Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.		<p>The college consistently imparts skill based as well as quality education through its academic and cultural activities. Keeping in mind the critical quotient and academic requirement of the students, different innovative teaching methodologies, research based assignments and problem solving techniques are used for slow and advanced learners. To execute the curriculum completion in time, the college follows an Academic calendar prepared by Panjab University, Chandigarh and prepares the college Activity Calendar accordingly. The workload distribution among faculty and timetables are announced and uploaded on college website before the beginning of each academic semester thus ensuring that all classes begin on time.</p> <p>All the departments take departmental meetings on regular basis to supervise the teaching-learning process as well as timely completion of syllabus. The Head of the department ensures that the syllabus is completed well in advance, enabling teachers to recapitulate/revise the curriculum for the benefit of the students. Different innovative teaching methodologies, creative pedagogies, new initiatives and activities to be organized and implemented to complete the curriculum effectively are discussed in the meetings. The implementation of curriculum is smoothly administered by teachers. Every teacher follows individual monthly teaching plan and also provide necessary study materials to complete the curriculum within the stipulated time. If need be, teachers also take extra lectures to complete the syllabus. Teachers use English and Hindi as the medium of interaction for effective curriculum delivery. Classes in blended/hybrid mode were conducted to ensure effective curriculum delivery. E-content including key points and framework of all the courses was uploaded on the college website to enable the students to have access to the curriculum from far-fetched places.</p> <p>Online remedial sessions were also conducted by the teachers. Students from the Master's and Doctorate programs were constantly in touch online as well as offline to ensure effective research practices on issues of public concern. Appropriate existing e-learning platforms such as Zoom, Google meet and WhatsApp Videos were used to provide a structured, user-friendly, rich set of assistive tools for monitoring progress of learners. The college library has software OPAC which enables the students to access all learning resources online including books, journals, manuscripts etc to enable the students to finish their assignments well in time.</p> <p>Apart from regular classes related to the curriculum, the college developed e-resources, educational videos and conducted webinars, skill development workshops and national and international level competitions to promote entrepreneurial activities. A YouTube channel, Facebook and Instagram page was developed by the college for the same where videos on relevant issues were compiled and uploaded to reach the general masses. The college organized a host of activities (more than 50) on varied topics ranging from health, social and psychological well being, sustainable initiatives and environment friendly practices for knowledge up gradation and to hone skills and capacity building of the students.</p>
