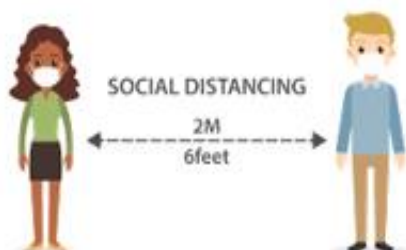

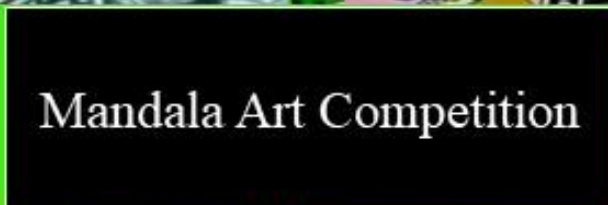

One can ultimately cause death if appropriate blood requirement is not fulfilled immediately. Thus, blood donation is a life saving procedure. There isn't much that is more essential to exercise than your blood. Highest the oxygenated blood, more you excrete from your body.

Why donate blood?
• Blood Donation is highly advantageous for your body as the lost cells due to blood depletion forces the body to produce new cells, thereby fortifying the entire body system.
• It is a responsible gesture towards the affected person and the society at large.
• A great step to revitalize your body.
• These different components are provided by a single donation, thus three different people may be helped by it.
• Prior to donating blood, professionals determine a number of factors such as levels of iron, haemoglobin, cholesterol, etc. in the body. This gives a clear idea of the condition of the person.

Thus, blood donation initiates a preliminary health check-up.
• It fulfills the demand of the blood banks and thus reduces the waiting of time when blood is needed in case of emergency.
• "Eligible to donate blood?"
• You can donate blood if you are 18-67 years of age (as per WHO).
• One must weigh about 50 kgs.
• You must be in a sound health to donate blood. You cannot donate blood if you suffer from disorders such as cardiac arrest, epilepsy, diabetes, hypertension or have undergone treatment for malaria within the last three months.
• You cannot donate if you have cold, flu, sore throat, cold sore or any other infection.
• Threshold haemoglobin levels for females must be 12 g/dl while that for males must be 13 g/dl.
• On this World Blood Donor Day (June 14), now awareness about donating blood and thank many who take this step forward to

save others. Do not forget to be sometimes blessing through this life-saving act of donating blood.

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PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Government Home Science College is a pioneer and professional institute of Home Science in the country. Since its inception in 1961, it has grown into an excellent educational centre, satisfying the professional and specialized needs of the contemporary woman. The former Chief Minister of undivided Punjab, Late Sardar Partap Singh Kairon, was instrumental in establishing this prestigious institute which has undergone a long successful journey of expansion in the field of Home Science. Starting with a three-year degree course in B.Sc. Home Science, it expanded its horizons in the true sense by offering a revamped undergraduate programme by gearing it towards specialization to make it more skill and career oriented. The need based changes have been introduced in five undergraduate specializations namely Apparel and Textile Design; Dietetics; Human Development and Family Relations; Interior Design and Resource Management and B.Sc. Home Science Composite. The college also offers an undergraduate degree course in Fashion Designing and Master's degree courses in Clothing and Textiles, Foods and Nutrition and Human Development and Family Relations. The need based Postgraduate Diplomas in Fashion Designing, Nutrition and Dietetics and Child Guidance and Family Counselling are also other options after graduation. Ph.D. in Home Science is also offered with course work.

Home Science is a unique field of knowledge. Its inter disciplinary approach in synthesizing knowledge drawn from physical and biological sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities has enriched its educational programmes. It caters to the present day requirements of education in order to meet the rapidly changing demands of family life and the multiple roles that woman has to play in home as well as professional life. The different areas of specialization also concentrate on providing suitable training to the students for various job opportunities. The trained graduates and postgraduates are absorbed in hospitals, industrial units, hotel industries, and health fitness clubs. They can also work as teachers, counselors, sales managers, apparel & interior designers, consultants and field workers in extension education and community development programmes. Thus, Home Science empowers woman at personal, professional, social, entrepreneurial and economic fronts.

The College runs a laboratory Nursery School, Chaitanya, with 50 students on rolls, under the department of Human Development and Family Relations, to impart practical training to its students. The other major departments of Home Science are also having well equipped state of art laboratories.

Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) under (MHRD, Govt. of India) is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, launched in 2013 which aims at providing strategic funding to eligible state higher educational institutions. This grant



provided our college with two crores, of which 70 lacs were spent on construction, 70 lacs on renovation/upgrading of existing facilities, and 60 lacs on the purchase of new equipment. A Multimedia Research Block has been constructed where Post Graduate and Doctorate students will interact and disseminate knowledge. Seminars and workshops for these classes will also be held here. The renovation included upgrades to the library, committee room, pantry, *e-Pathshala*, conference room, and the flooring of the first and second floor circulation areas. The process of getting the kitchen in the hostel mess renovated and making it modular has already been initiated under this grant. RUSA has also facilitated the procurement of new equipment for the college. Teaching aids, digital podium, computers, printers, swings for the nursery school (under HDFR department), scanners and digital teaching system have been procured to provide impetus to the teaching learning process. A digital notice board was purchased to disseminate important information to staff and students in the shortest possible way. The procurement of interactive flat panel display with stand and vertical signage is going to be of immense help in smart classrooms, conference rooms, auditoriums for conducting workshops and seminars. They present content clearly and provide wide viewing angles to view vital information accurately. Following the guidelines of the Central Government scheme of 'Fit India', outdoor gym equipment was purchased and installed on the college grounds. Giving impetus to *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan* sanitary vending and destroyer machines along with dust bins were purchased.

The beautiful spacious college and hostel buildings offer a peaceful, serene yet stimulating environment to the students. The campus is endowed with well-manicured lawns, spacious lecture theatres, smart class rooms and laboratories which makes the workplace more conducive and eco-friendly for the teachers as well as students. The college has rich indoor and outdoor sports and fitness facilities which cater to students of all aptitudes and abilities. The faculty comprises of highly qualified and experienced members, instrumental in imparting a high standard of education to its students. The faculty also participates in national and international conferences, seminars and workshops. They are also contributing in various technical and professional bodies related to Home Science.

In anticipation of the changing environment and also the changing skill sets of professionals in modern industries, the curriculum has been revised to make it more relevant, holistic, contextual and specialized. The college offers facilities for academic excellence, cultural enrichment and physical fitness of the students to build a multifaceted personality and prepares them to face the challenges that lie ahead. The institute aims to prepare young girls into skilled human resource with rich moral and social values who can give their best for the national development.

Over the years, the college has built up great credibility and gained recognition as a premier institute. National Institution Ranking Framework (NIRF) has evaluated the college on the basis of Teaching Learning and Resources (TLR), Research and Professional Practice (RP), Graduation Outcome (GO), Outreach and Inclusivity (OI), Perception. The college is proud to attain 86th rank and 51.28 score points in the college category by NIRF, MHRD 2020.

All candidates will be admitted in B.Sc. Home Science at the time of admission to Semester I and Semester I to IV will be common to all. Specializations will be allotted during Semester IV and implemented in Semester V on the basis of merit drawn up with the following formula -**

50% of aggregate marks of 10+2 + 50% of cumulative aggregate marks of University examinations of B.Sc. Home Science Semester I and Semester II.



Reservation of Seats for Undergraduate and Post Graduate Courses - Semester I

- **M.Sc. Home Science Human Development and Family Relations-Semester- I**



B.Sc.(Hons.) Home Science, B.Sc. Home Science from Panjab University with at least 50% aggregate marks/any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to B.Sc. Home Science of Panjab University.

- **P.G. Diploma in Child Guidance and Family Counselling - Semester I**
Any graduation from Panjab University /any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to graduation, with atleast 50% aggregate marks.
- **P.G. Diploma in Fashion Designing - Semester I**
Any graduation from Panjab University /any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to graduation, with atleast 50% aggregate marks.
- **P.G. Diploma in Nutrition and Dietetics - Semester I**
B.Sc. Home Science from Panjab University /any other examination equivalent to B.Sc. Home Science, recognized by Panjab University: B.Sc. Home Science/B.Sc. Foreign Students

All foreign students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from Deputy Registrar (General) Panjab University, Chandigarh. The admission of the foreign students to the College would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students. The eligibility application form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to the College.

- Last date of applying for UG Courses 20th August, 2021 (Friday) and for PG Courses 31st August, 2021 (Tuesday).

Step 1: Online Registration

1. Click on the link **e-प्रवेश (2021-2022)** on the DHE website www.dhe.chd.gov.in
2. Click on **Sign Up** to register on website by filling Email ID, Mobile Number (WhatsApp) and Name (**Spellings of Name must be same as in Class-X marks sheet/certificate**).
3. **Mobile Number** will be the Login ID and Password will be sent to the candidate's registered mobile number through SMS.
4. Candidate can change the password, if he/she desires.
5. Candidate will be able to Login to the admission portal by using the password in all future visits to this portal.
6. Pay **Registration Fee of Rs. 70/- online to proceed further to fill application form**. Note down the transaction number generated.
7. Payment verification will take maximum upto 24 hours.

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Hostel Admission

RESERVATION POLICY

Reservation of seats in different categories viz, Sports, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Physically Challenged Persons, Wards of Freedom Fighters and Wards of Defence and Paramilitary Personnel will be made in accordance with the rules and instructions framed by the Chandigarh Administration, whereas in case of Wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/ Kashmiri Hindu Families, Victims of November 1984 Riots and Terrorism, Kargil Martyrs, Single Girl Child/ One out of Two Girl Children, Cancer/ AIDS/ Thalassaemia, Rural Area Students, Border Area Students, Excellence in Youth Festival and Economically Weaker Section will be made as per instructions issued by Panjab University, Chandigarh from time to time.

Any student who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which she applies for admission, maintaining her internal seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in that category. In such a case, the student will get the benefit in one category of her choice.

NOTE:

1. All the affiliated colleges of Chandigarh (U.T.) shall follow the reservation policy of Union Territory Administration.
2. All affiliated colleges of Punjab State shall follow the reservation policy of the Punjab Government.

General Information:

- a. Every candidate applying for admission against reserved seats, belonging to any category, could also be considered for admission against the open seats of the respective quota, as per her merit. Depending on her preference for a college/course, **a candidate may take admission against her reserved category or against the open category.**
- b. Any candidate who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which he/she applies for admission, maintaining her internal seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in that category. In such a case, the candidate will get the benefit in one category of her choice.
- c. In case, seats belonging to any reserved category (except for additional seats) remain unfilled for want of eligible candidates, the same may be filled from amongst open category candidates belonging to the same quota.

As per letter no. 19/1/93/IH (3) 5311 dated 18th March, 1999 from Home Secretary, Chandigarh Administration, the following policy shall be followed w.r.t. reservation of seats:

60% seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institution (after excluding Sports reservation) will be filled up from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from schools/colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory, Chandigarh, as regular students of the said school/college, which will be termed as **UT POOL**. The **remaining 40% seats (after excluding Sports reservation)** will be filled from amongst students, who pass their qualifying examinations from institutions other than those located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh or otherwise, which will be termed as **GENERAL POOL**.



NOTE:

I) UT Pool Candidates: Those who have passed lower qualifying examination as regular candidates from schools and colleges in UT, Chandigarh.

ii) General Pool Candidates: Those who have passed lower qualifying examination from schools and colleges outside UT, Chandigarh.

Amendment, if any, in the reservation policy of Chandigarh Administration/ Panjab University, Chandigarh will be followed up to the date of admission for each course.

Reserved Seats: Criteria and Documents Required

A. Reservation for Sports

This will be as per rules and regulations of Sports Department of the Chandigarh Administration vide Home Secretary letter no. 8493, dated 05-05-2003 (endorsed vide letter no. 2081 dated 06.04.2018 from the Sports Department, Chandigarh Administration). Implementation of the policy will be as under:

- i. **2% of the total number of seats in each course shall be filled up by sportsmen/sportswomen. These 2% seats shall be reserved in each course in the institution on the basis of total intake of each course. Fraction of 0.5 or above shall be rounded off to the next higher number. This category shall not be divided into UT pool/General pool. The inter merit of the candidates seeking admission in any course in the Reserved Category of sports shall be determined only on the basis of their merit in sports as per grading criteria mentioned. In case any of the seats in the sports category in any branch remains vacant, the same shall be thrown open to the candidates of General Category. This policy is for the players of Chandigarh only.**
- ii. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category of students:
 - a. **Those who pass their qualifying examination from Schools/Colleges, recognized by the Chandigarh Administration in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as regular students for at least two years before applying for Graduation Certificate will be given admission subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh State/Schools etc. in the National / other recognized tournaments.**
 - b. Where the Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other States/U.T.'s on reciprocal basis, to give benefit of reservation to admission in sports category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per the existing policy of the Chandigarh Administration.
 - c. Countersigning of the Graduation Certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that countersigned certificates will be graded as per the policy of the Chandigarh Administration.
- iii. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following:
 - a. If her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in Inter-College/Inter-University tournaments.
 - a. If her achievement in sports relates to her activity in any of the three years preceding the year of admission. (For example, for admission in the year 2021-2022, the Achievements shall not be prior to April, 2018).



b. Gradation Certificate will not be meant for employment purposes.

- iv. Director, Sports, Chandigarh Administration, or his nominee, not below the rank of Joint Director, Sports will issue the certificate, and also have the authority to cancel any certificate at any time if it is found to have been issued on false/incorrect/concealed information or record.

NOTE: The merit of certificates shall be graded as A, B, C, D in the descending order. Details of these grades are available with the admission committees of all the colleges.

B. Reservation for Scheduled Caste

15% of seats in each pool will be filled from the candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste. A candidate seeking admission under SC reserved category has to submit her **caste certificate from the competent authority**. The admission of SC candidates will be subject to subsequent verification of their caste certificate.

(The Specimen of the certificate is given at the end of the Prospectus)

C. Reservation for Scheduled Tribe

7.5% of seats in GENERAL pool will be filled from the candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribe. A candidate seeking admission under ST reserved category has to submit her **caste certificate from the competent authority**. The admission of ST candidates will be subject to subsequent verification of their tribe certificate.

(The Specimen of the certificate is given at the end of the Prospectus)

D. Reservation for Differently Abled/ Physically Challenged Persons

- All government institutions of higher education and other higher education institutions receiving aid from the government shall reserve not less than **5% of seats in each pool** for persons with benchmark disabilities.
- The Physically Challenged Student will be required to furnish a **medical certificate** issued by the Principal Medical Officer of his concerned district/Civil Surgeon of Chandigarh, indicating percentage of disability, whether he/she is otherwise able to pursue his / her studies, name of the disease/handicap, whether the handicap is temporary or permanent; and



whether the handicap is progressively degenerative.

- **5% marks concession will be given to physically handicapped persons in the minimum eligibility criteria for a course subject to minimum disability of 40%, provided they have obtained minimum pass marks prescribed by regulations.**

(Amendment in PU calendar Vol I 2007 chapter VIII (D) Regulation 29.3 approved by Senate PU on 29-03-2008)

Candidates with a temporary handicap will not be considered against the reserved seats for the physically challenged. Where the certificate is issued by any authority other than the Principal Medical Officer of Chandigarh, the concerned Head of the institution shall refer the candidate to the Principal Medical Officer, Chandigarh and shall admit the candidate only after confirmation from the PMO, Chandigarh.

All candidates seeking admission, except in the case of Chandigarh Medical College and Punjab Engineering College (where the existing practice shall continue), will furnish an undertaking, as under, along with their application form.

I certify that I have no such physical handicap/disability which would hinder the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission. If, at a later stage, it is found that I have a physical handicap/disability which hinders the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission, then my admission will be liable to be cancelled.

In case of any doubt in interpretation of any clause of these instructions, the matter shall be referred to the Chandigarh Administration whose decision shall be final.

NOTE: Detailed information is available at Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India website: www.socialjustice.nic.in as per PART-II Section 3, subsection (i) Notification as amended on 30th December, 2009 for persons with disability (Equal Opportunities and full participation Rules, 1996).

E. Reservation for Wards of Freedom Fighters

- **2% seats in each pool will be filled from the category of children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters.**
- **A certificate issued by the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district will have to be attached with the admission form.**

F. Reservation for Wards of Defence/ Para-Military Personnel

As per the letter no. 666-DHE-UT-AD.II26(43)2016PF/1788 dated 14/07/2021 from Directorate of Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration:

- **5% of seats in UT pool will be filled from the category of Wards of Defence/ Para-Military Personnel.**

The admission of the candidates against the reserved seats under this category will be made on the basis of merit list prepared from the following categories of the candidates, in the order of precedence **(As per Letter No. F.No.6(1)/2017/D(Res.II) dated 21st May, 2018 from Government of India, Ministry of Defence, Department of Ex-Servicemen Welfare):**

As conveyed vide letter no. D.O. No. F 1-13/2010 CPP-II dated 19th March 2015 from University Grants Commission and letter No. F. No. 3-1/2012-NER dated 12th March 2015 from Govt. of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi with regard to the concession to the Kashmiri migrant for admission in Higher Education which are read as under:

- i. Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to **10%** subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- ii. Increase in intake capacity upto **5% course-wise**
- iii. Reservation of at least **One (01) seat** in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
- iv. Waving off domicile requirements.

Documents required:

- A candidate seeking admission against this seat is required to produce a certificate from an authorized Government Officer (i.e. Relief Commissioner/ Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district/area) to the effect that the candidate is a ward of Kashmiri displaced



person.

- Proof of current residence (such as Ration Card/Photo Identity Card issued by the Election Commissioner/ Driving License/ Aadhaar Card/ Passport etc.)

H. Reservation for Victims of November 1984 riots and Terrorism

As per the Circular No. 85581-85781 dated 25/05/2017 and Letter No. Misc/A-1/1301-1600 dated 09/04/2021 from Deputy Registrar (Colleges), Panjab University, Chandigarh:

- i. **2% of total seats in each course** is reserved for sons/ daughters/ husband/ wife/ brothers/ sisters of persons killed/ incapacitated in November 1984 riots and of persons killed/ incapacitated terrorist violence in Punjab and Chandigarh.
- ii. A **certificate from the District Magistrate** to this effect must be submitted by the candidate.
- iii. **Migration card alone is inadequate.**

I. Reservation for Wards of Permanently Disabled and Martyrs of Kargil War

As per Letter No. Misc./A-1/28522-28821 dated 09/07/2021 received from the Deputy Registrar (Colleges), Panjab University, Chandigarh, concession be given for admission to various courses in Educational Institutions for academic session 2021-2022 for those wards of martyrs/permanently disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of Kargil war who have a **valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this effect and the same be entered in the pension Book of the family:**

- i. **Reservation of 1% seats with minimum of One (01) seat** in the Departments and affiliated colleges except in partially financed/self-financing courses.
- ii. **Exemption of Fee.**
- iii. **Exemption of Hostel Fee.**

J. Reservation for Single Girl Child/ One Girl Child out of the only Two Girl Children

As per Circular No. Misc/A-6/2404 dated 14/03/2018 and Letter No. Misc/A-1/1601-1900 dated 09/04/2021 from the Deputy Registrar (Colleges) Panjab University, Chandigarh.

- i. **Two (02) additional seats per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four (04)** out of the two girl children from the session 2015-16 are created for admission to a given course in Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centers and its affiliated Colleges, provided they are otherwise eligible. **The Additional seats will be only for those girl children who are either a single girl child or one amongst the only two girl children with no male child. The additional seat will be available to only one of the two girl children of a couple.**
- ii. **An undertaking** is to be obtained from the parents of the girl children declaring therein that the benefit of this scheme is being claimed for only one girl child out of the two girl children and the parents shall not claim the same for the 2nd girl child elsewhere in future.

K. Reservation for Cancer/Aids/Thalassemia Patients

As per Circular No. Misc/A-6/2404 dated 14/03/2018 and Letter No. Misc/A-1/1601-1900 dated 09/04/2021 from the Deputy Registrar (Colleges) Panjab University, Chandigarh.

- i. **One (01) additional seat each** for the candidate suffering from Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia has been allowed for admission in each course in Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centres and its affiliated colleges, subject to the condition that the candidate seeking admission under each of these categories is otherwise eligible.
- ii. The claimant candidate will have to submit a **certificate as a proof from the National Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS etc.** in support of her claims.

NOTE: The benefit of additional seats under the aforesaid categories will not be admissible to the students seeking admission in the courses falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE.

L. Reservation for Rural Area Students

As per Circular No. 15850-16050 dated 06/07/2018 and Letter No. Misc/A-1/1000-1300 dated 09/04/2021 from the Deputy Registrar (Colleges), Panjab University Chandigarh:

- i. **Two (02) additional seats** for only those candidates will be considered in this category, who have passed their Matriculation and 10+2 Examination from those rural schools that do not fall in the area of Municipal Corporation/Municipal Committee/Small Town/Notified Area/Cantonment Area.
- ii. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a **certificate from the D.E.O./Principal** of the concerned institute of the area certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed the Matriculation and 10+2 examinations, falls within the aforesaid Rural Area.

M. Reservation for Border Area Students

As per Circular No. 15850-16050 dated 06/07/2018 and Letter No. Misc/A-1/1000-1300 dated 09/04/2021 from the Deputy Registrar (Colleges), Panjab University Chandigarh:

- i. **One (01) additional seat** over and above the sanctioned seats has been reserved for Border Area Students.
- ii. The Border Area students shall mean those candidates who have passed their matriculation examination from the school situated in border area and 10+2 examination from a school situated in any other area within 20 kilometres from the International Border.



- iii. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce **a certificate from the Tehsildar or the Principal/ Headmaster/ Head of the School** certifying that the Schools from where the candidate has passed the matriculation, falls within the aforesaid Border Area.

N. Reservation for Excellence in Youth Festival

As per letter no PU/DYW/1010-1200 Dated 27.05.2016, approved by the Syndicate, in all the teaching courses (except the courses governed by AICTE/NCTE/BCI/MCI/DCI etc.) being run in Panjab University Campus including Constituent Colleges/ Regional Centres/ Affiliated Colleges:

- i. **One (01) additional seat per unit** will be reserved for those candidates who have excelled and outperformed in the Youth Festivals.
 - ii. The candidates availing the aforesaid weightage must fulfill the eligibility condition for admission to the particular course.
 - iii. For those courses to which admission is to be done on the basis of entrance test, the candidate must have passed the entrance test. The selection of such candidates for admission to various courses at PU Campus/ Regional Centres/ Constituent Colleges/ Affiliated Colleges will be made by the respective admission committees.
 - iv. For recommending admission on the basis of youth festival participation, admission criterion will be fixed on the basis of merit as mentioned below and upon the verification of the original certificates of those candidates, who:
 - have **presented an item in an International Cultural Festival** approved by Punjab Govt. /Govt. of India /Panjab University.
 - have **got distinction in All India National Inter University Youth Festival** organized by AIU/Govt. of India.
 - have **got distinction in North Zone Inter University Youth Festival** organized by AIU.
 - have **secured First/Second/Third position in Inter University Youth Festival** organized by Govt. of Punjab / any State or Central University.
 - have **secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Inter Zonal Festival.**
 - have **secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Zonal Festival.**
 - have **secured First/Second/Third position in state level competition of State School Education Board** of Punjab/Haryana/HP/or CBSE/ICSE or any other recognized board.
- Category A is considered as higher category followed by B, C onwards.
- Preference will be given to the candidate/s who have represented Panjab University, Chandigarh in A, B, C or D category.
- In case of two or more candidate having equal position at equal level:
- a. Position secured in an individual item shall be rated higher than position secured as a team member.
 - b. The eligibility of the candidate for participation in University Youth Festivals, in future, may also be considered.
 - c. Academic record will be considered in case of tie between two or more candidates.

In case of any ambiguity, the related certificates shall be verified from the Department of Youth



Welfare, Panjab University through the concerned Chairperson/Principal/Head etc. The candidate/s admitted on the basis of Youth Festival additional quota seats shall have to give an assurance to the University authorities that during the duration of the course the candidate will participate in the activities associated with her item and will not create any kind of indiscipline. The admission committee will assess the participation of the candidate and in case the candidate does not fulfill the requirements, his admission may be cancelled. However, exemption can be given because of a special reason like sickness or any other unavoidable reason in inter varsity Youth Festivals, National Festivals and International Festivals.

O. Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections(EWSs)

As per Letter no. 239-DHE-UT-AD.II-26(11)2000-3 dated 24-05-2019 received from Director Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration:

- i. The persons belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) from all over India would get benefit of **10% reservation** over and above the sanctioned intake for Admission in the Educational/ Technical/ Medical Institutions of Union Territory, Chandigarh.
- ii. Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose family has **gross annual income below Rs. 8 lakhs** are to be identified as EWSs for the benefit of reservation. Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWSs, irrespective of the family income:
 - a. 5 acres of Agricultural Land and above;
 - b. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - c. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - d. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- iii. The income and assets of the families as mentioned above would be required to be certified by an officer **not below the rank of Tehsildar** in the States/UTs.

iii. 'C' Certificate: 3% of obtained Marks

A candidate can claim weightage in one or more categories given above. However, the total weightage allowed shall not exceed **9% of the normalized marks** obtained in the qualifying examination. These weightages shall not be used for determining eligibility for admission as prescribed by the Panjab University under its regulations.

Note:

1. The student/s belonging to the above categories will also be considered in the general category according to her merit. If admitted on the basis of her merit in the general category, she will not be counted towards the seats reserved for the categories concerned.
2. Rules of Reservation policy existing at the time of admission will be applicable.

10. Delay in conduct of examinations or declaration of results beyond that specified in the academic calendar.
11. On provision of student amenities as may have been promised or required to be provided by the institutions.
12. Denial of quality education as promised at the time of admission or required to be provided.
13. Non transparent or unfair evaluation practices.

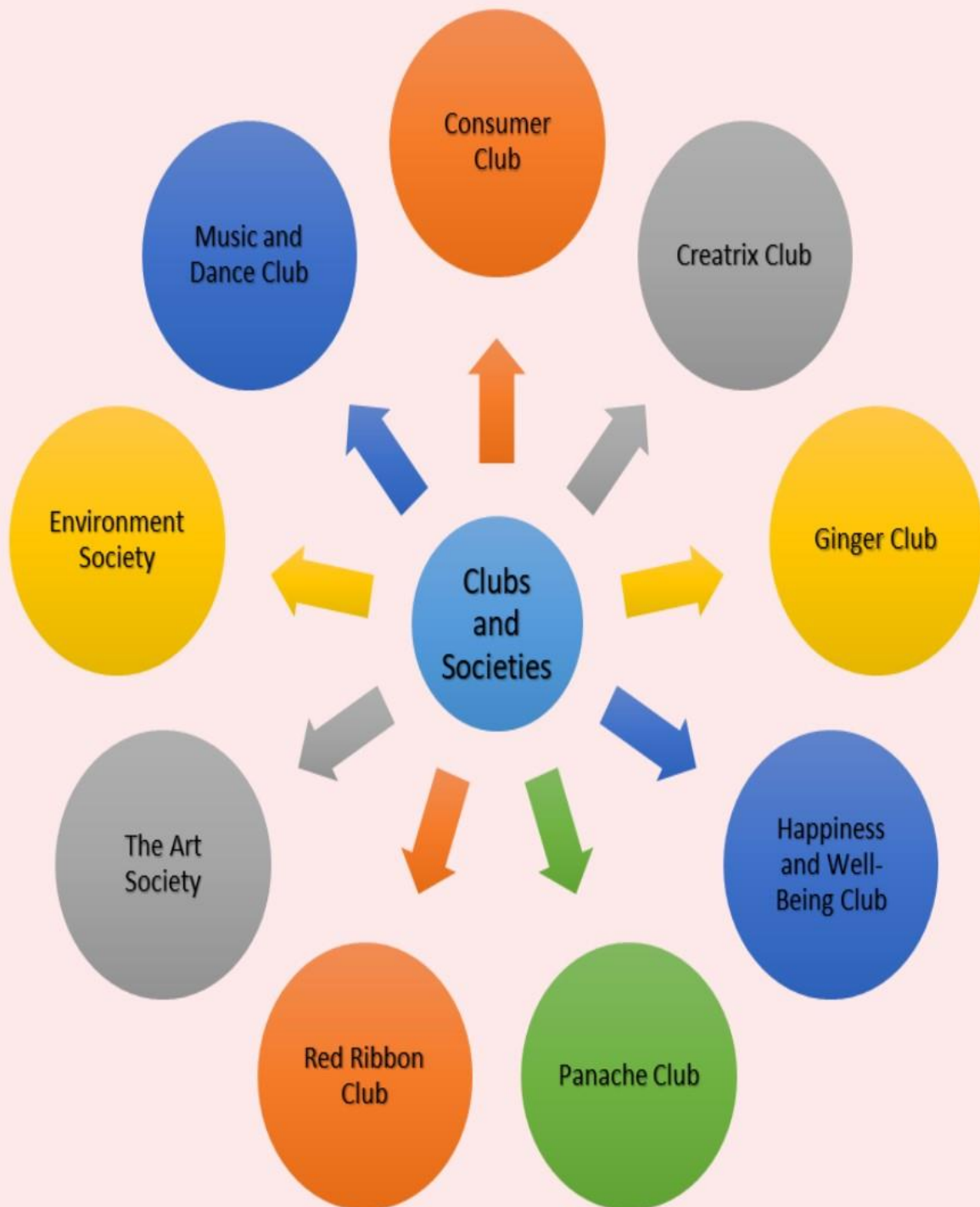
STUDENT COUNCIL

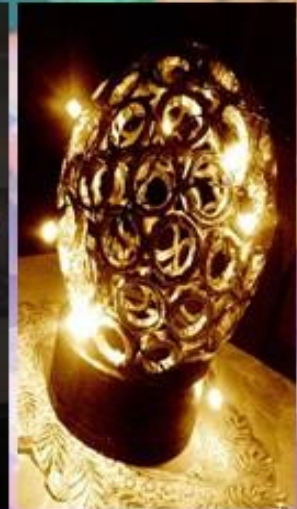
- **The President:** The President leads the council and gives assistance, guidance, acts as facilitator during student council discussions. She also maintains frequent contact with faculty, administration and students.

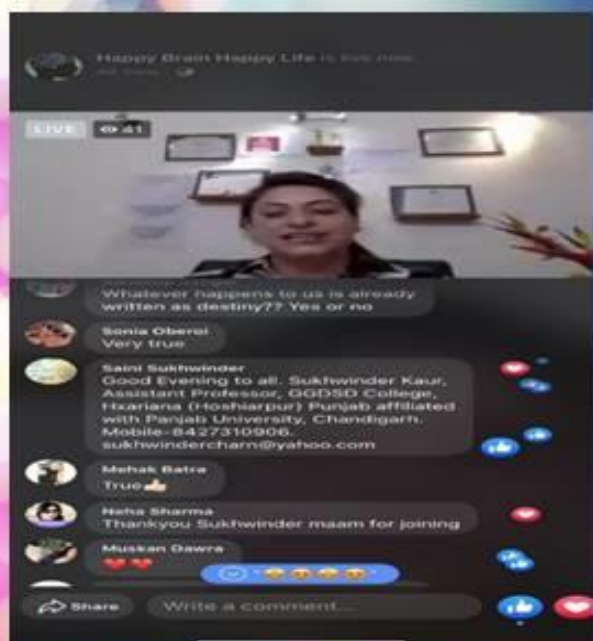

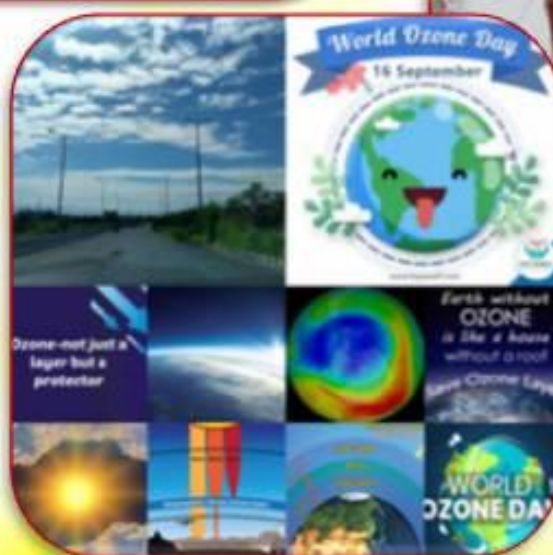

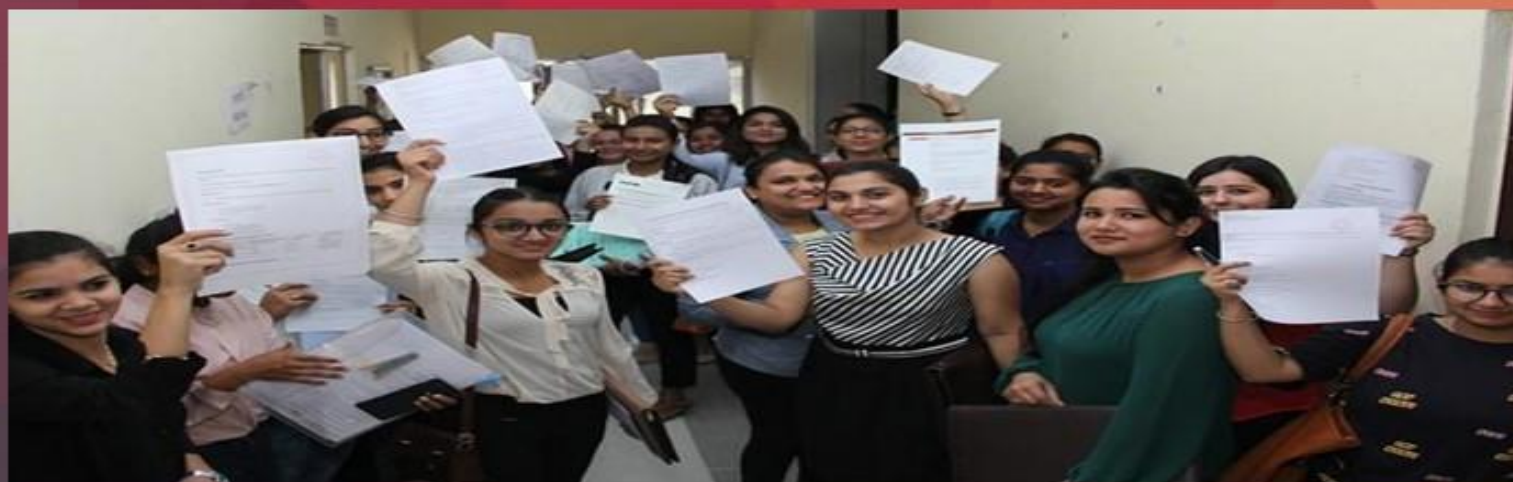

Soft Skill Grooming and Mock Interviews

To prepare the students to get absorbed in leading recruiting organizations, various soft skill development programs and mock interviews are organized throughout the year in the college. This involves various awareness workshops and seminars on grooming, personality development skills, resume writing and verbal and nonverbal etiquettes. To develop effective communication skills, free English speaking bridge course is also organized for final year students.



EXAMINATIONS

*Or any revision of late admission fees by the Syndicate/Senate.

House Examinations

- There will be one House Examination for B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. and PG Diploma students in each semester.
- **Attendance in house examinations is compulsory since it is a prerequisite for University examinations.**
- Students absenting themselves from the House Examinations without any intimation will have to abide by the decision taken by the college disciplinary committee.
- **Students absenting themselves from house examinations on medical grounds should submit the medical certificate from Government Hospital within three days. No medical certificate will be entertained afterwards.**
- Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students who resort to unfair means during examinations.
- **Class tests and assignments in all the subjects are carried out regularly throughout the year.**

Rules for University Examinations

Eligibility for the University Examinations will be as per the Panjab University Rules.

B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. Courses and Post Graduate Diploma Courses:

Roll numbers for University examinations will be issued only to those:

- Who have **75% of attendance both in theory and practical separately in each subject** for each semester for all B.Sc., M.Sc. and Post Graduate Diploma Courses.
- Who have secured a **minimum of 25% marks in theory and practical separately**, in the house examinations for all the courses.
- In addition to the Regulations/Rules for B.Sc. Home Science (3-year) Course, a candidate who have passed the Second semester examination, discontinues studies, may be permitted to join the third semester or the subsequent semester within two years of her passing the examination of the semester after which the candidate has discontinued her studies.
- Notwithstanding the above condition, **no candidate will be allowed to spend more than maximum of five years in B.Sc classes.** The candidate must earn the stipulated number of credits for the award of the degree within this period of five years.



- In addition to the Regulations/Rules for M.Sc. (Clothing & Textiles) and M.Sc. (Human Development & Family Relations), a candidate who have passed the Second semester examination, or any other subsequent examination, discontinues studies, may be permitted to join the Third semester or the subsequent semester within one year of her passing the examination of the semester after which the candidate has discontinued her studies.
- Notwithstanding the above condition, **no candidate will be allowed to spend more than a maximum of three years in M.Sc. classes.** The candidate must earn the stipulated number of credits for the award of the degree within the period of three years
- **A Candidate who appeared under semester system for undergraduate courses should be allowed to take admission under semester system in M.Sc. if she has two re-appears in 3rd, 4th, 5th & 6th Semester. The candidate will not be allowed to take admission in M.Sc. if she has re-appear in the subject in undergraduate classes in which she wants to take admission in M.Sc. Courses.**
- The admission to M.Sc. course shall be done on the basis of merit. In case any seat is lying vacant after exhausting the merit list, up to the last date of admission only then the Principal can admit such students.
- The candidate shall not be admitted in 3rd semester of M.Sc. if she does not clear the re-appear papers of undergraduate classes.

Internal Assessment

B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. Courses and Post Graduate Diploma Courses:

- Each student is required to obtain at least 50% in Theory and Practical's separately in Internal Assessment.
- The internal assessment will be calculated on the basis of performance in House Examinations, tests, assignments, attendance and participation in various co-curricular activities.
- If the candidate fails in internal assessment, she will need to take re-examination in the respective subject.



AWARDS AND PRIZES

Following awards and prizes are given to the students who excel in academics, sports and cultural fields:

1. All round Best Student Award (For student excelling both in curricular & co-curricular activities).

Criteria

- Final year students (from all the streams) would be eligible for this award.
- The student should appear and pass in all the mid-term and university exams during her stay in the college.
- The student should score at least 60% marks in aggregate in the university and mid-term examinations.
- The student should pass in both the practical and theory exams.
- Re-test awards will be considered only if the student has represented the college in any activity during the examination days.
- The student is required to participate in various curricular and co- curricular activities of the college.
- The student should fulfil the university requirement of 75% attendance.
- The student should exhibit good behavior.

2. Dr. P.K. Devi Award

Criteria: -

- For student exhibiting exemplary discipline, compassion and empathy towards fellow students, college staff and society in general.
- The student should fulfil the university requirement of 75% attendance.
- The student should pass in both the practical and theory exams.
- The student should exhibit good behavior.

3. Ms. Sherie Doongaji Prize

Criteria: -

- For student standing first in in B.Sc. H.Sc.(final year) Clothing and Textiles, Panjab University Examinations
- For student standing first in B.Sc. H.Sc.(final year) Interior Design and Resource management, Panjab University Examinations

Criteria: -

- For student representing college in various intra and inter college competitions.
- For student representing college in youth festivals and other cultural activities
- The student should fulfil the university requirement of 75% attendance.
- The student should pass in both the practical and theory exams.
- The student should exhibit good behavior.

2. Prizes are given to those students who stand first in aggregate in House Examinations in all M.Sc. and PG Diploma courses.
3. First and second prizes in aggregate and each individual subject in House Examinations for B.Sc. (H.Sc.) and B.Sc.(F.D.) are given to the deserving students.

Special prizes and certificates are also awarded to students for distinction in various co-curricular activities.

Note: - The criteria for above mentioned awards and prizes are liable to changes subject to the decision of the committee formulated by Principal.



CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

1. **Ragging is strictly prohibited.** Ragging in any form in the college campus will be treated as crime.
2. The students are required to attend all the lectures/tutorials/practicals.
3. The students are required to maintain discipline in the college campus.
4. The students must appear in various House Examinations.
5. **Use of mobile phones** in the classrooms and library, is strictly **prohibited**.
6. Smoking, drinking and playing cards on the college campus is strictly **prohibited**.
7. **Students must make it a point to read the Notice Board and browse college website daily. Ignorance of orders/notices duly displayed on the Notice Board/website shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.**
8. Students violating rules and resorting to indiscipline are liable to be punished in the form of heavy fine, withdrawal of concession or stipends and even expulsion from the college in extreme cases.
9. Students who are under-age and do not have a valid driving license for a two-wheeler or a four-wheeler are not allowed to drive as per the directions of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court.
10. The students must park their vehicles in the parking lot. Plying of vehicles on the college campus is not allowed.
11. It is imperative that students be well-behaved and respectful towards other students. Anyone indulging in or abetting gang fights, bullying, eve-teasing or causing damage to the college property will be dealt with very strictly and can even be expelled.
12. Parents are requested to remain in touch with the faculty members to keep a track of their ward's academic performance, attendance and conduct and are also requested to liaison with the teachers.
13. Each student must bear the cost of repairing and replacing all articles of furniture, crockery, library books etc. lost, broken and damaged by her.
14. **The college reserves the right to refuse admission to a student or to detain her on the following grounds:**
 - **Indiscipline**
 - **Shortage of Attendance**
 - **Not qualifying the eligibility conditions as laid by Panjab University**
 - **Ragging (As per the guidelines from Hon'ble Supreme Court of India)**



RULES AND REGULATIONS

Leave Rules

1. In case of sickness or emergency, the leave application must be submitted within a week duly signed by the parent/guardian of the applicant.
2. Applications for sick leave for more than three days should be supported by a medical certificate from a Govt. Dispensary/Hospital.
3. **Leave on medical or personal grounds does not entitle a student to claim benefit of lectures or for appearing in the special test.**
4. The sports person leave for sports competition/coaching camp (including journey days) recommended by Directorate of Sports including Inter-University tournaments, Inter-College tournaments, Sr. National Championships and International Championships etc. During this leave period the concerned sports person shall be treated as present for the assessment and for all other academic purposes.
5. Absence from the college on days immediately before or after winter vacation entails disciplinary action.
6. **The name of any student who absents herself from the college for ten days or more without any information will be struck off from the college rolls. The Principal has the power to strike off name of any student who is irregular in attendance or is not amenable to the college discipline.**
7. If a student after getting admission or during the session remains absent continuously for 10 days, her name will be struck off from the college rolls.

Library Rules

- An Identity card and Library card-cum-Reader's ticket will be issued to admitted students on production of the fee receipt and submission of stamp size photographs as follows

B.Sc. (Home Science and Fashion Designing): 03

P.G. Diploma classes :04

M.Sc. classes: 05

- Students must bring with them their identity-cum-library card (College Diary) to avail library facility otherwise they will not be allowed to enter library. Any girl found damaging/tearing library book(s) will not be allowed to enter library for that complete academic session.
- The number of books which students of different classes are entitled to borrow at one time is as follows:

- Books are issued for a period of fourteen days only After that a fine of Re. 1 per day is charged
- Any loss of library books or periodicals will have to be paid for by the defaulter within a week by replacing the book or paying the price.
- Any damage done to a book shall have to be brought to the notice of the Librarian before getting the book issued. Otherwise the person who returns it will be held responsible for the damage done.
- The librarian can ask the borrower to return a book before the due date if the same is needed in the library for reference.
- Reference books are issued only 15 minutes before the closing time of the library and are to be returned by 9:30 AM the next morning. A fine of Re. one per hour is charged for books returned late.

Hostel Rules

GENERAL

- No student will be allowed to join hostel without fee Receipts (Both College & Hostel).
- Students are required to bring their own bedding, bed linen and door curtains, locks, buckets, mugs, bulbs, dusters, plate, spoon, tumbler etc
- Furniture will be issued to the resident students against their signatures and the student will be held responsible for any breakage of furniture issued to her.
- Hostel students are not allowed to use any personal electric appliances like radio, two in one, electric rods, electric press, transistors, record players etc. In case of a defaulter, strict action will be taken and the appliance will be confiscated. They are also warned not to tamper with electrical fittings. The college will not be responsible for any mishap.
- Hostel students are allowed to keep two-wheelers only for their convenience.
- No Birthday celebrations are allowed at night in the rooms.
- All rooms and belongings including almirahs can be inspected by the person authorized by the principal.
- Prior permission of warden is required to bring food in the rooms, meals will be served strictly in the mess only.
- **No student is allowed to stay in the rooms from 9:30 am to 01:00 pm as hostel will be closed for cleaning purposes.**
- Appearing in the examinations from outside the hostel will not be allowed.
- Students cannot leave the hostel during the semester.
- Registered visitors are allowed only on visiting days i.e. Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 am to 5:30 pm
- The College is not responsible for any inappropriate behavior/action of the student which is detrimental to accepted social norms.
- Possession and consumption of any kind of intoxicants/drugs/ alcohol will result in immediate expulsion from the hostel.



- **The college does not take responsibility of valuables especially mobile phones and cash of resident students.** They are therefore advised not to bring jewellery and other expensive articles with them.
- **Students are not allowed to stay in the College hostel during autumn break, winter break or summer vacations.**
- All the students will report daily for evening Roll-Call in the hostel common room at 6:00 p.m.
- Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time.
- If, at any time, it is found that the information given to hostel authorities by the parents or the students is wrong, strict action will be taken immediately by the hostel and college authorities.
- Resident students are not allowed to take part in any kind of protest or strike. This will lead to their expulsion from the hostel and college.
- **Strict disciplinary action will be taken against defaulters, which may result in immediate expulsion from hostel.**
- Students are expected to maintain a decent dress code in the hostel and college premises.
- Habitual defiance of the hostel rules will render a resident student liable to disciplinary action, a **special fine** and even expulsion from the college.
- **Ragging is strictly prohibited as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court orders. Defaulters will face punitive action.**
- Any kind of shouting, creating rumours, knocking on doors or any other act likely to create disturbance is strictly prohibited within the Hostel premises.
- Any matter of dispute with fellow boarders should be reported immediately to the Warden/Principal.
- Residents must switch off fans and lights before leaving for night out, day out and during college hours.
- Action will be taken against the erring students, who pass undesirable remarks about fellow students, indulge in physical and mental torture and show disobedience and non-co-operative behaviour.
- A day scholar is not permitted to visit or stay in the hostel without the permission of the Principal.
- Student must give due respect to the wardens and the hostel staff.
- Residents should maintain cordial relations with other fellow students.
- Any hosteller found guilty of creating indiscipline, bringing bad publicity or indulging in negative politics is liable to be expelled with immediate effect.
- The Principal reserves the right to change any of the hostel rules and dues. The changes shall be binding on the residents.

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

It is mandatory to carry a Medical Fitness Certificate by an authorized Medical Practitioner at the time of entry to the hostel. The Medical Certificate should carry the information of the blood group of the student. If a student is suffering from any allergy or medicine, then the same should also be mentioned. Such students are advised to take all precautionary measures themselves to avoid repercussions. Non-disclosure of information related to any serious medical condition will result in the cancellation of the hostel seat. In case this fact is concealed from the authorities at the time of admission, the college will not be responsible



for any emergency that may arise. Students are advised not to indulge in self-medication; if they do so, they will be responsible for the consequences. A nurse is available on the campus 24X7 for any kind of medical aid. In case of emergency the student will be taken to the nearby Govt. hospital and the local guardian will be called immediately along with the intimation to the parents.

HOSTEL LEAVE RULES

1. A resident student can avail night out /weekend leave only twice a month.
2. Wardens can grant leave only on weekends and not during college days and timings.
3. A maximum of 4 days leave will be granted for the wedding of siblings. The wedding card and a letter from parents with the proof of their identity should be attached with the leave application. In all such cases the parents must write directly to the Principal at least two days in advance.
4. Residents will be granted permission to attend family functions only if they have the requisite attendance in classes, have appeared in the Mid-semester examinations, and have adhered to the rules and regulations of the college.
5. If any student extends her leave period of night stay, the parents/guardians should inform the hostel warden well in advance and submit an extension leave application duly signed by the parents.
6. The warden can sanction leave upto 4 days. Any leave more than 4 days would require the sanction of the Principal.
7. Attendance will not be granted for medical leave or any other leave taken by the student.
8. Students who do not report for 10 days without prior permission will have to vacate the hostel.

1. Residents must enter their timings of departure and arrival in the outing register (Dayout/Nightout/Coaching).
2. The resident should positively return to the hostel before Roll call otherwise serious action will be taken.
3. Residents shall strictly adhere to the timings of their return i.e. before Roll call in case of Day Outs and Night Outs.
4. The warden has the right to deny outing to a resident in case of returning late from Night out/any kind of misconduct.
5. If a resident frequently overstays during her leave, her hostel seat may be cancelled and it may also entail refusal of admission to the college in the next session.
6. Students who absent themselves from the hostel without Night Out Pass will have to face strict action as per the decision of the Hostel Committee.
7. Residents should not ask for outings/favours other than the mentioned outing schedule.

Note: Day outings will be given according to the season and circumstances.



Mess Rules

1. Mess Security amounting to Rs. 1000/- will be charged from the hostel resident students at the time of admission to the hostel which is refundable.
2. Mess is run on contract basis. The Mess Charges for every session will be as per the approved contract rate of the contractor.
3. Mess Dues are deposited cumulative for every quarter. Mess Dues are to be deposited before the 10th of the month of the quarter, for which dues are being paid online.
4. **If a student fails to pay the dues within 15 days, their mess account will be cancelled/they will not get food from the mess.**
5. Hostellers are required to dine in the dining hall only.
6. No hosteller is permitted to take her meals to her room without the special permission of the Hostel Supdt. If found violating, disciplinary action will be taken.
7. Meals will not be served before or after the fixed hour. Residents must observe meal timings and must be punctual for that.
8. No hosteller is allowed to enter the cooking area/kitchen of the hostel.
9. Hostellers are not allowed to come in casual clothes/ night dress to the dining hall. They should be properly and decently clad.
10. Residents must behave properly with the mess staff.

Note: Students must observe all mess rules in the dining hall

FOR THE KIND ATTENTION OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS

1. At the time of joining the hostel, the parents/local guardians are required to submit, the name and the address of the local guardians on the specified form.
2. It is mandatory for the parents to put down their signatures in front of the Hostel Committee.
3. Parents are advised to check the **leave book and sign it on every visit** of their wards.
4. Students should open an SBI bank account in their home towns and carry the ATM cards along for convenient monetary transactions.
5. Change of address/telephone number to be informed to the warden in writing by the parents.
6. Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time.
7. The visitors will meet their wards in visitor's room only during visiting hours.
8. No parents/guardians will be allowed to go to the resident's room.,

APPOINTING OF LOCAL GUARDIANS

1. Appointing of a local guardian is a must for the hostel record of each resident student. In case of an emergency, local guardians will be informed and called.
2. Unmarried Men (blood relation and cousins) will not be accepted as local guardians and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
3. Only a married couple should preferably be the local guardian. (Real brother/sister, married or unmarried is also eligible to be local guardian)
4. Only parents and guardians will be allowed to meet their wards from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday and 11:00 a.m.to 5:00 p.m. on Sundays.



FEE REFUND POLICY

A student who wishes to withdraw her admission from the college must apply to the Principal in writing. The Application for withdrawal must be countersigned by the parent/guardian. A student leaving the college without any information to the Principal will forfeit the entire security deposit and the same will be adjusted towards the dues. No claim for refund of security will be entertained in such cases.

In partial modification of office order No. DPI-UT-12(6) 95 dated 30-3-07/24-4-07, the Advisor to the Administrator, Union Territory, Chandigarh is pleased to adopt the recommendations of the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh Endorsed vide No. 4721-4900/Misc/A-3 dated 28-5-07 regarding refund of entire fee collected from the students withdrawing before the starting of the course, the candidates in the waiting list should be given admission against the vacant seat. The entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than Rs.1000/- (Rupees one Thousands only) shall be refunded and returned by the Institution/University to the student/candidate withdrawing from the programme. Should a student leave after joining the course and if the seat consequently falling vacant has been filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, the institution must return the fee collected with proportionate deduction of monthly fee and proportionate hostel rent, where applicable, as conveyed by University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide their letter No. F.No. 1-3/2007(CPP-II) dated 23rd April 2007.

Note: Notwithstanding anything contained in this document to the contrary, the "Instructions for Admission to Various Courses" of Panjab University, Chandigarh or any subsequent instructions to be issued for the session 2018-19 shall apply.

Refund of Security:

The application for the refund of security must be accompanied by "No Dues" certificate from the Heads of various Departments, College Librarian, Hostel Superintendent. The applications for refund will be entertained within a year of the student leaving the college.

Loss or Breakage: Any loss or breakage of College Property has to be paid for by the defaulter.
