

- A live workshop was organized on Mind Management with Yoga in collaboration with Sri Sri University, Cuttack Around 100 students participated in the virtual event through google meet.



Government Home Science College has contributed significantly in managing the Solid Waste Management. Various measures have been taken from time to time to generate awareness regarding plastic pollution and proper segregation of waste. Following provisions have been taken for plastic waste management and creating mass awareness even during these difficult times of COVID-19 Pandemic:

#### 1. Organized a virtual rally

A virtual rally was organized to generate awareness regarding the need to avoid use of plastic carry bags. NSS volunteers raised slogans against plastic pollution. The volunteers were addressed on various topics like the use of plastic, the harm it causes and how to reduce and avoid the use of plastic.

#### 2. Poster Making & Slogan Writing competitions

NSS Volunteers made illustrative posters and wrote slogans based on 'Say No To Plastic' and plastic pollution.

#### 3. Organized a talk

A talk was organized with sweepers so as to make them aware regarding the proper segregation of waste and harmful effects of using plastic objects which adversely affects the environment.

#### 4. Display of signboards regarding segregation of waste

Various signboards have been displayed in different areas around the college campus and hostels. The prints of wastes belonging to blue and green category have been pasted on the respective dustbin for easy segregation of wastes.

#### 5. Dustbins have been installed according to waste texture i.e. Green and Blue

The college practices waste segregation process based on the type of the dustbin Colour (Green and Blue) as per the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2018. Both green and blue colour dustbins are placed at various areas around the college which includes main gate of the college, canteen area, college corridors, washrooms, UG & PG hostel.

**6.** The faculty of the staff is coming with 50% staff and most of the staff members are keeping their own bottles, so waste generated in the college is less than 3 percent per month approximately. Both the hostels, mess and canteen areas are not functional due to COVID-19 Pandemic, therefore, no plastic waste was generated.

#### **Step Up! Conserve Water on Campus**

Government Home Science College is continuously working on creating a ecologically and sustainable sanitation inside the college premises from time to time. A team of 20 NSS Volunteers was made and and they were oriented regarding the swacchta vision and mission of the institution. Orientation programme was conducted focusing on significance of swacchta and water conservation. Role and responsibilities with special reference to Jal Shakti and Swacchta initiatives were discussed thoroughly. Key role of NSS Volunteers was also discussed and significance of volunteers in disseminating the information to various stakeholders was also highlighted by the Programme Officers. Students were orientated regarding the basic rule of water conservation, water quantity and quality, need of good quality, ways to lessen the overburdening of water resources, monitoring of over head tanks, various sources of the campus water and managing water, harvesting water, recycling and plugging leakages. Various activities were conducted wherein NSS Volunteers were sensitized after making their teams. The entire college was thoroughly surveyed by the volunteers followed by identification of water challenges. Water audit is conducted from time to time.

Water audit was already done in the institution. Approximately, Rs 42,44,000/has been spent for providing & laying of SWD line & road gullies for disposal of rain water. The water is saved as the used water is diverted from drinking water points, wash basins, canteen sinks to water the plants in the campus. Tertiary Water is used for watering the trees & lawns. The institution is not dependent on any external source-panchayat/municipal supply/private water tankers/bottled mineral water suppliers.NSS Volunteers of the college are sensitized from time to time regarding Swacchta and water conservation. They have been divided in teams to generate awareness among masses at large level. Teams visits are conducted regularly to survey the campus so as to identify various challenges and then meetings are organized to work on the solutions.

#### **Conclusion:**

The institution is making an conscious effort to safeguard and conserve environment. The best way to spread awareness is through education. Government Home Science College through its well designed policies are making all the efforts for sustainable development by implementing conservation measures. The staff and students are sensitized regularly through discussions, seminars and workshops regarding various government key issues related to the water & environmental conservation.
