

NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP) 2020

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, a comprehensive framework aimed at transforming Indian education, marks a significant shift in academic culture by promoting holistic, flexible, and multidisciplinary approaches to higher education. In alignment with NEP 2020 along with the guidelines issued by Panjab University, Chandigarh, our college has meticulously revised its curriculum to integrate these pioneering directives. The **new syllabus not only embraces a broadbased**, **multi-disciplinary educational structure which is at par with International Universities, but also encourages an active pedagogy that emphasizes critical thinking and creativity. This move ensures that our students are well-prepared to meet the challenges of a rapidly evolving global landscape and are equipped with skills and knowledge necessary to lead in their respective fields. The details are given below**.

Awarding UG Certificate, UG Diploma, and Degrees:

- UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 48 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course/internship in the relevant field of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.
- UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 96 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course/internship in the relevant field of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.
- Three Year UG-Degree (Home Science) with single major and single minor: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme with single major and single minor will be awarded UG Degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 144 credits and satisfying the minimum credit requirement as given in Table 1.
- Four Year -UG Degree Home Science (Hons.) in Foods & Nutrition (FN)/Clothing & Textiles (CT)/Human Development (HD)/Resource Management & Extension (RME): A four-year UG Hons. Degree with major discipline (FN/CT/HD/RME) and minor in (FN/CT/HD/RME) will be awarded to those who complete a four-year degree programme with 192 credits and have satisfied the credit requirements as given in Table 1.
- Four Year UG Degree Home Science (Hons. with Research) in Foods & Nutrition (FN) /Clothing & Textiles (CT)/ Human Development (HD) /Resource Management & Extension (RME): Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year on the basis of merit in the major discipline opted in 3rd semester. They should do a research project or dissertation/thesis under the guidance of a faculty member of the College. The research project/dissertation/thesis will be in the major discipline. The students, who secure 192 credits, including 8 credits from a research project/ dissertation, will be awarded UG Degree Home Science (Hons. with Research) with major (FN/CT/HD/RME) and minor in (FN/CT/HD/RME).

- ✓ Last date of applying for UG Courses and PG Courses is 12.07.2025 (10:00 am).
- ✓ The applicants will have to fill **separate forms for** different courses.

Step 1: Online Registration

- 1. Click on the link e-प्रवेश (2025-2026) on the DHE website www.dhe.chd.gov.in
- 2. Click on Sign Up to register on website by filling Email ID, Mobile Number (WhatsApp) and Name (Spellings of Name must be same as in Class-X marks sheet/certificate).
- 3. **Mobile Number of the candidate** will become the **Login ID** and Password will be sent to the candidate's registered mobile number through SMS and will be displayed on the screen immediately.
- 4. Candidate can change the password, if she desires.
- 5. Candidate will be able to Login to the admission portal by using the login id and password in future visits as well.
- 6. **Pay Registration Fee of Rs. 85/- online to proceed further to fill application form.** Note down the transaction number generated. If the registration is not confirmed, then kindly wait for 30 min before trying again.
- 7. Payment verification may take maximum up to 24 hours.

- 9. Applicants who have passed 10+2 examination from Schools situated Outside Chandigarh or those who have passed 10+2 from **National Institute Open Schooling (NIOS)** should apply under the General (Outside UT) Pool.
- 10. Tick mark the reserved category, if any, and upload the valid supporting document/s showing the name of the applicant. Certificates issued in the name of parents will not be valid. If the applicant has not tick marked on the specific reserved category, she cannot claim the seat in that category at the time of admission. - The candidates will be admitted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations contained in the latest Panjab University calendar/guidelines/any other instructions which have been issued/may be issued by the Panjab University from time to time for the respective courses/examinations and on the basis of merit.
- 2. All the admissions to this institution are provisional and subject to the approval of Panjab University. The institution cannot be held responsible in case the University does not approve the admission of a student on account of giving incomplete information, concealing necessary facts or attaching incomplete testimonials or delayed submission of certificates etc. The fine/penalty imposed for the same will be the personal responsibility of the student.
- 3. Students are advised to keep a hard copy/soft copy of the submitted (filled) Admission Form for future reference.
- 4. Any instruction or rule received from the Director Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration/Panjab University, Chandigarh, will be binding on the students.
- 5. Candidates with gap year will not be admitted to the college until the gap is explained to the satisfaction of the principal of the college by submitting an affidavit.
- 6. Students disqualified by any University / Board shall not be admitted.
- Concealment of the facts / furnishing of false information/forged documents in the admission form will directly lead to cancellation of the admission and the amount deposited as fee will be forfeited.

RESERVATION POLICY

Reservation of seats in different categories viz, Sports, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Physically Challenged Persons, Wards of Freedom Fighters, Wards of Defence and Paramilitary Personnel and Economically Weaker Section will be made in accordance with the rules and instructions framed by the Chandigarh Administration, whereas in case of Wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/Kashmiri Hindu Families (non-migrants living in Kashmir Valley), Kargil Martyrs, Single Girl Child/ One out of Two Girl Children, Cancer/ AIDS/ Thalassemia, Rural Area Students, Students from Jammu & Kashmir, Border Area Students and Excellence in Youth Festival will be made as per instructions issued by Panjab University, Chandigarh from time to time.

General Information:

Every candidate applying for admission against reserved seats, belonging to any category, could also be considered for admission against the open seats of the respective quota, as per her merit. Depending on her preference for a college/course, a candidate may take admission against her reserved category or against the open category.

Any candidate who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which she applies for admission, maintaining her internal seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in that category. In such a case, the candidate will get the benefit in one category of her choice.

In case, seats belonging to any reserved category (except for additional seats) remain unfilled for want of eligible candidates, the same may be filled from amongst open category candidates belonging to the same quota. As per Letter No. 19/1/3/93-IH(3)-99/11136 dated 09.06.1999 and No. 19/1/3-IH(3)-2004/955 dated 19/01/2004 from Home Secretary, Chandigarh Administration, the following policy shall be followed w.r.t. reservation of seats:

60% seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institution (after excluding Sports reservation) will be filled up from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from schools/colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory, Chandigarh, as regular students of the said school/college, which will be termed as UT Pool.

The remaining 40% seats (after excluding Sports reservation) will be filled from amongst students, who pass their qualifying examinations from institutions other than those located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh or otherwise, which will be termed as General Pool (Outside Pool).

NOTE:

- UT Pool Candidates: Those who have passed lower qualifying examination as regular candidates from schools and colleges in UT, Chandigarh.
- General Pool (Outside Pool) Candidates: Those who have passed lower qualifying examination from schools and colleges outside UT, Chandigarh.

Amendment, if any, in the reservation policy of Chandigarh Administration/ Panjab University, Chandigarh will be followed up to the date of admission for each course.

RESERVED SEATS: CRITERIA AND DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

A) Reservation for Sports

This will be as per rules and regulations of Sports Department of the Chandigarh Administration vide Home Secretary Letter No. 8493, dated 05-05-2003 (endorsed vide Letter No. 2081 dated 06.04.2018 from the Sports Department, Chandigarh Administration). Implementation of the policy will be as under:

- i. 2% of the total number of seats in each course shall be filled up by sportsmen/ sportswomen. These 2% seats shall be reserved in each course in the institution on the basis of total intake of each course. Fraction of 0.5 or above shall be rounded off to the next higher number. This category shall not be divided into UT pool/ General pool. The inter merit of the candidate's seeking admission in any course in the Reserved Category of sports shall be determined only on the basis of their merit in sports as per grading criteria mentioned. In case any of the seats in the sports category in any branch remains vacant, the same shall be thrown open to the candidates of General Category. This policy is for the players of Chandigarh only.
- ii. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category of students:
 - a. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to those students who are eligible as per the latest sports policy framed by the Sports Department, Chandigarh Administration. The policy is available on the website of Sports Department www.sportsdeptt.chd.gov.in.
- iii. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following:
 - a. If her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in Inter-College/Inter-University tournaments.
 - b. If her achievement in sports relates to her activity in any of the three years preceding the year of admission. (For example, for admission in the year 2022- 2023, the Achievements shall not be prior to April, 2019).
 - c. Gradation Certificate will not be meant for employment purposes.
- iv. Director, Sports, Chandigarh Administration, or his nominee, not below the rank of Joint Director, Sports, will issue the certificate, and also have the authority to cancel any certificate at any time if it is found to have been issued on false/incorrect/concealed information or record.

NOTE: The merit of certificates shall be graded as A, B, C, and D in the descending order. Details of these grades are available with the admission committees of all the colleges. However, in case of any doubt/interpretation, department will take advise from Sports Department U.T. (if required and the decision of the competent authority will be final.

B) Reservation for Schedule Caste

15% of seats in each pool will be filled from the candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste. A candidate seeking admission under SC reserved category has to submit her caste certificate from the competent authority. The admission of SC candidates will be subject to subsequent verification of their caste certificate.

(The Specimen of the certificate is given in the Annexure A)

C) Reservation for Schedule Tribe

7.5% of seats in General Pool will be filled from the candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribe. A candidate seeking admission under ST reserved category has to submit her **caste certificate from the competent authority.** The admission of ST candidates will be subject to subsequent verification of their tribe certificate.

(The Specimen of the certificate is given in the Annexure A)

D) Reservation for Differently Abled/ Physically Challenged Persons

- All government institutions of higher education and other higher education institutions receiving aid from the government shall reserve not less than 5% of seats in each pool for persons with benchmark disabilities.
- The Physically Challenged Student will be required to furnish a Medical Certificate issued by the Principal Medical Officer of her concerned district/Civil Surgeon of Chandigarh, indicating percentage of disability, whether she is otherwise able to pursue her studies, name of the disease/handicap, whether the handicap is temporary or permanent; and whether the handicap is progressively degenerative.
- 5% marks concession will be given to physically handicapped persons in the minimum eligibility criteria for a course subject to minimum disability of 40%, provided they have obtained minimum pass marks prescribed by regulations.
 (Amendment in PU calendar Vol I 2007-chapter VIII (D) Regulation 29.3 approved by Senate PU on 29-03-2008)
- Candidates with a temporary handicap will not be considered against the reserved seats for the physically challenged. Where the certificate is issued by any authority other than the Principal Medical Officer of Chandigarh, the concerned Head of the Institution shall refer the candidate to the Principal Medical Officer, Chandigarh and shall admit the candidate only after confirmation from the PMO, Chandigarh.
- All candidates seeking admission, except in the case of Chandigarh Medical College and Punjab Engineering College (where the existing practice shall continue), will furnish an undertaking, as under, along with their application form.

I certify that I have no such physical handicap/disability which would hinder the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission. If, at a later stage, it is found that I have a physical handicap/disability which hinders the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission, then my admission will be liable to be cancelled.

- Blind students who join a regular degree / post-graduate degree course at the Panjab University (Campus/Departments) would be allowed exemption from payment of tuition fee & would be provided free accommodation in the University Hostels. {Approved vide Syndicate Para (iv) meeting held on 19.08.1996}.
- The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notification/s, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit, but the

candidate has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority. Even the 5 free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he/she will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of the course. (Syndicate Para-1 dated 18.04.2009).

• In case of any doubt in interpretation of any clause of these instructions, the matter shall be referred to the Chandigarh Administration whose decision shall be final.

E) Reservation for Wards of Freedom Fighter

- 2% seats in each pool will be filled from the category of children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters.
- A certificate issued by the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district will have to be attached with the admission form.

F) Reservation for Wards of Defence/ Para-Military Personnel

As per the Letter No. 666-DHE-UT-AD. II26 (43)2016PF/1788 dated 14/07/2021 from Directorate of Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration:

- 5% of seats in UT pool will be filled from the category of Wards of Defence/ Para-Military Personnel.
- The admission of the candidates against the reserved seats under this category will be made on the basis of merit list prepared from the following categories of the candidates, in the order of precedence (As per Letter No. F.No.6(1)/2017/D (Res.II) dated 21st May, 2018 from Government of India, Ministry of Defence, Department of Ex- Servicemen Welfare):

ADDITIONAL SEATS: CRITERIA AND DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

The reservation of seats shall be governed by Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at Page No. 169 in P.U. Cal. Volume-I 2022 and any intimation sent by Deputy Registrar (Colleges). However, it is clarified that reservation of seats/fee concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on the basis of having earned compartment in +2 examination i.e. in the subject of compartment.

A. Concession/Reservation for the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/ Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-migrants living in Kashmiri Valley)

- Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- Increase in intake capacity up to 5% course-wise.
- Reservation of at least **One (01) seat** in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
- Waving off domicile requirements as per Circular No. Misc./A-1/ 32031-32231 dated 06-04-2022.

Documents required:

- A candidate seeking admission against this seat is required to produce a certificate from an authorized Government Officer (i.e. Relief Commissioner/ Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district/area) to the effect that the candidate is a ward of Kashmiri displaced person.
- Proof of current residence (such as Ration Card/Photo Identity Card issued by the Election Commissioner/ Driving License/ Aadhaar Card/ Passport etc.)

B. Reservation for Wards of Martyrs/ Permanently Disabled of Kargil War

- Concession be given for admission to various courses in Educational Institutions for those wards of martyrs/permanent disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of Kargil war who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this effect and the same be entered in the pension Book of the family:
- Reservation of 1% seats with minimum of **One (01) seat** in the Departments and affiliated colleges (except in partially financed/self-financing courses)
- Exemption in the Fee
- Exemption in Hostel Fee

C. Reservation for Single Girl Child/One Girl Child out of two girl children

- **Two (02) additional seats** for (a) One Girl Child out of the only Two Girl Children per unit per course, subject to maximum limit of four. The additional seats will be only for those girl children who are either a single girl child or one amongst the only two girl children with no male child. The additional seat will be available to only one of the two girl children of a couple.
- An undertaking is to be obtained from the parents of the girl children declaring therein that the benefit of this scheme is being claimed for single girl child/only one girl child out of the two girl children and the parents shall not claim the same for the second girl child elsewhere in future.

(The Specimen of the affidavit is given in the Annexure A)

E. Patients of Cancer/Aids/Thalassemia

- **One (01) additional seat** each for the candidate suffering from Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia in each course.
- The claimant candidate will have to submit a certificate as a proof from the National Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS etc. in support of her claims.

The Specimen of the certificate is given in the Annexure A

NOTE: The benefit of additional seats under the aforesaid categories will not be admissible to the students seeking admission in the courses falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE.

F. Reservation for Rural Area Students

- **Two (02) seats** for the candidate belonging to rural areas should have passed the 10th and 12th class examination from those rural schools that do not fall in the area of Municipal Corporation/Municipal Committee/Small Town/Notified Area.
- A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a **certificate from the D.E.O.**/ **Principal** of the concerned institute of the area certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed the Matriculation and 10+2 examinations, falls within the aforesaid Rural Area.

The Specimen of the certificate is given in the Annexure A

G. Reservation for Border Area Students

- One (01) seat for the candidates belonging to border areas should have passed the 10th class examination from a school situated in border area and 12th from a school situated in any other area to become eligible for additional seats meant for border area students.
- A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the Tehsildar or the Principal/ Headmaster/ Head of the School certifying that the Schools from where the candidate has passed the matriculation falls within the aforesaid Border Area.

The Specimen of the certificate is given in the Annexure A

H. Transgender Students

- One (01) additional seat be created for transgender students from the session 2024-25 onwards in each course in the Panjab University Teaching Departments, Panjab University Regional Centres, Panjab University Constituent Colleges and the Colleges affiliated to the University, subject to the following eligibility conditions, provided the concerned Regulatory Body permits
 - i. The candidate seeking admission is otherwise eligible as per Panjab University Rules.
 - ii. The claimant candidate will have to submit a validated Transgender Certificate from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment or Certificate of Identity as well as Identity Card issued by the District Magistrate as per the prescribed format given under 'The

Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Rules, 2020 read with the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019.'

The Specimen of the certificate is given in the Annexure A

I. Orphan Children

- Two supernumerary seats (one male and one (01) female) created for orphan children in every Academic Program at UG/PG level.
- The student seeking admission shall have to submit/upload certificate from a Govt. recognised Orphanage/ Charitable Home or Death certificate of both the parents.

J. Reservation for Excellence in Youth Festival

- One (01) additional seat per unit will be reserved for those candidates who have excelled and outperformed in the Youth Festivals.
- The candidates availing the aforesaid weightage must fulfil the eligibility condition for admission to the particular course.
- For those courses to which admission is to be done on the basis of entrance test, the candidate must have passed the entrance test. The selection of such candidates for admission to various courses at PU Campus/ Regional Centers/ Constituent Colleges/ Affiliated Colleges will be made by the respective admission committees.
- For recommending admission on the basis of youth festival participation, admission criterion will be fixed on the basis of merit as mentioned below and upon the verification of the original certificates of those candidates, who:
- ✓ Have presented an item in an International Cultural Festival approved by Punjab Govt./Govt. of India /Panjab University.
- ✓ Have got distinction in All India National Inter University Youth Festival Organized by AIU/Govt. of India.
- ✓ Have got distinction in North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organized by AIU.
- ✓ Have secured First/Second/Third position in Inter University Youth Festival Organized by Govt. of Punjab / any State or Central University.
- ✓ Have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Inter Zonal Festival.
- ✓ Have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Zonal Festival.
- ✓ Have secured First/Second/Third position in state level competition of State School Education Board of Punjab/Haryana/HP/or CBSE/ICSE or any other recognized board.
 - Category A is considered as higher category followed by B, C Onwards.
 - Preference will be given to the candidate/s who have represented Panjab University, Chandigarh in A, B, C or D category.
 - Achievement(s) only during the preceding three years of the year of the admission will be considered.
 - ▶ In case of two or more candidate having equal position at equal level:
 - a.Position secured in an individual item shall be rated higher than position secured as a team member.
 - b.The eligibility of the candidate for participation in University Youth Festivals, in future, may also be considered.
 - c.Academic record will be considered in case of tie between two or more candidates.

In case of any ambiguity, the related certificates shall be verified from the Department of Youth Welfare, Panjab University through the concerned Chairperson/Principal/Head etc. The candidate/s admitted on the basis of Youth Festival additional quota seats shall have to give an assurance to the University authorities that during the duration of the course, the candidate will participate in the activities associated with her item and will not create any kind of indiscipline. The admission committee will assess the participation of the candidate and in case the candidate does not fulfil the requirements, her admission may be cancelled. However, exemption can be given because of a special reason like sickness or any other unavoidable reason.

K. Reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs)

- The persons belonging to Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) from all over India would get benefit of **10% reservation over and above the sanctioned intake for Admission** in the Educational/ Technical/ Medical Institutions of Union Territory, Chandigarh.
- Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8 lakhs are to be identified as EWSs for the benefit of reservation. Also, persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWSs, irrespective of the family income:
 - a. 5 acres of Agricultural Land and above;
 - b. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - c. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - d. Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- The income and assets of the families as mentioned above would be required to be certified by an officer not below the rank of Tehsildar in the States/UTs.

WEIGHTAGES

The following weightages will be given, wherever applicable on the aggregate marks.

a. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The holders of NCC - A, B and C Certificates shall be given weightage in marks as under:

A: 1% of obtained marks

B: 2% of obtained marks

C: 3% of obtained marks

b. National Service Scheme (NSS)

As per decision of the Syndicate Para (13) meeting dated 22.11.2014 and Syndicate Para (36) dated 25-01- 2015, regarding accreditation A, B & C certificate & weightage 1%, 2% & 3% for NSS volunteers.

i. 'A' Certificate: 1% of obtained Marks

Completed One year (120 hours) and participated in seven day and night camp (One Camp).

ii. **'B'** Certificate: 2% of obtained Marks

Completed Two years (240 hours) and participated in seven day and night camp (Two Camps).

iii. 'C' Certificate: 3% of obtained Marks

Completed Three years (360 hours) and participated in seven day and night camp (Three Camp).

- c. Youth Welfare
- (i) Youth and Heritage Festival (Subject to maximum 3%)

- ✓ Hiking / Trekking
- ✓ Mountaineering
- ✓ Rock Climbing Camp

Any other weightage approved by the D.U.I/Vice-Chancellor, Panjab University.

A candidate can claim weightage in one or more categories given above. However, the total weightage allowed shall not exceed **9% of the normalized marks** obtained in the qualifying examination. These weightages shall not be used for determining eligibility for admission as prescribed by the Panjab University under its regulations.

Note:

- 1. The student/s belonging to the above categories will also be considered in the general category according to her merit. If admitted on the basis of her merit in the general category, she will not be counted towards the seats reserved for the categories concerned.
- 2. Rules of Reservation policy existing at the time of admission will be applicable.

FOREIGN / NRI STUDENTS

FEE REFUND POLICY

A student who wishes to withdraw her admission from the college must apply to the principal in writing. The Application for withdrawal must be countersigned by the parent/guardian. A student leaving the college without any information to the principal will forfeit the entire security deposit and the same will be adjusted towards the dues. No claim for refund of security will be entertained in such cases.

In partial modification of office order No. DPI-UT-12(6) 95 dated 30-3-07/24-4-07, the Advisor to the Administrator, Union Territory, Chandigarh is pleased to adopt the recommendations of the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh vide Endorsement No. 4721-4900/Misc/A-3 dated 28-5-07 regarding refund of entire fee collected from the students, withdrawing before the starting of the course, the candidates in the waiting list should be given admission against the vacant seat. The entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than Rs.1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) shall be refunded and returned by the Institution/University to the student/candidate withdrawing from the programme. In case a student leaves after joining the course and if the seat consequently falling vacant has been filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, the institution must return the fee collected with proportionate deduction of monthly fee and proportionate hostel rent, where applicable, as conveyed by University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide their Letter No. F.No. 1-3/2007(CPP-II) dated 23rd April 2007.





- ✓ Attendance in house examinations is compulsory since it is a pre-requisite for Panjab University examinations

HOSTEL ADMISSION

- 1. Candidates will apply on the prescribed college Admission Form incorporated in the prospectus.
- 2. Concealment or wrong information at the time of admission will result into cancellation of their seat.
- 3. Old Students are required to report for college and hostel admission positively as per the Admission Schedule, failing which they will lose their right to admission and hostel seat.
- 4. Students who do not pay mess dues in time will be debarred from admission in the next session or they may not be issued roll number for final exams.
- 5. The admission to hostel is comprising of following steps:

Step 1: College Admission

Step 2: Hostel Admission

- Postcard size recent family photo to be attached with the form
- Passport size local guardian photo and signature on the form
- Undertaking for local guardians
- Anti-ragging form
- Health status undertaking
- Medical fitness certificate by an authorized medical practitioner
- Two self-addressed and postal stamped envelopes for correspondence.
- Step 3: Payment of the fees
- Step 4: Room allotment
- 6. Physical presence of the candidate as well as parents is mandatory on the day of admission.
- 7. Parents to note that admission formalities/process may take more than one day. So they are required to make their own arrangements of stay accordingly.
- 8. Admitted students will report to the hostel authorities in their allotted hostels one day before the commencement of the classes (Date to be notified on the college notice board/website).
- 9. Foreign students and students belonging to Manipur, Leh-Ladakh and Tibet etc. must have their parents accompanying them at the time of hostel admission. They also need to submit an affidavit/authority letter from their parents authorizing the local guardians to perform all responsibilities on their behalf regarding hostel rules and regulations. They are required to bring a family photograph and also two passport size photos of the candidate at the time of admission.

All Students will be governed by the hostel rules and hostel fee structure. HOSTEL MESS DUES AND SECURITY WILL BE ACCEPTED THROUGH ONLINE PAYMENT MODE ONLY MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

It is mandatory to carry a Medical Fitness Certificate by an authorized Medical Practitioner at the time of entry to the hostel. The Medical Certificate should carry the information of the blood group of the student. If a student is suffering from any allergy or medicine, then the same should also be mentioned.

Non-disclosure of information related to any serious medical condition will result in the cancellation of the hostel seat. In case this fact is concealed from the authorities at the time of admission, the college will not be responsible for any emergency that may arise. Students are advised not to indulge in self-medication; if they do so, they will be responsible for the consequences. In case of emergency the student will be taken to the nearby Government Hospital and the local guardianwill be called immediately along with the intimation to the parents.



HOSTEL RULES

- 1. No student will be allowed to join hostel without fee receipts (both College & Hostel).
- 2. Students are required to bring their own bedding, bed linen and door curtains. The other basic items are also required i.e. locks, buckets, mugs, bulbs, dusters, plate, spoon, tumbler etc. which are also available in the college canteen.
- 3. Furniture will be issued to the resident students against their signatures and the student will be held responsible for any breakage of furniture issued to her.
- 4. Hostel students are not allowed to use any personal electric appliances like radio, two in one, electric rods, electrical press, transistors, record players etc. In case of a defaulter, strict action will be taken and the appliance will be confiscated. They are also warned not to tamper with electrical fittings. The college will not be responsible for any mishap.
- 5. Hostel students are allowed to keep two-wheelers only for their convenience.
- 6. The college is not responsible for any inappropriate behavior/action of the student which is detrimental to accepted social norms.
- 7. Possession and consumption of any kind of intoxicants/drugs/ alcohol will result in immediate expulsion from the hostel.
- 8. The college does not take responsibility of valuables especially mobile phones and cash of resident students. They are therefore advised not to bring jewelry and other expensive articles with them.
- 9. Students are not allowed to stay in the College hostel during autumn break, winter break or summer vacations.
- 10. All the students will report daily for evening Roll-Call in the hostel common room at 6:00 p.m.
- 11. Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time.
- 12. If, at any time, it is found that the information given to hostel authorities by the parents or the students is wrong, strict action will be taken immediately by the hostel and college authorities.
- 13. Resident students are not allowed to take part in any kind of protest or strike. This will lead to their expulsion from the hostel and college.
- 14. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against defaulters, which may result in immediate expulsion from hostel.
- 15. Students are expected to maintain a decent dress code in the hostel and college premises.
- 16. Habitual defiance of the hostel rules will render a resident student liable to disciplinary action, a **special fine** and even expulsion from the college

- 17. Ragging is strictly prohibited as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court orders. Defaulters will face punitive action.
- Any kind of shouting, creating rumors, knocking on doors or any other act likely to create disturbance is strictly prohibited within the Hostel premises.
- 19. Any matter of dispute with fellow boarders should be reported immediately to the Warden/Principal.
- 20. Residents must switch off fans and lights before leaving for night out, day out and during college hours.
- 21. Action will be taken against the erring students, who pass undesirable remarks about fellow students, indulge in physical and mental torture and show disobedience and non-co-operative behavior.
- 22. A day scholar is not permitted to visit or stay in the hostel without the permission of the Principal.
- 23. Student must give due respect to the wardens and the hostel staff.
- 24. Residents should maintain cordial relations with other fellow students.
- 25. Any hosteller found guilty of creating indiscipline, bringing bad publicity or indulging in negative politics is liable to be expelled with immediate effect.
- 26. The Principal reserves the right to change any of the hostel rules and dues. The changes shall be binding on the residents.

HOSTEL LEAVE RULES

- 1. A resident student can avail night out /weekend leave only twice a month.
- 2. Wardens can grant leave only on weekends and not during college days and timings. The wedding card and a letter from parents with the proof of their identity should be attached with the leave application. In all such cases the parents must write directly to the Principal at least two days in advance. A maximum of 4 days leave will be granted for the wedding of siblings.
- 3. Residents will be granted permission to attend family functions only if they have the requisite attendance in classes, have appeared in the Mid-semester examinations, and have adhered to the rules and regulations of the college.
- 4. If any student extends her leave period of night stay, the parents/guardians should inform the hostel warden well in advance.
- 5. The warden can sanction leave up to 4 days. Any leave more than 4 days would require the sanction of the Principal.

6. Attendance will not be granted for medical leave or any other leave taken by the student.

7. Students who do not report for 10 days without prior permission will have to vacate the hostel.

- 1. Residents must enter their timings of departure and arrival in the outing register (Day out/Night out/Coaching).
- 2. The resident should positively return to the hostel before Roll call otherwise serious action will be taken.
- 3. Residents shall strictly adhere to the timings of their return i.e. before Roll call in case of Day Outs and Night Outs.
- 4. The warden has the right to deny outing to a resident in case of returning late from Night out/any kind of misconduct.
- 5. If a resident frequently overstays during her leave, her Hostel seat may be cancelled and it may also entail refusal of admission to the college in the next session.
- 6. Students who absent themselves from the hostel without Night Out Pass will have to face strict action as per the decision of the Hostel Committee.

Note: Day outings will be given according to the season and circumstances.

MESS RULES

- 1. Mess security amounting to Rs.1000/- will be charged from the hostel resident students at the time of admission to the hostel which is refundable.
- 2. Mess is run on contract basis. The mess charges for every session will be as per the approved contract rate of the contractor.
- 3. Mess dues are deposited cumulative for every quarter. Mess dues are to be deposited before the 5th of the month of the quarter, for which dues are being paid online.
- 4. If a student fails to pay the dues within 15 days, their mess account will be cancelled/they will not get food from the mess.
- 5. Hostellers are required to dine in the dining hall only.
- 6. No hosteller is permitted to take her meals to her room without the special permission of the hostel Superintendent. If found violating, disciplinary action will be taken.
- 7. Meals will not be served before or after the fixed hour. Residents must observe meal timings and must be punctual for that.
- 8. No hosteller is allowed to enter the cooking area/kitchen of the hostel.
- 9. Hostellers are not allowed to come in casual clothes/ night dress to the dining hall. They should be properly and decently clad.
- 10. Residents must behave properly with the mess staff.

Note: Students must observe all mess rules in the dining hall

FOR THE KIND ATTENTION OF PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- 1. At the time of joining the hostel, the parents/local guardians are required to submit, the name and the address of the local guardians on the specified form.
- 2. It is mandatory for the parents to put down their signatures in front of the Hostel Committee.
- 3. Parents are advised to check the leave book and sign it on every visit of their wards.
- 4. Students should open an SBI bank account in their home towns and carry the ATM cards along for convenient monetary transactions.
- 5. Change of address/telephone number to be informed to the warden in writing by the parents.
- 6. Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time.
- 7. The visitors will meet their wards in visitor's room only during visiting hours.
- 8. No parents/guardians will be allowed to go to the resident's room.

APPOINTMENT OF LOCAL GUARDIANS

- 1. Appointment of a local guardian is a must for the hostel record of each resident student. In case of an emergency, local guardians will be informed and called.
- 2. Unmarried Men (blood relation and cousins) will not be accepted as local guardians and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
- 3. Only a married couple should preferably be the local guardian (Real brother/sister, married or unmarried is also eligible to be local guardian)
- 4. Only parents and guardians will be allowed to meet their wards from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturday and11:00 a.m.to 5:00 p.m. on Sundays.

CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Ragging is strictly prohibited. Ragging in any form in the college campus will be treated as crime.

- 1. The students are required to attend all the lectures/ tutorials/ practicals.
- 2. The students are required to maintain discipline in the college campus.
- 3. The students must appear in various House Examinations.
- 4. Use of mobile phones in the classrooms and library, is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Smoking, drinking and playing cards on the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Students must make it a point to read the Notice Board and browse college website daily. Ignorance of orders/notices duly displayed on the Notice Board/website shall not be accepted as an excuse for non-compliance.
- 7. Students violating rules and resorting to indiscipline are liable to be punished in the form of heavy fine, withdrawal of concession or stipends and even expulsion from the college in extreme cases.
- 8. Students who are under-age and do not have a valid driving license for a two-wheeler or a four- wheeler are not allowed to drive as per the directions of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court.
- 9. The students must park their vehicles in the parking lot. Plying of vehicles on the college campus is not allowed.
- 10. It is imperative that students be well-behaved and respectful towards other students. Anyone indulging in or abetting gang fights, bullying, eve-teasing or causing damage to the college property will be dealt with very strictly and can even be expelled.
- 11. Parents are requested to remain in touch with the faculty members to keep a track of their ward's academic performance, attendance and conduct and are also requested to liaison with the teachers.
- 12. Each student must bear the cost of repairing and replacing all articles of furniture, crockery, library books etc. lost, broken and damaged by her.
- 13. The college reserves the right to refuse admission to a student or to detain her on the following grounds:
 - Indiscipline
 - Shortage of Attendance
 - > Not qualifying the eligibility conditions as laid by Panjab University
 - Ragging (As per the guidelines from Hon'ble Supreme Court of India)
 - Bullying, Teasing and Sexual Harassment

GENERAL LEAVE RULES

- 1. In case of sickness or emergency, the leave application must be submitted within a week duly signed by the parent/guardian of the applicant.
- 2. Applications for sick leave for more than three days should be supported by a medical certificate from a Govt. Dispensary/Hospital.
- 3. Leave on medical or personal grounds does not entitle a student to claim benefit of lectures or for appearing in the special test.
- 4. The sports person leave for sports competition/coaching camp (including journey days) is to be recommended by Directorate of Sports including Inter-University tournaments, Inter-College tournaments, Sr. National Championships and International Championships etc. During this leave period the concerned sports person shall be treated as present for the assessment and for all other academic purposes.
- 5. Absence from the college on days immediately before or after winter vacations entails disciplinary action.
- 6. The name of any student who absents herself from the college for ten days or more without any information will be struck off from the college rolls. The Principal has the power to strike off name of any student who is irregular in attendance or is not amenable to the college discipline.
- 7. If a student after getting admission or during the session remains absent continuously for 10 days, her name will be struck off from the college rolls.

ADMISSION GUIDELINES FOR INTERNATIONAL/ FOREIGN NATIONAL/ NRI STUDENTS

(Undergraduate/Postgraduate Programmes, Session 2025-26 Onwards)

Important:

- 1. A total of **25**% supernumerary seats over and above the total number of sanctioned seats in each UG/PG course (except BDS/MDS course or any other course governed by a regulatory body which does not allow additional seats) have been created for International/Foreign National Students from the academic session 2024-25.
- Foreign National students from underdeveloped countries are eligible for 50% (approx.) fee concession for the respective UG/PG course. Check fee details at https://dis.puchd.ac.in/includes/noticeboard/2024/20240530162035approvednrifnfeestructureof1styearandother.pdf
- 3. FN/NRI students seeking admission to any UG/PG programme (except BDS/MDS course or any other course governed by a regulatory body which does not allow exemption from Entrance Test), the condition of appearing/qualifying Entrance Test is waived off by the Panjab University from the academic session 2024-25 onwards.
- 4. FN/NRI students from non-English speaking countries seeking admission to any courses need not to qualify IELTS/TOEFL examination provided they have successfully passed the degree/lower examination from a University/ Institution/Board having English as medium of instructions for the entire course. Such students are required to submit 'Medium of Instruction Certificate' issued by the University/Institution/Board last attended by them.
- As per new guidelines issued by Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India, it is mandatory for all foreign students to first register on Study in India (SII) website & generates a Unique SII ID to initiate admission process.
- 6. This SII ID will be the main tracking ID for foreign students for their complete student journey.
- 7. Students will be granted Student visa and E-student Visa, only if they have unique SII ID.
- 8. If a student has paid fees to the institute and the institute has updated the same on SII website, then the foreign student is eligible for E-student Visa as well.
- 9. The Institute's confirmation of the student's fee payment supports the visa verification process, without which student might not be granted the visa.
- 10. MHA can verify the foreign student's details via their SII ID by logging into their BOI Module on SII website.

Foreign National students with nomination/sponsorship by any Foreign State, Embassy or Authority in India/Ministry of Govt. of India under a Study in India/Exchange Programme, etc. may apply for admission to Panjab University through ICCR website subject to the condition that the student is eligible to seek admission as per the regulations of the course.

The definition of the terms, "International/Foreign National, Non-resident Indians (NRI)/ and Wards of NRI/Foreign National" be considered as under:

(1) International/Foreign Nationals (FN):

As per UGC guidelines circulated vide its letter D.O.No.F.1/2022 (CPP-II) dated 30th September, 2022, International/Foreign National students in this context shall be defined as the one who shall possess a foreign passport.

(2) Non-resident Indians (NRI):

A person shall be deemed to be Non-resident Indian for seeking admission in Panjab University if she/he fulfils the criterion (as amended from time to time) for status of NRI under Income Tax Act, 1961, in the year in which he/she seeks admission in Panjab University.

As per Income Tax Act, 1961 the present criterion for determination of status of NRI is as follows:

'Non-resident Indian' is an individual who is a citizen of India or a person of Indian origin and who is not a resident of India. Thus, in order to determine whether an Individual is a non-resident Indian or not, his residential status is required to be determined under Section 6. As per Section 6 of the Income-tax Act, an individual is said to be non-resident in India if he is not a resident in India and an individual is deemed to be resident in India in any previous year if he satisfies any of the following conditions:

- (i) If he is in India for a period of 182 days or more during the previous year; or
- (ii) If he is in India for a period of 60 days or more during the previous year and 365 days or more during 4 years immediately preceding the previous year.

However, condition No. (ii) does not apply where an individual being citizen of India ora person of Indian origin, who being outside India, comes on a visit to India during the previous year.

A person shall be deemed to be of Indian origin if he, or either of his parents or any of his parents or any of his grand-parents, was born in undivided India.

Wards of NRI/Foreign Nationals:

A student who seeks admission as a ward of Foreign National or Non-resident Indian should be in a first degree/blood relationship with foreign national or Non- resident Indian. The term first degree /blood relationship includes:

- (a) spouse
- (b) children (natural/adopted/foster)
- (c) real brother and sister of father i.e. real uncle and real aunt
- (d) real brother and sister of mother i.e. real maternal uncle and maternal aunt
- (e) father and mother of father i.e. grand-father and grand-mother
- (f) father and mother of mother i.e. maternal grand-father and maternal grand- mother
- (g) first degree-paternal and maternal cousins of the candidate.

I.GENERAL RULES FOR NRI/FOREIGN NATIONAL STUDENTS

1) 10% seats over and above the total number of sanctioned seats in each UG/PG course are reserved for NRIs/Wards of NRIs.

2) A seat remained unfilled in the NRI/Wards of Foreign Nationals/NRI category shall be allocated to Foreign National student.

3) 25% supernumerary seats over and above the total number of sanctioned seats in each UG/PG course are reserved for Foreign Nationals.

4) The supernumerary seats shall be exclusively meant for the international students both in the Undergraduate and Post-graduate Programmes. A seat remained unfilled in the supernumerary category, shall not be allocated to anyone other than foreign national student. Foreign national students in this context shall be defined as the one who shall possess a foreign passport.

5) The 25% of the supernumerary seats for foreign national students will not include the foreign national students under exchange programmes or/and through Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between institutions or between Government of India and other countries.

6) In case, the number of eligible Foreign Nationals seeking admission exceeds the number of seats available, the Vice-Chancellor, Panjab University is authorized to sanction additional seats to the Foreign Nationals only.

7) Seats created for NRI/Foreign Nationals shall not be allowed to be converted into General Category.

8) NRI/Foreign National students seeking admission to the concerned course are required to compete amongst themselves for the seats created for NRI/FN category.

9) A student admitted under NRI/Wards of FN/NRI quota may change his/her admission to a vacant seat in General /Reserved Category provided the student qualifies the Entrance Test *(if prescribed for the respective course)* and the merit of the student falls within the list of students admitted in General/Reserve Category.

10) Student once admitted under NRI/FN category to undergraduate course shall be covered under the definition of NRI/FN for subsequent admission to any course at Panjab University.

11) Students who take admission under the NRI/FN category and are promoted from Undergraduate to Postgraduate course in the Hons. School framework (ongoing program) shall not be allowed to change their category.

12) NRI/FN students shall also have to comply with any other requirements prescribed by the Govt. of India and Panjab University from time to time.

13) Order of preference of NRI/wards of NRI/FN to determine merit for admission (against 10% NRI seats) is as given below:

- a) NRI
- b) Wards of NRI/FN
- *c)* Foreign Nationals

II. ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION CRITERION

- 1. The students seeking admission to any course must meet the academic eligibility criteria of that particular course as mentioned on the website of the respective Department/Institute/Centre or Handbook of Information available at the link https://dui.puchd.ac.in/handbookofinformation.php
- 2. The students seeking admission to any course which is governed by Regulatory Bodies (e.g. Medical Council/Dental Council/Bar Council of India/Pharmacy Council of India etc.) must possess the basic academic qualification prescribed by the respective Regulatory Body. The Rules of respective Regulatory Bodies shall apply as amended from time to time.
- **3.** The students from non-English speaking countries seeking admission to any courses are required to submit a certificate of IELTS academic score (at least Band 5) or TOEFL score (at least 60).

However, such students are not required to submit certificate of IELTS/TOEFL score, provided they have successfully passed the degree/lower examination from a University/ Institution/Board having English as medium of instruction for the entire course. Such students are required to submit 'Medium of Instruction Certificate' issued by the University/Institution/Board last attended by the student.

- 4. Admission to all Engineering courses against NRI/FN quota in the University Institute of Engineering & Technology (UIET), University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology (UICET) and P.U. Regional Centre, Hoshiarpur shall also be admissible through Direct Admissions Students Abroad (DASA).
- 5. The students seeking admission to B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. (Physical Education), are required to undergo mandatory Physical Efficiency Test. The scores of Physical Efficiency Test will be counted for determining merit.
- 6. The NRI/Foreign Nationals students wishing to join any of the University Teaching Departments of Panjab University for the first time are required to obtain an eligibility/equivalency certificate from the Deputy Registrar (General), Panjab University, Chandigarh or Academic certificates of passing the qualifying or equivalent examination approved by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU)/Common wealth Universities/International Association of Universities (IAU) as equivalent to the corresponding Indian Degrees/Certificates.
- 7. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the student should submit the same to the concerned Department/College where he/she is seeking admission. The Eligibility Form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College/Chairperson of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the student. (https://forms.puchd.ac.in/forms/20120724162131-Eligibility-Form-For-Foreign-Students.pdf?113303091224)

III.CERTIFICATES/DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

The NRI/Foreign Nationals students shall provide the following certificates/documents (whichever is applicable):

 Eligibility/equivalency certificate from the Deputy Registrar (General), Panjab University, Chandigarh or Academic certificates of passing the qualifying or equivalent examination approved

by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) / Common wealth Universities / International Association of Universities (IAU) as equivalent to the corresponding Indian Degrees/Certificates.

- 2) Certificate of IELTS (at least Band 5) or TOEFL (at least 60 Bands), if the student belongs to non-English Speaking Country.
- 3) 'Medium of Instruction Certificate', provided the student belongs to non-English speaking Country and have successfully passed the degree/lower examination/course through English medium.
- 4) Copy of Passport/Relevant Documents to claim NRI/Foreign National Seat
- 5) Relevant Documents to be submitted by Wards of NRI
 - a. Proof of relationship of student with Guardian
 - b. Affidavits from the Guardian
 - c. Affidavits from the student
 - d. Undertaking from the Guardian
 - e. Employment proof of the guardian
 - f. Copy of the PR Card/Citizenship proof/ Passport of the guardian (from the country he/she resides)

IV. DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED AFTER CONFIRMATION OF ADMISSION

- The Foreign National students admitted are required to fill up Foreign Student Information System (FSIS) Form complete in all respects, along with copies of passport and Visa and submit to the office of Dean International Students, Panjab University, Chandigarh. This form is an urgent requirement of the Foreign Registration Office (FRO), Sector-9, Chandigarh and the student has to report to the Foreign Registration Office (FRO) within fourteen days of arrival in Chandigarh, with the number generated after the online submission of this form. (<u>https://indianfrro.gov.in/eservices/home.jsp</u>)
- 2) Foreign Students Information System (FSIS) is to be submitted by hand by the student and the FSIS No. will be issued by the office of the Dean International Students Office personally to the students.

Each NRI/Foreign Student is required to submit "Students Welfare Fee" @ Rs.1500/- per student (in case of PU students only) which may be deposited with the 'Extension Counter, State Bank of India, Administrative Block, Panjab University, Chandigarh. Original Receipts of the fee deposited is to be submitted to the office of the Dean International Students along with Registration Form (To be submitted after Confirmation of Admission).
