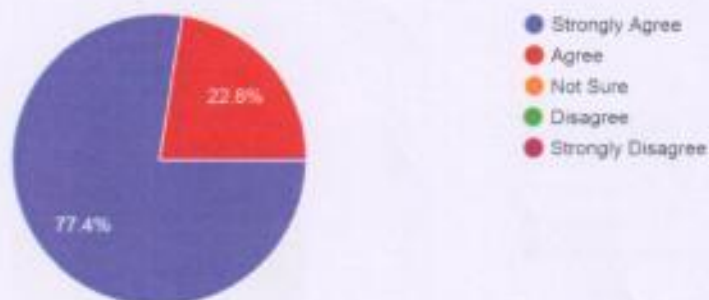

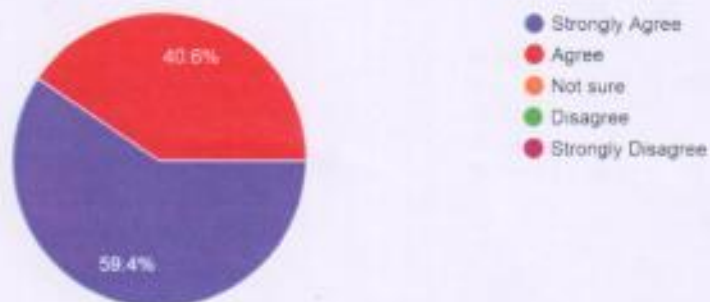
Teachers' Feedback Analysis

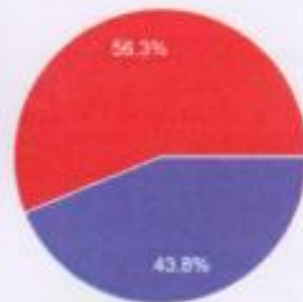
1. The vision and aim of the college is reflected in its functioning.

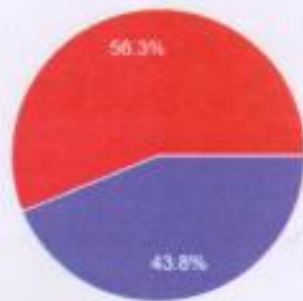

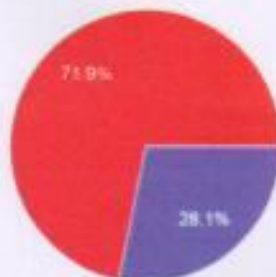

4. Faculty is provided with facilities and encouraged to grow in their research work



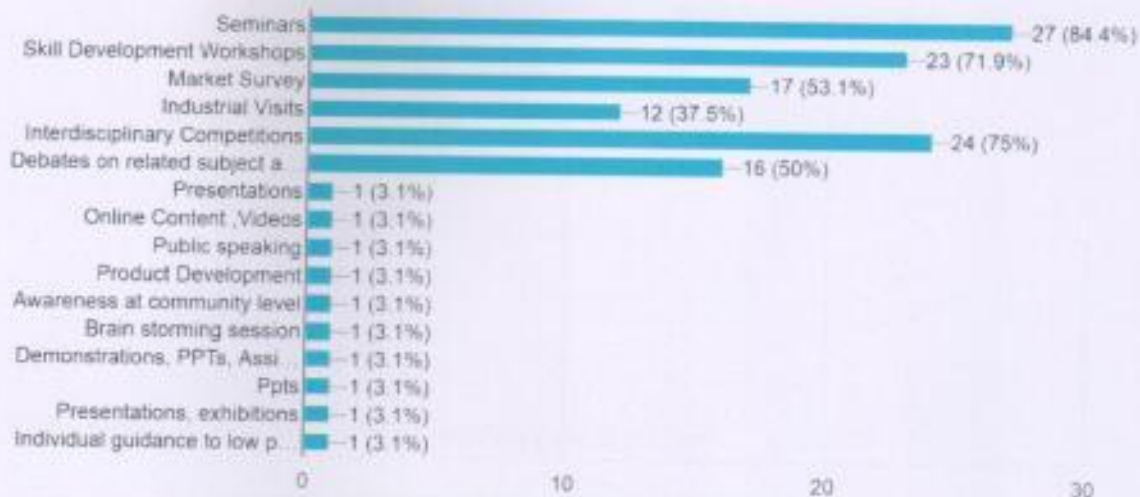

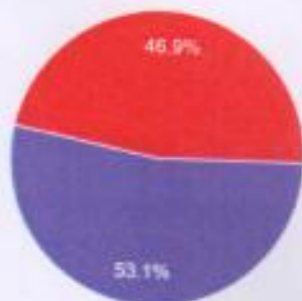

15. Do you feel there is enough academic facility to make changes in syllabi/curriculum



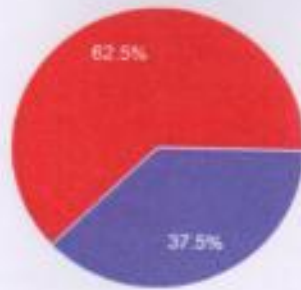

Dept. of Foods and nutrition widened the exposure to students by increasing the number of collaborative agencies of internship.

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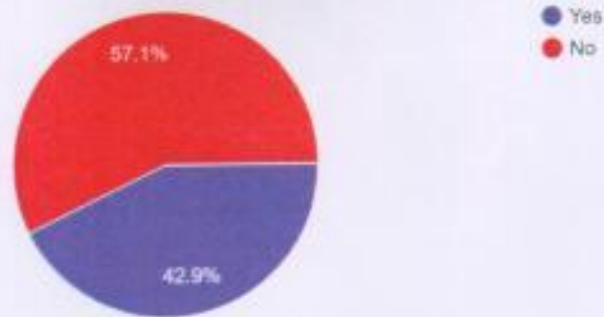
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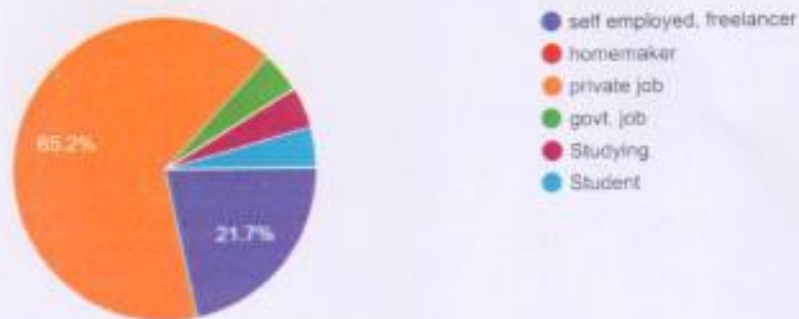
Alumni Feedback analysis

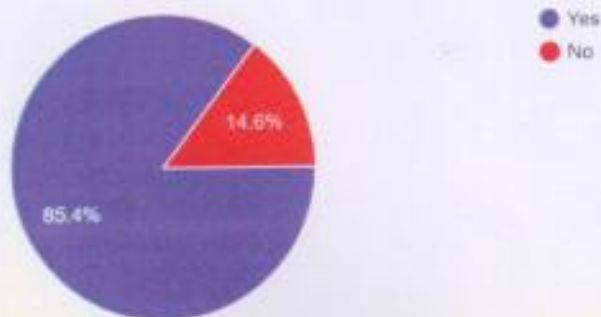
1. Are you currently working?



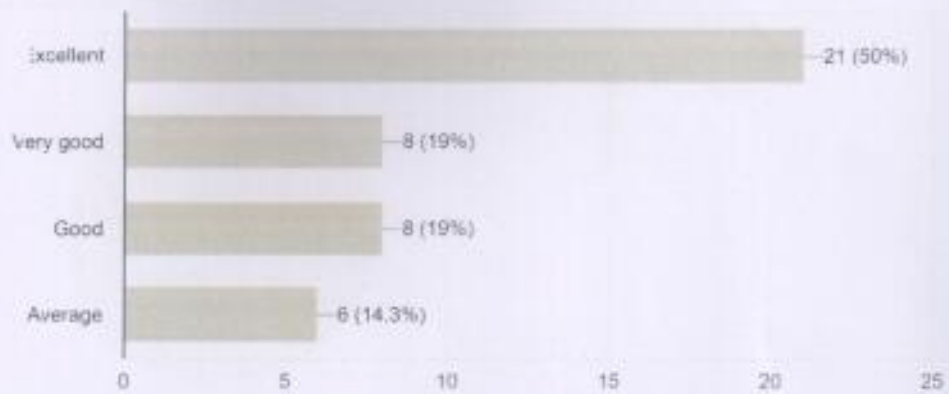
2. If yes, nature of your present job



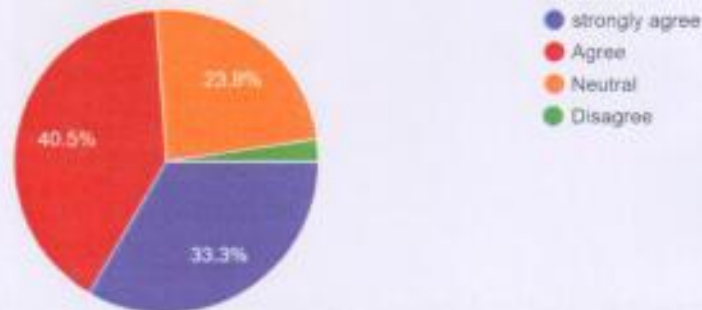
3. Are you aware/ member of the social media platforms of our college- facebook page, Instagram page, you tube channel



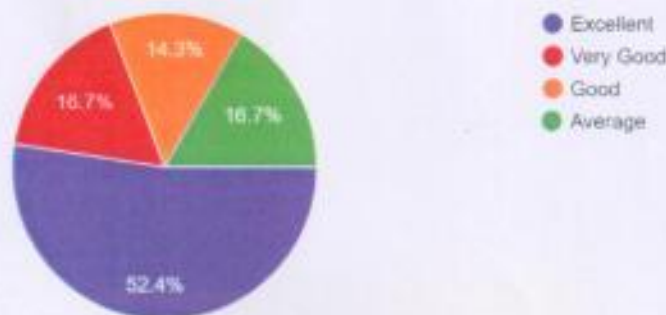
4. How do you rate overall experience at the college?



5. Do you think that course curriculum fulfilled your expectations



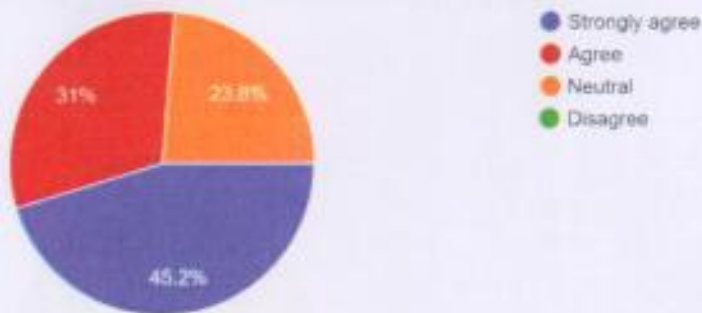
6. How do you rate the various activities organised by the college for overall development?



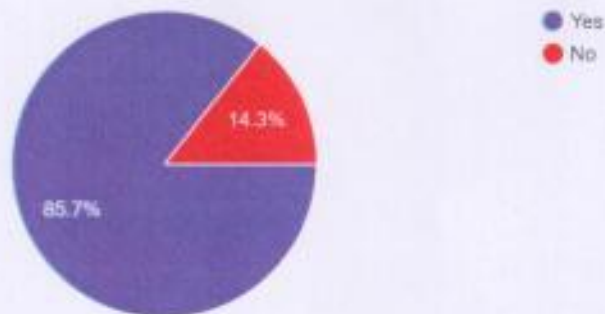
7. Is the education imparted at the college useful, relevant and empowered you at personal and professional front?



8. Do you think that being the student of home science really transformed you as a better person?



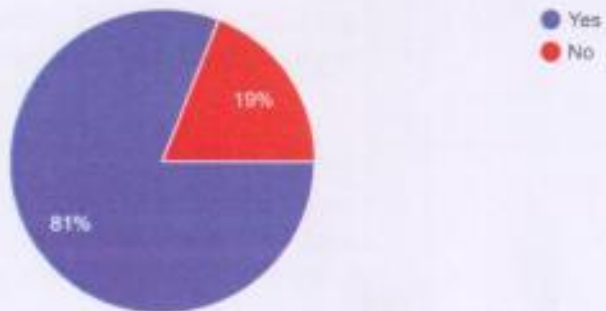

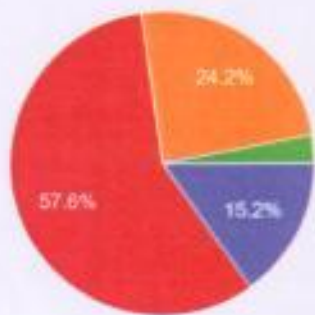

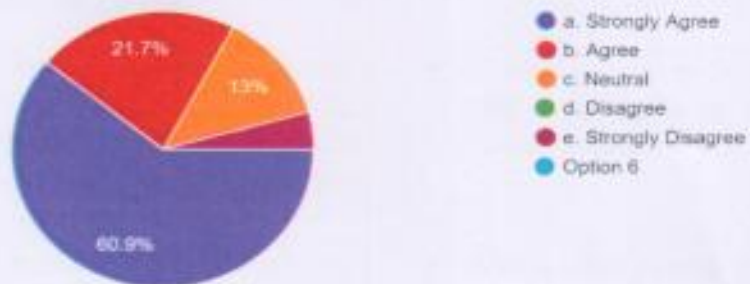
