Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>•Imparting education using digital platform and initiatives has been an integral part of the curriculum. Teaching learning methodology has included use of power point presentations, educational videos and online e-resources in sync with traditional teaching pedagogy.</p> <p>•Even during the time of COVID - 19, all the educational activities were undertaken to ensure that teaching learning did not suffer. To ensure timely completion of syllabus and conduct of smooth classes, a time table was developed which was shared among the faculty and students wherein full credit hours in teaching were carried out for both theory and practical subjects. A Google form was also developed wherein weekly information was provided by the faculty with links to keep a record of number of classes being taken with attendance of students, to ensure regularity in taking classes and timely completion of syllabus. With the adoption of various pedagogical tools and learning methodologies, college was able to create dynamic and stimulating learning environment for the students. Various online teaching-learning methodologies used are</p> <p>PPTs, e-books for reference Online assignments and online surveys Google meet and classroom were identified as preferred platforms for conduct of both theory and practical classes WhatsApp interaction with individual students for doubt clearing and revision sessions were undertaken Information sharing with students through telephone calls and exchange of assignments E- Curriculum content with PPTs, videos and recorded lectures were provided on the college website for reference</p> <p>•The college developed e-resources, educational videos and conducted webinars, skill development workshops, national and international level competitions to promote well being, creativity, innovations and positivity in COVID-19 period .This also helps the students to further sharpen their skills for self reliant start-up ventures</p> <p>•The college developed Facebook and Instagram page to share and promote educational videos and recent advances in the fields of home science amongst the beneficiaries</p> <p>•Development of YouTube Channel A YouTube channel was created and developed with an aim to generate awareness among the masses. Various knowledge oriented videos were prepared by the faculty and students on topics ranging from mental health, well being, immunity, environmental issues, innovative and entrepreneurial skills. (42 Videos with approximate viewership: 15000)</p> <p>•Organized Online Skill Building Workshops on Facebook platform Online workshops were organized on Facebook platform for large viewership on multifarious topics in the field of home science. The workshops encouraged the students to boost their capacity building and entrepreneurial abilities. 15 workshops with leading experts in their respective fields were conducted.</p> <p>•Organized National and International Competitions to hone Skills and Creativity of the participants</p> <p>•A number of competitions at National and International Level were organized to help students gain practical exposure from the comfort of their homes and to keep them gainfully occupied during the pandemic.</p>
