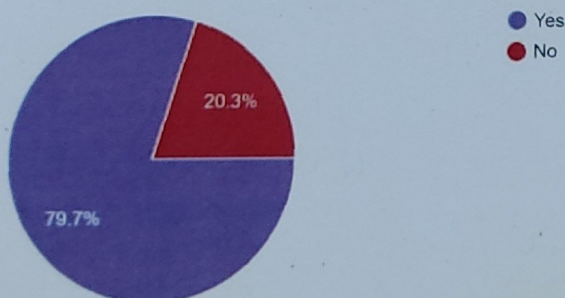
Courses promote entrepreneurial skills and start-ups



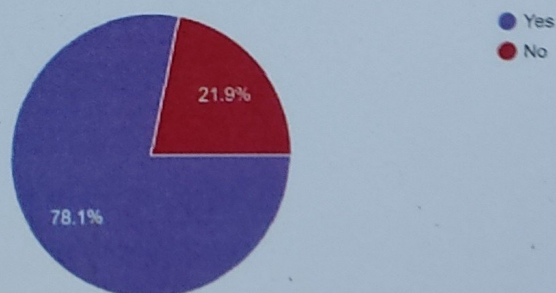
Curriculum makes the students industry ready



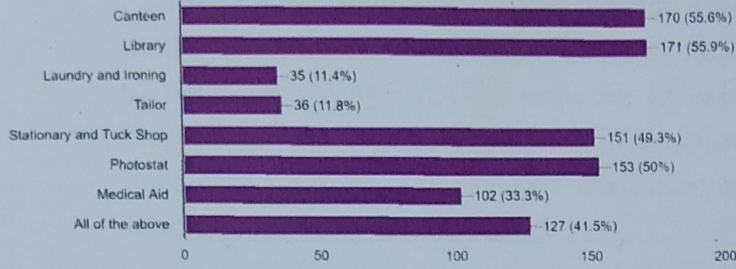
Enough exposure for career orientation



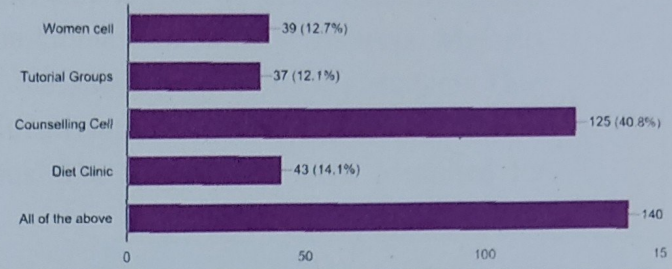

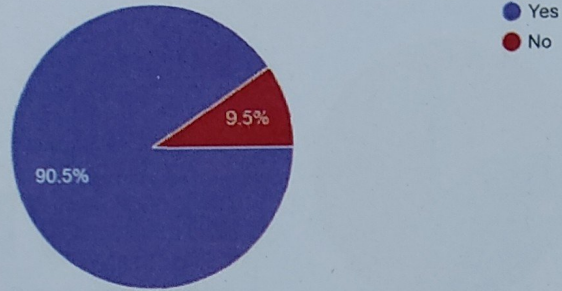

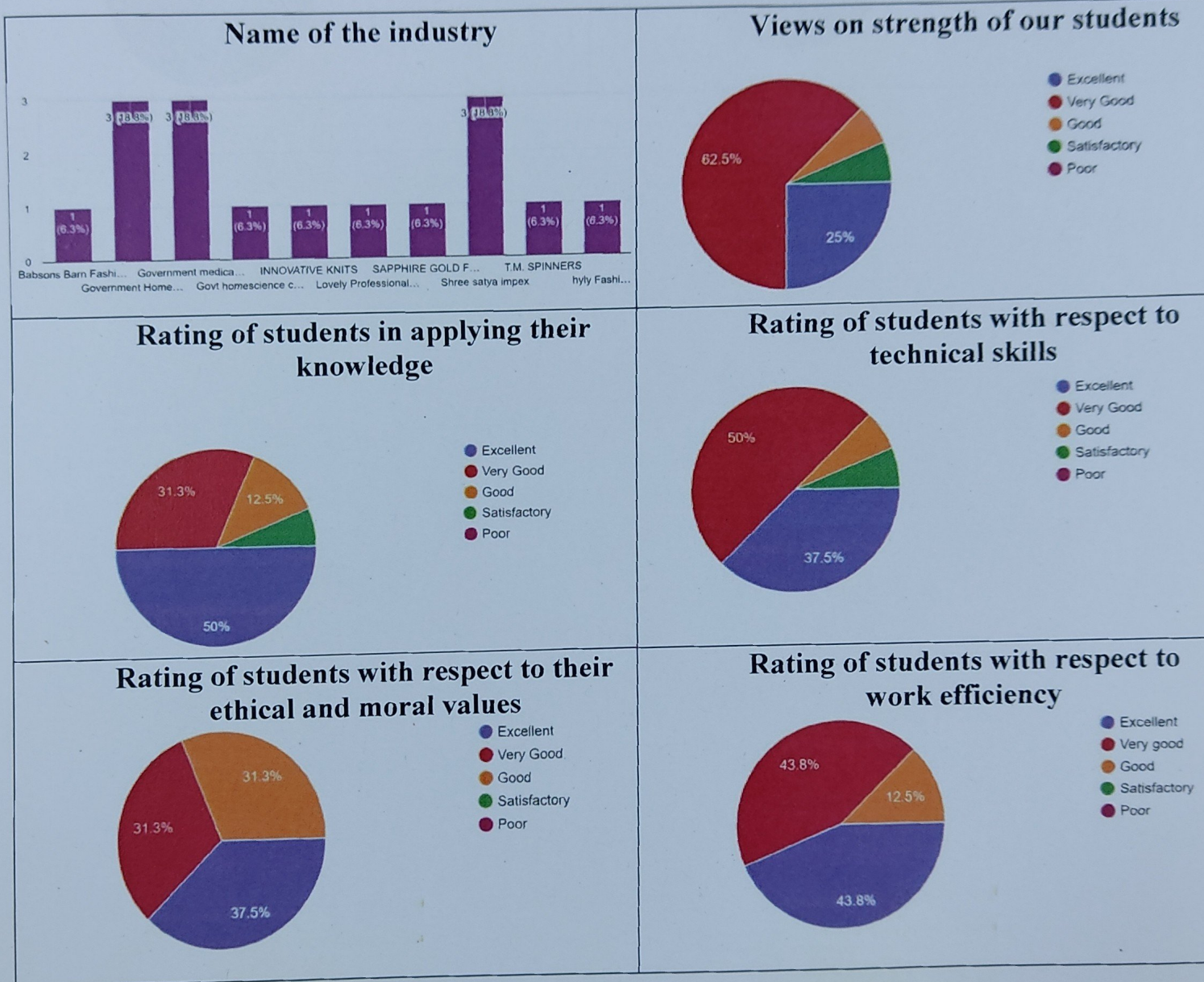

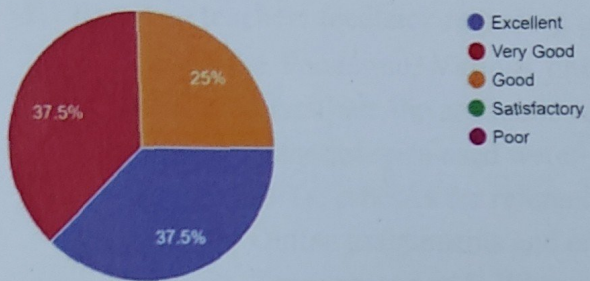


Employers' feedback analysis

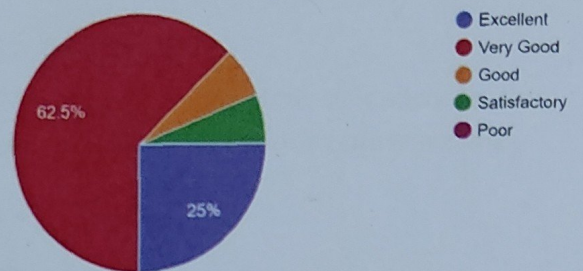

Action Taken Report for Feedback Analysis of 2019-20

Feedback for the session was collected from stakeholders and following actions were taken:

1. Based on teachers feedback regarding up-gradation of e-content
 - During the Pandemic, Various links and sources of e- content were uploaded on the website to facilitate the academic requirement of the students. Various online teaching-learning methodologies used were:-
 - PPTs, e-books for reference as notes
 - Online assignments and online surveys
 - Zoom meetings & WhatsApp video calls for online classes
 - Google meet and classroom were identified as preferred platforms for conduct of both theory and practical classes.
 - WhatsApp interaction with individual students for doubt clearing and revision sessions were undertaken
 - Information sharing with students through telephone calls and exchange of assignments
 - E- curriculum content with PPTs, videos and recorded lectures were provided on the college web site
2. A number of Memorandum of Understanding were signed with various agencies to share technical expertise to provide platform for firsthand experience sharing for students :-
 - The college signed a M.O.U. with Chandigarh Institute of Hotel Management, Sector-42, Chandigarh. The M.O.U. will promote more effective use of each of their resources and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.
 - The college signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Government College of Yoga Education and Health, Sector 23, Chandigarh. The M.O.U. will facilitate the students & staff in terms of health and fitness, yoga and meditation, physiological, psychological, behavioral and spiritual aspect of their health.
 - The college signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Open Eyes Foundation (A Non-Government Organization)
3. Parents, students and alumni stressed that activities and workshops related to skill development and entrepreneurship should be planned more frequently. Keeping in mind following activities were conducted:-
 - The college organized an online workshop on "Psycho Social Support for Covid Pandemic Situation" in collaboration with Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural education, Dept. of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India on May 31, 2021.
 - Home science Alumni and budding entrepreneur conducted a Mandala workshop on April 24, 2021.
 - College organised a live session on October 11, 2020 on Textile Conservation on college YouTube to mark the celebration of the second day of Tex-Style Week. The

key note speakers for the day were Dr. Rohini Arora-Assistant Professor, Guru Gobind Singh College for Women, Punjab University, Chandigarh; Dr. Simmi Bhagat-Associate Professor, Dept. Fabric & Apparel Science, Lady Irwin College, University of Delhi and Ms. Smita Singh- Textile Conservation Consultant, at Textile Heritage Conservation, New Delhi.

- An online workshop cum demonstration session on Painting inspired by Rogan Art was conducted on October 12, 2020. The workshop was conducted and sponsored by Ms. Jaya Duggal, Trained Fevicryl Expert. She demonstrated the technique very patiently and also shared her expertise about the do's and don'ts of the technique.
 - To enhance the entrepreneurial skills of the budding entrepreneurs of the college and to provide marketing platform to the innovative products and services of the college students and Alumni College has received a grant of rupees 1.50 lacs from SIDBI.
4. A number of online activities were conducted keeping in mind the mental and physical well being of students and staff.
- Sensitization & Awareness Campaign on getting vaccinated against Corona by NSS Volunteers was set up from April 11-14, 2021.
 - Poshan Pakhwada was observed in the college from March 14 – 31, wherein a host of online and other activities were conducted to generate awareness on eating healthy and role of herbs and spices in building immunity.
 - An Online awareness session on Drug Abuse and Youth during pandemic was organised by the college on September 9, 2020. The speaker, Dr. Apneet Brar, a homeopathic practitioner and alumni of the college talked about the widespread use and easy availability of drugs especially in Punjab and their manifold usage during the Pandemic as a means to ease stress and anxiety.
5. Online competitions were held with the aim of engaging students' mind in recreational activities and reducing the stress of pandemic which were
- National Level Competition on Sketching of Designer Ethnic Wear for Adolescent Girl was organized on July 15, 2020 to promote traditional wear based on the sketch designing.
 - National level Competition- Making Landscape Accessory and Lighting Fixture was organized on July 20, 2020.
 - International Short Film Making Competition was organized on July 20, 2020 in the college on Train Your Mind to B+ during COVID-19.
 - National Level Competition of creation of utility bag with eco-friendly material was organised on July 27, 2020.
 - National Level Competition of Creation Of Innovative Jewellery was held on August 2, 2020.
 - *Lokrang*, A National Level Competition Of Folk Dance And Folk Song was organized by college, on August 8, 2020. Chandigarh. Dr. Hemraj Chandel, Assistant Professor, RGM Govt Degree College, Himachal Pradesh was the judge of

the Folk Song competition whereas Dr. SmrutiVeghella, Assistant Professor, the M.S. University of Baroda was the judge of the Folk Dance competition.

- The NSS wing of the College organized a National level Inter-College Digital Collage Making Competition On 'AatmaNirbhar Bharat' On 74th Independence Day.
 - Sketching Competition Was organized on the theme 'Sketching of Saree Draping On Fashion Figure' On October 14, 2020.
6. Majority of students also reported that discussion on assignments helped in improving, understanding and also in quality enhancement for the betterment of internal evaluation. Tutorials were regularly conducted to discuss the performance of the students. For giving a wider exposure to the students with respect to extracurricular activities during pandemic, peer learning workshops, webinars, and international competitions were conducted on digital platforms throughout the session for holistic development of students.
- Online Peer Learning and Skill Building Workshop were organized on July 21, 2020 on 'Art of making Home-made chocolates and Donuts'. The workshop was successfully conducted and sponsored by Anupreet Kaur Sobti, a student of B.Sc. Dietetics final year. She also shared her experience in setting up her own startups 'Fantasia de chocolates' and 'Dietaura™'.
 - College in collaboration with startup 'Mommy Baby Kitchen' organized a 2-days live Skill building and entrepreneurial workshop on 'Art of making Waffle and Ice cream'.on July 24, 2020. The workshop was sponsored and conducted by Muskan Agarwal, Founder of Mommy Baby Kitchen.
 - Live Session on Grow through What You Go Through: mental wellbeing session during Covid-19was organized on July 25, 2020. The workshop was successfully conducted and sponsored by Ms. Bhavna Garg, who is an alumna of our college, Motivational Speaker, Life Coach and Human Development Expert. The session was live on facebook and many viewers participated in the session actively.
 - In order to encourage the spirit of entrepreneurship and peer learning, College organized an online workshop cum demonstration session on Ice cream making on October 12, 2020. The workshop was conducted and sponsored by Aanchal Goyal, budding entrepreneur and student of B.Sc. Home Science final year. Aanchal also shared her experience that how she started her own startup 'Delicious Delicacies' which is running successfully with more than 100 followers on Instagram.
7. In sync with the Government's initiative to promote AtmaNirbharta, college started a webinar series from June10-15, 2021 by distinguished Alumni to motivate the budding entrepreneurs of the college. The college boasts of a large number of illustrious alumni who made their alma mater proud by being successful entrepreneurs and making a mark for themselves.
- The first webinar in this series was conducted by alumna Swati Talwar who after completing her M.Sc.in Foods and Nutrition in 2012 successfully launched a chain of 3 diet clinics at different places in U. P.

- The second webinar in this series was conducted by Ms. Namrata on June 11, 2021; pass out student of M.Sc. in Clothing and Textiles (2017) successfully running her own Baby Boutique "Babyrobe" with 62,000 followers on Instagram and Facebook.
- A live peer learning workshop on June 12, 2021 conducted by Ms. Nidhi Bimal, currently a student of M.Sc (Clothing & Textile). She is successfully running her start-up 'The Knot Store' and has done interiors with macramé of Hotel – The Reef, Sector -7, Chandigarh.
- In line up with the ongoing series of live webinars, college organized another session on June 14, 2021 by Dr. Harpreet Kaur, HOD, PG Dept. Of Fashion Designing, Kanya Maha Vidyalaya, Jalandhar. Dr. Harpreet spoke on Career Opportunities in Fashion and highlighted that students are like pure white light when they choose their careers whereas teachers act as facilitators thereby making them aware of the wide scope of Clothing and Textiles.
- To conclude with the series of webinars on June 15, 2021, conducted by esteemed alumni, final webinar in the series was organized on the scope of Interior Design and Management. The webinar was conducted by Ms Rajni, pass out student of 2019-batch and a renowned entrepreneur in the field of Interior Decoration. Renowned with a name of Space Rhythm Interiors as her enterprise, she gave the whole credit of her success to the esteemed institution in achieving such big heights with respect to her career. She highlighted the scope of Interior Decoration & Resource Management and further stressed that the students must be fanatical, determined, skilful and goal-oriented.
- A live session on Mind management with Yoga was organized on June 14, 2021 by Dr. Richa Chopra with over 100 students participating. An illustrious alumni of the college, she is the former founding head of the Dept of Contemplative and behavioral Sciences at Sri Sri University, Cuttack. She is senior Art of Living International faculty, and has travelled across 11 countries transforming lives through the happiness program and other higher level courses.
- To enhance the entrepreneurial skills and to make the students self-employed, Live peer learning workshop on cake baking was organized by Muskan Sharma, a bakery specialist and student of M.Sc. (HDFR) in Home Science college Chandigarh on June 13, 2021. Certified Baker Muskan gave hands on demonstration on baking Pistachio cake on her FB live session. She also discussed tips and tricks of icing and plating on the cake and also satisfied the queries of audience.
- Keeping up with the spirit of entrepreneurship, students of College, put up an exhibition for sale of rakhi items in the swavalambi window on the college campus. The exhibition showcased exquisite rakhis made out of zardozi, hand painted suits, embroidered dupattas and thalis. The exhibition witnessed large footfall and a brisk sale. The swawalambi window provides an opportunity to the students of the college to showcase not just their work but also helps in capacity building and providing a practical exposure to entrepreneurial activities.
- Anjali and Gursimar, budding entrepreneurs and students of B.Sc final year exhibited hand crafted nail art extensions with options of different sizes and colours. This budding

entrepreneur is running her own online startup with the name *Nailsworld by Anjali* with more than 1200 followers and catering to the orders all over India. Such a platform provided boost and motivation to the students to establish their entrepreneurial ventures and earn while they learn.
