<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They felt that the vision of the college is reflected in the academic and administrative activities of the college.</li> </ul>	



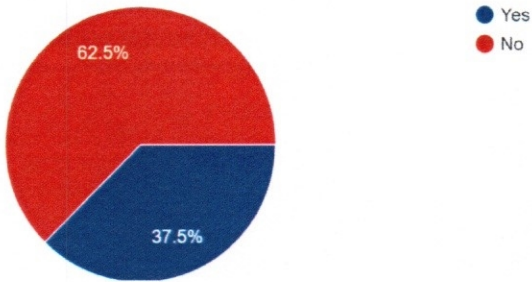

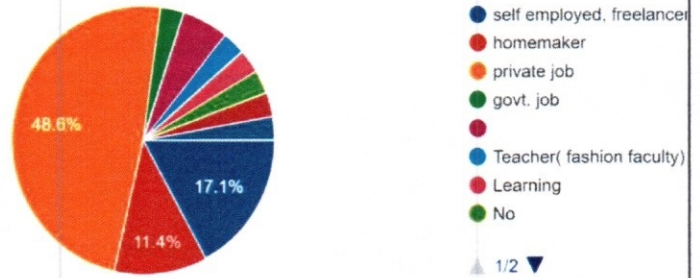

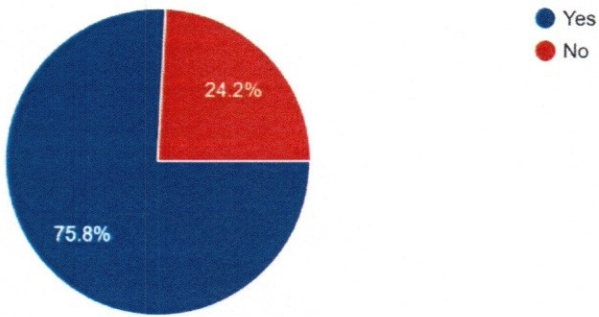
1. Working status of Alumni



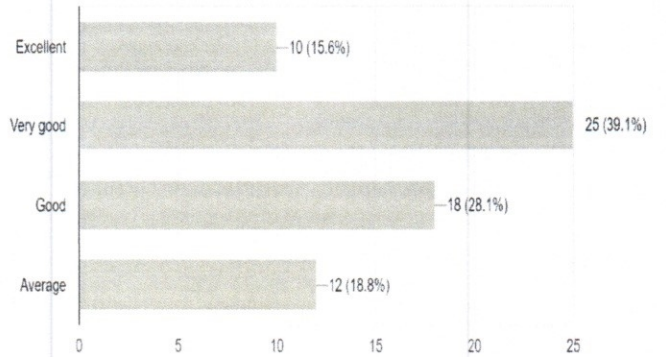

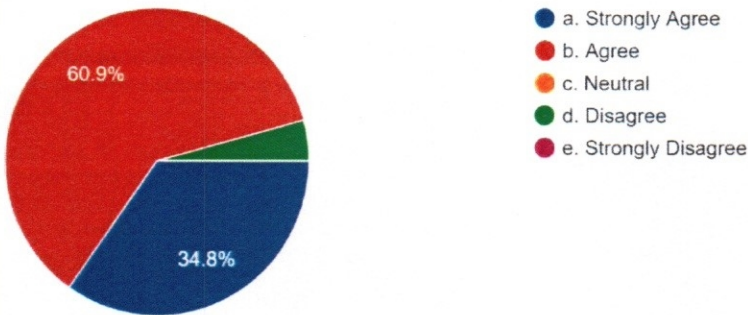
Parents' Feed Back Analysis	Action Taken with respect to Feedback
