Government Home Science College is one of the pioneer institutes in Home Science in the country. Since its inception in 1961, it has grown into an excellent educational centre satisfying the professional and specialized needs of the contemporary woman. The then dynamic Chief Minister of undivided Punjab, Late Sardar Partap Singh Kairon, was instrumental in establishing this prestigious institute which has undergone a long successful journey of expansion. Starting with a three year degree course in B.Sc. Home Science, it expanded its horizons in the true sense by offering a revamped undergraduate programme in B.Sc. Home Science by moving it towards specialization to make it career oriented. Need based changes have been introduced as five specializations namely Apparel and Textile Design, Dietetics, Human Development and Family Relations, Interior Design and Resource Management alongwith a B.Sc. Home Science Composite course. The college offers an undergraduate degree courses in Fashion Designing and Postgraduate degree courses in Clothing and Textiles, Foods and Nutrition, Human Development and Family Relations; Postgraduate Diplomas in Fashion Designing, Nutrition and Dietetics and Child Guidance and Family Counseling . A Ph.D. programme is also offered.

The latest development is the introduction of B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Science and B.Sc. (Hons.) Fashion Designing in accordance with the Choice Based Credit System module suggested by UGC from the academic session 2017-18. The College runs a laboratory Nursery School, Chaitanya, with 50 students on its rolls, attached to the department of Human Development and Family Relations, to impart practical training to its students. The college has made its mark through its participation in the Adult and Community Education Schemes of Panjab University and offers short term training to the Gram Sevikas and Associate Village Women of U.T. Chandigarh, besides undertaking projects offered by various Universities.

Home Science is a unique field of knowledge. Its inter disciplinary approach in synthesizing knowledge drawn from physical and biological sciences, social sciences, arts and humanities has enriched its educational programmes and also caters to the present day needs of education in order to meet the rapidly changing demands of family life and the multiple roles that women have to play in home as well as professional life. Department Profiles

Clothing and Textiles

In order to cater to the needs of the textile and apparel industry, the department has started a specialized and focused course in Apparel and Textile Designing. The department also offers a specialized undergraduate course in B.Sc. (Hons) Fashion Designing which receives an overwhelming response. The postgraduate courses being offered by the department include M.Sc. in Clothing and Textiles and PG Diploma in Fashion Designing. These courses give an in-depth knowledge of textile science, fundamentals of apparel design, construction techniques and fashion merchandising, which enable the students to take up the jobs in the related fields.

Besides being equipped with starting their independent enterprise at the end of the course, the students will also find excellent career opportunities in textile and apparel designing, manufacturing, quality analysis, fashion designing, retailing and merchandising.

The department has the Panache Club which undertakes various activities like Tex-Style week interclass competitions, Aakriti-the annual fashion show, seminars, workshops, talks and educational trips. There are well equipped labs for Garment construction, Fabric construction, Dyeing and Printing and Textile Testing. To keep up with the latest technology in the field of Clothing and Textiles, the department has a computer lab equipped with latest softwares like Tuka-Cad, Tuka-Studio and Richpiece for apparel and textile designing. The department also undertakes community outreach activities to teach various textile designing techniques to rural women for capacity building.



















Foods and Nutrition

Foods and Nutrition Department offers a two years Masters degree in Foods and Nutrition and Post Graduate Diploma in Nutrition and Dietetics. Both these courses offer excellent placement opportunities and cater to the demand for specialized expertise at National and International levels in various institutions and organizations like hospitals, health clinics, schools, vocational programmes, projects and non-government organizations.

In the light of the changing time trends, vocationalization and increased awareness about health and disease, the department lays emphasis on specialized undergraduate courses in Dietetics to equip the students with the latest skill set. The department also encompasses the societal needs by running a diet clinic wherein dietary counselling is carried out for different age groups and diseases. The curriculum is innovative and has a strong practical base to keep pace with the dynamics and changing educational and professional needs in the field of nutrition and health care. The students gets hands on experience in running of a cafeteria/small scale food service outlet, to hone their Entrepreneurial Skills.

This equips the students to translate theory into practice and develop their skills for placement opportunities in various hospitals and health care facilities. They are trained to be absorbed as nutrition and health experts in various health clubs, schools, NGOs. Cookery competitions, seminars, workshops, lectures are organized by the Ginger Club of the department round the year which entails active participation by the students and society at large. The club boasts of more than 100 members. To ensure effective facilitation of the curriculum and extension activities, the department has 4 well equipped labs besides smart class rooms for teaching theory through the ICT technique.

















Family Resource Management

It is the dream of one and all to have a functional, aesthetically furnished, economical and technically strong house. This dream can come true by doing specialization in 3rd year of B.Sc. (Hons) Home Science in Interior Design and Resource Management. Management of a home involves the use and creation of resources to achieve goals. Resources are the means to achieve goals but they are becoming scarce and limited, both quantitatively and qualitatively. Thus the optimum use of resources, ways to increase their availability and conservation is the need of the hour.

The profession of Interior Design has a lot of scope since it is relatively new in India and is developing fast. It has gained enormous popularity. The students study courses related to Interior Space Planning, Design and Display Analysis, Interior Decoration, Furnishings and Furniture Designing, Household Equipment and Ergonomics. Students gain practical experience by preparing drawings of both residential and commercial sectors. They also study Computer Aided Design (CAD) in detail, which helps the student to make their work more professional in order to meet the current market demands and to increase their job prospects. Thus, the courses offered by the department encompass in depth knowledge of Resource Management and Interiors.

This course provides outlet for numerous job opportunities in private (Corporate and Commercial) and public sector. The students can work as free lancers or can also be co- workers with architects, contractors, interior decorators and real estate companies. Teaching in schools, colleges, polytechnic institutes can be another attraction after studying these courses. Hence it is not only a creative, innovative and interesting field to study but has enormous job opportunities as well.

Infrastructure of the department includes fourwellfurnishedlabs viz. - Family Resource Management Lab, Furnishing Lab, Design Studio and Computer Lab along with smart class rooms for theory classes. The department has "Creatrix" club which holds various activities like competitions, workshops, exhibitions, group discussions, seminars, extension lectures, theme decorations etc. throughout the session, to upgrade the knowledge of the students and to make teaching- learning more effective and stimulating.















Human Development and Family Relations

Given the changing trends and the ever increasing requirement of experts in the field of Human Development and Family Relations, the department has introduced new courses that have wide employment opportunities and national and international applicability.

The course offered by the department provide an in-depth knowledge base and skill training to students to be effectively absorbed in various agencies working with child welfare, social welfare, education and human development.

Courses in M.Sc. Human Development and Family Relations and Post Graduate Diploma in Child Guidance and Family Counselling train the students to take on a central role as counselors, special education experts, academicians, and researchers in the field of family studies, early childhood care and education. Avenues for students also exist in various projects being run for welfare of women, children, and children with special needs by National and International organizations such as WHO, UNICEF, NIPCCD, ICCW and ICMR. Many students in the past have been working effectively as Child Development Project Officers in Integrated Child Development Services Scheme. Students also find placements in various Non-Government Organizations, Hospital setups, and Institutes of higher education.

The Department is sufficiently equipped with smart class rooms, conference room, computers, psychological tests and instruments. A laboratory Nursery School, Chaitanya, with 50 students aged 3-5 year olds on it rolls, provide the students an excellent platform to get firsthand experience about observing this age group. It also offers opportunities to the students to plan and conduct stimulating activities for the holistic development of young children. It has dedicated and highly qualified staff which is a good amalgamation of young, energetic and enthusiastic as well as experienced and visionary faculty members.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Science is a professional course offering discipline specific electives (DSE) in Apparel and Textile Design (20 seats), Composite (30 seats), Dietetics (30 seats), Human Development and Family Relations (20 seats), Interior Design and Resource Management (20 seats). B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Science Semester-I to IV will be common to all candidates. DSE will be allotted during Semester-IV and implemented in Semester-V and VI, on the basis of merit drawn up with the following formula -

50% of aggregate marks of (10+2) + 50% of cumulative aggregate marks of University exam of B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Science Semester I and Semester II.

Foreign Students

The eligibility application form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College. 

- 3. Each online form submitted should include set of uploaded certificates, photographs and set of documents, as per the check list. If this is not done, the online form will be rejected.
- 4. If the online form is complete in all aspects, will be accepted after verification. The SMS for the same will be sent on the registered mobile number.
- 5. If the online form has any discrepancy/deficiency the SMS for the same will be sent on the registered mobile number and the applicant is required to do the needful and resubmit the online application.

- The counseling for all streams of all classes will start simultaneously on their respective dates at 10.00 a.m. /11:30 a.m. sharp in the conference room.
- The seats will be filled up from amongst the candidates who are present for counselling as per the merit list.
- If a candidate reports late for counseling she will be considered for admission as per merit, only if there is an available seat. The candidate should report to the admission committee.
- The waiting list will be prepared as per the position of the candidate in the original merit list.

RULES & REGULATIONS GOVERNING ADMISSIONS

- 1. The candidates will be admitted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations contained in the **latest** University calendar/guidelines/any other instructions which have been issued/may be issued by the University from time to time for the respective courses/examinations and on the basis of merit.
- 2. All the admissions to these institutions are provisional and subject to the approval of the Panjab University. The Institution cannot be held responsible in case the University does not approve the admission of a student on account of giving incomplete information, concealing necessary facts or attaching incomplete testimonials or delayed submission of certificates etc. The fine/penalty imposed for the same will be the personal responsibility of the student.
- **3.** Students are advised to keep a hard copy/soft copy of the submitted (filled) Admission Form for future reference.
- **4.** Any instruction or rule received from the Director Higher Education, Chandigarh Admission/Panjab Universitywill be binding on the students.
- **5.** Candidates with gap year will not be admitted to the college until the gap is explained to the satisfaction of the Principal of the college by submitting an affidavit.
- **6.** Students disqualified by any University / Board shall not be admitted.
- 7. Concealment of the facts / furnishing of false information in the Admission form will directly lead to cancellation of the admission and the amount deposited as fee will be forfeited.

A student who remains absent for more than ten days in one or more than one subject / period, including holidays, at a stretch, without sanctioned leave is liable to have her name struck off from the college rolls.

If a student's name is struck off from the college rolls, she will be required to seek readmission within 10 working days failing which her admission will stand cancelled.

Reservation Policy

Reservation for various categories of students in each pool shall be as under:-

I. Reservation for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, Union Territory Pool

- a) Scheduled Castes*
- b) Scheduled Tribes*

*As per Reservation Norms of Chandigarh Administration

If the total number of candidates are less than the reservation, then if required there will be an inter transfer of reservation seats between Chandigarh quota and Outstation quota. If SC/ST seats are still vacant after exhausting all SC/ST candidates, then they will be thrown open in the general pool on the last day of counselling schedule.

The students belonging to these communities shall be allowed a concession of 5% marks for admission to the course in which a certain percentage of minimum marks has been prescribed, by the regulation of the University/Board, to which the institution is affiliated.

II. Reservation for dependents of Defence /Paramilitary Personnel

There is a reservation of 5 % seats for these categories in each pool. The order of preference for admission under this category will be:

• Daughters/spouses of Defence personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations or Paramvir/Mahavir/Vir Chakra in person or posthumously.

OR

Daughters/spouses of Defence personnel and paramilitary personnel like CRPF, BSF etc., who are killed or are totally incapacitated in action while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

- Daughters/spouses of Defence personnel and paramilitary personnel like CRPF, BSF etc., who died while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- Daughters/spouses of Defence personnel and paramilitary personnel like CRPF, BSF etc., incapacitated while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- Daughters/spouses of ex -servicemen (Defence and paramilitary personal like CRPF, BSF etc.) who are wholly dependent on them.
- Daughters/spouses of serving Defence personnel and Paramilitary personnel like CRPF, BSF etc., who are wholly dependent on them.

III. Concession to direct descendents of the Kargil martyrs upto Academic Year (2020-21):

The ward of martyrs/permanent disabled (upto 80% leading to incapacitation) of Kargil war who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this effect and the same is entered in the Pension Book of the family.

- 1% or 1 seat in the Department and affiliated college except in partially financed/ Self financed course.
- Exemption in fee.
- Exemption in hostel fee.

IV. Additional Seats for Cancer, AIDS and Thalassemia patients w.e.f. 2015-16.

- One additional seat each for the student suffering from Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia has been allowed for admission in each course in the Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centres and its affiliated Colleges subject to the condition that the candidate seeking admission under this category is otherwise eligible from all angles.
- The claimant candidate will have to submit a certificate as a proof from a National Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS in support of her claim.

V. Additional Seats for Single Girl Child and One Girl Child out of only two girl children w.e.f. 2015-16.

- Two additional seats per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four(4) out of the two girl children from the session 2015-16 are created for admission to a given course in the Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centres and its affiliated Colleges provided they are otherwise eligible from all angles. The additional seats will be only for those girl children who are either a single girl child of her parents or one amongst the only two girl children with no male child. The additional seats will be available to only one of the two girl children of a couple.
- An affidavit on a stamp paper worth Rs. 20/- duly attested by 1st class Magistrate, to be obtained from the parents of the girl children declaring therein that the benefit of this scheme is being claimed for only one girl child out of the two girl children and the parent shall not claim for the 2nd girl child elsewhere in the future. The specimen of the affidavit is enclosed.

VI. Reservation for Physically Challenged

3% seats in each pool would be filled from amongst the physically challenged candidates. The physically challenged student will furnish a medical certificate issued by the Principal Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon of Chandigarh or her concerned district, indicating percentage of disability, whether she is otherwise able to carry on the studies and perform the duties in the respective course, name of the disease causing handicap, whether handicap is temporary or permanent, whether handicap is progressive or nonprogressive. The students having temporary handicap would not be considered against the reserved seats for physically challenged. Where the certificates are issued by any authority other than the Principal

Medical Officer of Chandigarh and the candidate's turn comes for admission against reserve seat for physically challenged the concerned head of Institution shall refer the candidate to the Principal Medical Officer, Chandigarh and shall admit the candidate only after confirmations from the P.M.O. Chandigarh.

VII. Reservation for Children/ Grand Children of Freedom Fighters:

2 % seats in each pool will be filled with children /grand children of Freedom Fighters. The wards of Freedom Fighters who have been sanctioned pension or awarded 'TamraPatra' by the Government of India would be eligible for reservation under this category.

In case of such freedom fighters it would be a necessary condition for them to obtain a certificate from the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district. Grand children mean son's son/daughter or daughter's son/daughter.

VIII. Reservation for children/grandchildren/immediate relatives of persons killed /incapacitated in Nov, 1984 riots and in terrorist violence in Punjab and Chandigarh

2% for daughters/granddaughters/ wife/ sisters of persons killed /incapacitated in November,1984 riots and of persons killed/incapacitated in terrorist violence in Punjab and Chandigarh.. A certificate from the District Magistrate to this effect must be submitted by the candidate, Migration card alone is not enough.

IX. Concessions to the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants/Displaced persons

- 5% weightage will be given and the merit will be determined accordingly provided that the candidate fulfills the minimum prescribed qualifications.
- 5% increase intake subject to maximum of 3 seats (to be treated as additional seat(s) per course) at the entry point will be made in all courses at under graduate and post graduate level
- Submission of a certificate to the effect that the applicant is a ward of Kashmiri Displaced person, issued by an Authorized Govt. Officer, is mandatory.

X. Reservation under the Sports Quota

• 2% of total number of seats in each course shall be filled up with sportswomen. These two percent seats shall be reserved in each branch of engineering/non-engineering courses in the institutions on the basis of total intake of each branch and fraction of 0.5 or above shall be rounded off to the next higher number, subject to amendments by the concerned department. This category shall not be divided into UT Pool/General Pool. The intermerit of the candidates seeking admission in any course in the reserved category of sports shall only be determined on the basis of their merit in sports as per grading criteria. In case of any of the seats in the sports category in any of the branches remains unfilled, the same shall be thrown open to the candidates belonging to general category. This policy is for the players of the Chandigarh only.

- Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category
 of students:-
 - Who pass their qualifying examination from schools/ colleges, recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh, as a regular student of the said school/ colleges, who have studied in Chandigarh school/ colleges for at least 2 years before applying for the gradation certificate, subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh state/ schools etc. in the National /other recognized tournaments.
 - Where Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other states/ UT in reciprocal basis to give benefit of reservation in admission in sports category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per existing policy of the Chandigarh Administration.
 - Countersigning of the gradation certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that countersigned certificates will be graded as per policy of the Chandigarh Administration's gradation policy to issue Sports Gradation Certificate on the basis of achievements of the player. The merit of certificates shall be graded as 'A', 'B', 'C','D'.

IMPORTANT: Only 'A', 'B', 'C' and 'D' grade will be awarded.

Inter- se Seniority/ Ranking/Grading will be decided by the concerned Institution itself. In the matter of rating, inter-se, the performance of the same grade will be given in the following descending order, namely:-

- Record holders in any event.
- Winners.
- Runner up.
- Third position holders.
- Number of times participated.
- Number of disciplines participated.

Note:-

- Regarding Senior and Junior Tournaments/ Championships, Senior shall have precedence over Junior. Further, Junior and School Championships will be considered at par.
- If there is a tie within the same category, the same shall be resolved by considering the academic merit of the sportsperson. In case of a tie again, the same shall be resolved by considering the seniority in age.
- Performance shall only be considered for the purpose of admission against this category provided that the Association/ Federation holding the tournament should be affiliated/ recognized by the National Federation of the concerned game.

Performance in the following Sports disciplines will only be considered for the purpose of Sports Gradation Certificates:-

Students seeking admission to this category shall be considered only:-

- If her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in Inter College/ Inter University tournaments.
- If her achievement in the sports relates to her activities in any of the three years preceding to admission. (For example, for admission in the Year 2017-17, the achievement shall not be prior to 1st April 2013).
- Gradation certificate will not be meant for employment purposes.

Important:-

Screening/ Trials/ Meeting for issuance of gradation certificate will be held on quarterly basis. It may be done on monthly basis if need be with the prior approval of the component authority as a special case.

In case of any doubt or clarification about the criteria the decision of the Secretary Sports, Chandigarh Administration shall be final.

XI. Two additional seats for rural area students

Only those candidates will be considered in this category, which have passed their Matriculation and +2 examination from those rural schools that do not fall in the area of the Municipal Corporation/ Municipal Committee/ Small town/ Notified Area. Further, the candidates should have been studying in such school for atleast five years before passing the last examination. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the D.E.O./ Principal of the concerned institution of the area certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed the Matriculation and +2 examination, falls within the aforesaid rural area.

XII. One additional seat for border area students.

The Border area students shall mean those candidates who have passed their Matriculation and +2 examination from the Border Area Schools situated within 20 Kilometres from the International Border. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the Tehsildar or

the Principal/ Headmaster/ Head of the School certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed the matriculation or +2 examination, falls within the aforesaid Border area.

Implementation of the above policies is, however, clarified as under:

- The students belonging to reserved categories admitted on the basis of their merit in the general category shall not be accounted for towards the seats reserved for the categories concerned.
- The students who apply in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which she applies for admission, maintaining her inter-se seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in each category. In such cases, the student will get the benefit in one category of her choice. However, no further reservation shall be allowed within the reserved categories.
- The student belonging to a reserved category will also be considered in the general category according to the merit.
- In case of any doubt or interpretation of any term of these instructions, the matter shall be referred to the Chandigarh Administration, whose decision shall be final.

Weightage for NCC and NSS

1. Weightage for NCC

The holder of N.C.C. 'A', 'B' and 'C' certificates shall respectively be given weightage in marks as under:

- o **A:** 1% of obtained aggregate marks
- o **B:** 2% of obtained aggregate marks
- o **C:** 3% of obtained aggregate marks

2. Weightage for NSS

As per decision of the Syndicate Para (13) meeting dated 22.11.2014 and Syndicate Para (36) dated 25.01.2015, Regarding accreditation 'A,B & C' certificate & weightage 1% ,2% & 3% for NSS volunteers.

- 'A' Certificate 1% of obtained Marks
 Completed one year (120 hours) and participated in seven day and night camp (one camp).
- 'B' Certificate 2% of obtained marks
 Completed two years (240 hours) and participated in seven day and night camp (two camps).
- 'C' Certificate 3% of obtained marks
 Completed three years (360 hours) and participated in seven day and night camp (three camps).

These gradation certificates will be given on the basis of the voluntary services rendered by NSS Volunteers in the field of social service while studying in educational institutions.

Concessions and Scholarships

Concessions and Financial Help is Given to the Students in College Under Nine Heads

Various concessions and scholarships are as under:-

1. General Students

Concession in Fee; (Refer to Common Fee Concession Application Form given in the prospectus). Half Tuition Fee concession is given to 10% of admitted students, whose family income from all sources is upto Rs. 1 lakh per annum (BPL certificate mandatory).

2. Half Fee and Brother/Sister Concession:

Students whose elder brother/sister is paying full fee in any Govt. College of Chandigarh Administration ,should apply for concession within 15 days after getting admission in their respective colleges / same college.

3. Blind Students Concession:

All blind candidates shall be exempted from payment of tuition fees and admission fees in respect of all the classes.

4. Post Matric Scholarship for Students belonging to Scheduled Castes:

These scholarships are available for studies in India only and are awarded by the Government of the State/Union Territory to which the applicant actually belongs i.e., permanently settled.

Such students are given stipend as per rules and regulations. All those students are eligible whose parents' income is less than Rs. 2.5 lakh per annum.

To avail this stipend a student is required to submit the following:

- Certificate from 1st class Magistrate or from any other competent authority, testifying caste.
- Self attested Income certificate of parents from all sources.

5. Post -Matric Scholarship to OBC (Other Backward Class) Students

This is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme. All those students are eligible whose parental income does not exceed Rs. 1lakh per annum.

To avail this stipend, a student is required to submit the following:

- Certificate testifying citizenship, caste, sub-caste, religion and permanent address of the student, from an officer specially authorized by the Govt. of the State/U.T. to which the applicant belongs.
- Self attested Income certificate of parents from all sources.

6. Merit-Cum-Means based Scholarship for students belonging to Minority Communities

This scholarship is awarded by the Govt. of India, Ministry of Minority Affairs, New Delhi. The annual income of the student's parents / guardian (from all sources) should not exceed Rs. 2 lakh per annum.

To avail this scholarship, students are required to submit the following;

- Income declaration Affidavit on Non-Judicial Stamp Paper for self-employed parents/guardian OR income certificate from the employer for employed parents/guardian.
- Proof of permanent residence.
- Minority community declaration affidavit on Non-Judicial Stamp Paper by the student, that she belongs to any one of the following minority communities notified by Central Govt. Muslim, Sikh, Buddhist, Christian and Parsi.

7. SC/ST Students-Books and Stationary

Under this scheme, Education Department, Chandigarh Administration, provides free books and stationary worth Rs. 350/-. to each SC/ ST Student.

8. Meritorious Students Scholarship

Under the Govt. of India National Scholarship Schemes and UT State Merit Scholarship Scheme merit students are given scholarship @Rs. 100 per month.

- 21 scholarships are given under UT Merit Scholarship Scheme.
- 86 scholarships are given under Govt. National Scholarship Scheme.

9. Poor/Needy Students

Economically Weaker Students (If Income of parents is less than Rs.2 lakh per annum) they are given financial aid out of Students' Aid Fund and Red Cross Fund.

*The concession, financial help and scholarship to be given will be decided after admission to college. The concession, financial help and scholarship beneficiaries will be decided by the Central Govt. College committee, on a Centralised merit pattern.

Clubs and Societies

Following clubs and societies are functioning in the college:

- Consumer Club
- Creatrix Club
- Ginger Club
- Happiness and Well- Being Club
- Panache Club
- Red Ribbon Club
- The Art Society
- Environment Society
- Literary and Cultural Society
- Music and Dance Society

Seminars, tutorials, paper reading contests, street plays along with various competitions are held regularly. Lectures and activities of general and cultural interest are arranged by these clubs and societies, from time to time.

Students' Council

Students' Council is an elected body, to look after the interest of the students and help the authorities in maintaining perfect discipline in the college.

Tutorials

Every student is allotted a tutorial group under the charge of a faculty member who takes interest in the welfare and progress of the ward.

Guidance and Counselling Bureau

A Guidance and Counselling Bureau is functional in the college to cope with any educational, vocational and emotional problems faced by the students.

Placement Cell

The college has an active placement cell which liaisons with the related industry and schedules interviews and placements. The cell organizes workshops on personality development, resume writing and associated activities. Soft skill development and entrepreneurship development workshops are also organized by inviting speakers/experts from the relevant areas.

Games and Sports

The College is having following sports facilities:

- Athletic track (200 m),
- Football Field,
- Volleyball Court,
- Multipurpose Gymnasium Hall with (Table Tennis, Chess, Yoga Session) facilities
- Well-equipped Gym for Cardio and Weight training for both students and staff.
- Badminton Court (Wooden). The Badminton court of the college is also available for officials of different government organization in the spirit extended friendly facilities for community.
- The Department of Physical education has a culture of morning games and offering a very integrated voluntary guidance to students desiring of fitness by suggesting suitable gym work, exercises, diet and very interesting new perspectives of including bhangra aerobics.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

Under graduate students can join NCC as volunteers. Once enrolled, NCC is compulsory for six semesters. NCC cadets have to attend 35 periods of regular training and participate in social service activities every year. On completion of one camp within four semesters, NCC cadets are eligible for 'BEE' Certificate. For 'CEE' Certificate NCC cadets should pass `BEE` Certificate and attend one camp in the V or VI semester.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

NSS activities are compulsory for all the students and students & staff are involved in voluntary outreach activity participation in the adopted village 'Khuda Ali Sher' pertaining to 'Swachh Bharat' and skill development. Two seven day and night camps are compulsory for each student. Weightage of marks are given for the same as per the decision of the syndicate, Panjab University, Chandigarh.

Rotaract Club

Rotaract Installation Ceremony held in college. Rotaract Club of the Govt. Home Science College was given 'Best International Service Project Award' and 'Best Club Service Project Award' for the tenure 2015-16.

Women Cell(Sexual Harassment & Grievance Redressal Committee)

The college has a functional Women Cell to address "grievances/ complaints" of the students. Grievances include the following complaints of the aggrieved students, namely:-

- 1. Making admission contrary to merit determined in accordance with the declared admission policy of the institute.
- 2. Irregularity in the admission process adopted by the institute.
- 3. Refusing admission in accordance with the declared admission policy of the institute.
- 4. Providing any information which is false or misleading and not based on facts.
- 5. Withhold or refuse to return any document in the form of certificates of degrees, diploma or any other award or other document and deposited with it by a person for the purpose of seeking admission in such institution, with a view to induce or compel such person to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or programme of study which such person does not intend to pursue.
- 6. Demand of money in excess of that specified in the declared admission policy or approved by the competent authority to be charged by such institution.
- 7. Breach of the policy for reservation in admission as may be applicable.
- 8. Complaints, of alleged discrimination of students from the Schedule Castes, Schedule Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Women, Minority or Disabled Categories.
- 9. Nonpayment or delay in payment of scholarships to any student that such institution is committed, under the conditions imposed by University Grants Commission, or by any other authority.
- 10. Delay in conduct of examinations or declaration of results beyond that specified in the academic calendar.
- 11. On provision of student amenities as may have been promised or required to be provided by the institutions.
- 12. Denial of quality education as promised at the time of admission or required to be provided.
- 13. Non transparent or unfair evaluation practices.
- 14. Harassment and victimization of students, including sexual harassment.

Anti Ragging Squad

Ragging includes disorderly conduct whether by words, spoken or written or by any act which has the effect of teasing, treating and handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension in a fresher or new student. It is imperative that students be well-behaved and respectful towards each other. Any one indulging in or abetting gang fights will be dealt with very sternly and may be rusticated. Ragging in any form is a punishable offence and the same is banned by the Court of Law, as per directives of the Supreme Court of India, dated May 16, 2007 in SLP No. (s) 24295 / 2004. Anti- Ragging squad and helplines have been formed in the college to prevent ragging and help students in distress, if any.

House Examinations

- There will be one House Examination for B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Science, B.Sc. (Hons.) Fashion Designing, B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. and PG Diploma students in each semester.
- Attendance in house examination is compulsory. Students absenting themselves from the
 House Examinations without any intimation will not be eligible for appearing in the final
 examinations.
- No special exam will be held for absentees in House Examinations. Students absenting
 themselves from house exams on medical grounds should submit the medical certificate
 from Government Hospital on the same day. No medical certificate will be entertained
 afterwards.
- Students who resort to unfair means during examinations will be expelled from the college.
- Class tests and assignments in all the subjects are carried out regularly throughout the year.

Rules for Eligibility to take University Examinations

Eligibility for the University Examinations will be as per the Panjab University Rules.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Science, B.Sc. (Hons.) Fashion Designing, B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing M.Sc. Courses and Post Graduate Diploma Courses:

Roll numbers for University examinations will be issued only to those:

- Who have **75% of attendance both in theory and practical separately in each subject** for each semester for all the B.Sc., M.Sc. and Post Graduate Diploma Courses.
- Who have secured a **minimum of 25% marks in theory and practical separately**, in the house examinations for all the courses.

Internal Assessment

B.Sc. (Hons.) Home Science, B.Sc. (Hons.) Fashion Designing, B.Sc. Home Science, B.Sc. Fashion Designing, M.Sc. Courses and Post Graduate Diploma Courses:

- Each student is required to obtain at least 50% in Theory and Practicals separately in Internal Assessment, which will be calculated on the basis of House Examinations, tests, assignments and attendance.
- If the candidate fails in internal assessment, she will need to take re-examination in the respective subject.
- A student failing in internal assessment will not be eligible to appear in the University Examinations.

Fee Refund Policy

A student who wishes to withdraw her admission from the college must apply to the Principal in writing. The Application for withdrawal must be countersigned by the parent/guardian. A student leaving the college without any information to the Principal will forfeit the entire security deposit and the same will be adjusted towards the dues. No claim for refund of security will be entertained in such cases.

In partial modification of office order No. DPI-UT-12(6) 95 dated 30-3-07/24-4-07, the Advisor to the Administrator, Union Territory, Chandigarh is pleased to adopt the recommendations of the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh Endorsed vide No. 4721-4900/Misc/A-3 dated 28-5-07 regarding refund of entire fee collected from the students withdrawing before the starting of the course, the candidates in the waiting list should be given admission against the vacant seat. The entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than Rs.1000/- (Rupees one Thousands only) shall be refunded and returned by the Institution/University to the student/candidate withdrawing from the programme. Should a student leave after joining the course and if the seat consequently falling vacant has been filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, the institution must return the fee collected with proportionate deduction of monthly fee and proportionate hostel rent, where applicable, as conveyed by University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide their letter No. F.No. 1-3/2007(CPP-II)dated 23rd April 2007.

Note: Not withstanding anything contained in this document to the contrary, the "Instructions for Admission to Various Courses" of Panjab University, Chandigarh or any subsequent instructions to be issued for the session 2017-18 shall apply.

Refund of Security:

The application for the refund of security must be accompanied by "No Dues" certificate from the Heads of various Departments, College Librarian, Hostel Superintendent. The applications for refund will be entertained within a year of the student leaving the college.

Loss or Breakage: Any loss or breakage of College Property has to be paid for by the defaulter.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- 1. Ragging is strictly prohibited. Ragging in any form on the college campus or on campus will be treated as crime.
- **2.** The students are required to attend all the lectures/tutorials/practicals. Exemption will be given only in case of a valid reason for which due leave should be obtained.
- **3.** The students are required to maintain discipline on the college campus.
- **4.** The students must appear in various House Examinations.
- 5. Use of mobile phones in the classrooms and library, is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Smoking, drinking and playing cards on the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Students must make it a point to read the Notice Board daily. Ignorance of orders/notices duly displayed on the Notice Board shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.
- **8.** Students violating rules and resorting to indiscipline are liable to be punished in the form of heavy fine, withdrawal of concession or stipends and even expulsion from the college in extreme cases.
- **9.** Students who are under-age and do not have a valid driving license for a two-wheeler or a four-wheeler are not allowed to drive as per the directions of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court.
- **10.** The students must park their vehicles in the parking lot. Plying of vehicles on the college campus is not allowed.
- 11. It is imperative that students be well-behaved and respectful towards other students. Anyone indulging in or abetting gang fights or eve-teasing or causing damage to the college property will be dealt with very strictly and can even be expelled.
- **12.** Parents are requested to remain in touch with the faculty members to keep a track of their ward's academic performance, attendance and conduct and are also requested to liaison with the teachers.
- 13. The college reserves the right to refuse admission to a student or to detain her on the following grounds:
 - Indiscipline
 - Shortage of Attendance
 - Not qualifying the eligibility conditions as laid by Panjab University
 - Ragging (As per the guidelines from Hon'ble Supreme Court of India)
 - Eve-teasing and Sexual Harassment.
 - Drugs

RULES

Leave Rules

- 1. The students must take prior sanction of leave.
- 2. In case of sickness or emergency the leave application must be submitted within a week.
- 3. Applications for sick leave for more than three days should be supported by a medical certificate from a Govt. Dispensary/Hospital.
- 4. However, leave on medical grounds or otherwise does not entitle a student to claim benefit of lectures or for appearing in the special test.
- **5.** The application for the leave should be signed by the parent/guardian of the applicant and recommended by the tutor.
- **6.** The sports person's leave for sports competition/coaching camp(including journey days) recommended by Directorate of Sports including Inter-University tournaments, Inter-College tournaments, Sr. National Championships and International Championships etc. During this leave period the concerned sports person shall be treated as present for the assessment and for all other academic purposes.

Absent without Leave

Absence from the college on days immediately before or after autumn or winter vacation entails disciplinary action.

The name of any student who absents herself from the college for ten days or more without any information will be struck off from the college rolls. The Principal has the power to strike off name of any student who is irregular in attendance or is not amenable to the college discipline.

Each student must bear the cost of repairing and replacing all articles of furniture, crockery, library books etc. lost, broken and damaged by her.

If a student after getting admission or during the session remains absent continuously for 10 days, her name will be struck off from the college rolls.

The college discipline committee is fully authorized to charge fine from the student who remains absent from the college activities.

Library Rules

The college has a well equipped library with books on all the subjects especially in Home Science. Great importance is attached to independent reading in the library. The library subscribes to a large number of magazines and periodicals which are placed in the library.

Students must bring with them their identity-cum-library card (College Diary) when coming to the library/ reading room and produce the same on demand by the library staff or by any member of the teaching staff. Those students who fail to produce the identity card will not be allowed to enter the library. Any girl found damaging/tearing library book(s) will not be allowed to enter the library for

that complete academic session.

The number of books which students of different classes are entitled to borrow at one time is as follows:

Undergraduate Students -

B. Sc. (Hons.) Home Science/B.Sc. Home Science/ B.Sc. Fashion Designing	2
Master's Students - M. Sc. Home Science	4
P.G. Diploma Students	3

Books are issued for a period of fourteen days only. Books not returned in time entail a fine of Re. 1 per day.

Any loss of library books or periodicals will have to be paid for by the defaulter within a week by replacing the book or paying the price.

Any damage done to a book shall have to be brought to the notice of the Librarian before getting the book issued. Otherwise the person who returns it will be held responsible for the damage done.

The librarian can ask the borrower to return a book before the due date if the same is needed in the library for reference.

Reference books are issued only 15 minutes before the closing time of the library and are to be returned by 9:30 AM the next morning. A fine of Re. one per hour is charged for books returned late.

Hostel and Rules

Hostel accommodation, including boarding, is available.

There shall be a mess committee constituted by the Principal to guide the representatives of the students to look after the mess arrangement.

HOSTEL RULES:

For the efficient functioning of the college hostel, there is a Hostel committee consisting of the Principal, the Hostel Supdt., and members of the staff and students' representatives. This committee looks into the day-to-day difficulties and problems of resident students and frame rules from time to time.

Every resident student will be expected to follow the hostel rules strictly.

- Admission to the hostel will not be granted unless the parent accompanies the candidate at the time of interview. This will apply to the old students as well.
- The hostel application form must be accompanied by a postcard size family photograph. This is mandatory and admission will not be given in the absence of the family photograph.

- Old students will be given re-admission to the hostel on the basis of their good behavior in the previous year.
- Passport size photographs of local guardians should be submitted along with the hostel admission form, at the time of admission.

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OUTING AND LEAVE FROM THE HOSTEL

Outing will be on every Wednesday after 4 p.m. till roll call time and on every Sunday from 10 a.m. till roll call time. Passes will be issued on Wednesday itself. Weekend outings will be permitted only with the parents' permission. The pass booklet will be signed by the parents when the student takes a weekend outing and should be returned to the hostel superintendent, on return to the hostel.

No student shall be allowed to go out of town during working days without the prior permission of the Principal/Hostel Supdt.

An application seeking permission should be sent by the parents/local guardians direct to the Principal/ Hostel Supdt. No resident student shall be allowed to become a day scholar during the stay in the hostel for more than two days. If any student does so, her seat in the hostel will be cancelled immediately.

A resident student on leave from the hostel will apply for the leave from the college as well. In case she is found attending classes in the college while on sick leave from the hostel strict action will be taken against her.

Students who absent themselves from the hostel without Night Out Pass will have to face strict action as per the decision of the Hostel Committee.

MESS RULES

- Mess Security amounting to Rs. 1000/- will be charged from the Hostel resident students at the time of admission to the hostel which will be refunded at the time of leaving the Hostel.
- Mess is run on contract basis. The Mess Charges for the session 2017-18 will be as per the approved contract rate of the contractor.
- Mess Dues are deposited cumulative for every quarter. Mess Dues are to be deposited before the 10th of the month of the quarter, for which dues are being paid online.
- If a student fails to pay the dues within 15 days, their mess account will be cancelled/they will not get food from the mess.
- Hostellers are required to dine in the dining hall only.
- No hosteller is permitted to take her meals to her room without the special permission of the Hostel Supdt. If found violating disciplinary action will be taken.
- No hosteller is allowed to enter the cooking area/kitchen of the hostel.
- Hostellers must be punctual for meals.
- Hostellers are not allowed to come in casual clothes/ night dress to the dining hall. They should be properly and decently clad.

GENERAL RULES

- Students should bring with them their own bedding, bed linen, locks, a tumbler, two plates, a spoon and one bulb.
- The students are not permitted to use any private electrical appliances, radio, two in one, electric rods, electrical press, transistors, record players etc. In case of default a fine of Rs. 150/- will be imposed and the electric appliance will be confiscated from the defaulter to be returned only when she leaves the hostel.
- Any loss or damage to the hostel property including furniture will be recovered from the defaulters. The Principal/Hostel Supdt. Reserve the rights of censorship of all correspondence of all the resident students.
- Students should not use abusive/foul language.
- Silence hours should strictly be observed by the resident students after 9.30 p.m. daily so as to allow the students to study without any kind of interference or disturbance.
- Students must not bring costly jewellery or keep excessive cash with them. The student should open an account with the State Bank of Patiala, Sector-10, Chandigarh. The hostel/college authorities will not be responsible for the loss of any personal property.
- Parents should be very careful in appointing local guardians of their wards who will shoulder the responsibility of looking after their wards without any hesitation. In case of any sickness or any emergency their address and telephone / mobile numbers etc. must be clearly written on the form alongwith their specimen signatures.
- The Parents/visitors of the ward should be properly properly dressed while visiting the hostel.
- In case of any change of address/ contact number of parents and local guardians, the same must be intimated to the hostel authorities immediately.
- Students suffering from serious/chronic/infectious diseases will not be admitted in the hostel.
 If this fact is concealed from the authorities at the time of admission, the student's seat in the hostel will be cancelled, as soon as it is discovered that she is suffering from a serious disease.

Medical certificate from the medical practitioner must be attached along with the admission form.

Saturdays 02.00 P.M. to 5.30. P.M. Sundays 10.30 A.M. to 5.30. P.M.

PERMISSION TO RESIDENT STUDENTS FOR LEAVING THE HOSTEL

Rules with regard to permission to resident students to leave the hostel have been framed by the D.P.I. Chandigarh Administration, as intimated, - vide Memo No. DOI (UT) (CH) 12(12/75), dated 15th February, 1975. The same will be observed by the students.

- Students are not allowed to stay in the college hostel during the autumn break, winter break, summer vacation and after the P.U. Examinations (Theory/Practical) are over.
- Students must get special permission to attend a birthday party or wedding of friend locally or out of station. If at all such permission is granted, it will be subject to the condition of a permission letter received by the Principal from the student's parents and not local guardians

- at least four days prior to the date of function and the leave will be granted in lieu of a routine outing.
- Students will be issued a Hostel Record Book, which maintains a complete record of their outings and their conduct in the hostel. The college expects parents to check the Record book for their personal information.
- Parents are advised not to allow their wards to stay out for weekends. In case they wish that their wards may spend their weekends with the local guardians, instructions in writing must be left with the hostel superintendent.
- Parents/guardians must furnish a list of visitors and relatives with their specimen signatures and photographs(of guardians, relatives and visitors) to the Hostel Superintendent. Parent/guardians must specify if the local guardian is authorized to give permission of any kind such as attending parties, going out of station etc. to their wards, failing which students will not be permitted to go out.
- The visitors will meet their wards in the visitor's room or in the sick room in the case of illness. No visitor can go to the students' room.
- Students (men/women) shall not be local guardians unless they are very closely related to the resident student and are elder in age. If male students act as local guardians/visitors they will not be allowed to bring their friends to the hostel with them to visit their wards.
- Admission form for hostel must have the signatures and photographs of the local guardians.
 The resident students going out to local guardians must get a 'Pass' before they leave and
 return this pass to superintendent duly signed by the local guardian. These signatures will be
 tallied with the signatures in the Hostel Admission forms and any defaulter shall be strictly
 penalized.
- Students going to local guardians and for shopping will have to return by 5.30 p.m. during winter and 6.30 p.m. during summer, else they will be gated.
- No guest is allowed to stay for the night.
- Breach of hostel or college rules shall render the students subject to disciplinary action/expulsion from the hostel and the college.

Note: -

- The Principal has the right to change any of the college or hostel rules at any time without prior notice.
- Parents are requested to make a note of the above rules and to assist their wards in observing the rules and regulations given in the prospectus.
- The Principal can refuse admission to any student without giving any reason.
- The provisions of this prospectus may be altered at any time and such alteration will be binding on all students.
